


WARRIOR PRODUCTIONS CELEBRATES THE 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF THE CLASS AA 2012 MINNESOTA STATE HIGH SCHOOL HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP


Ten years ago, an inspired Benilde-St. Margaret's team overcame a season of tragedy to win the Class AA state boys' hockey championship. The Red Knights triumphed with a 5-1 win over the Hill-Murray Pioneers, honoring their teammate Jack Jablonski, who suffered a serious spine injury earlier in the season.

As students chanted Jack's nickname and shook signs that said "We love Jabby," Grant Besse scored five goals to lead BSM to a dominant victory. It wasn't just the students and team's feelings for Jablonski that propelled them to win – cheers echoed through the entire State of Hockey.

This is one of many unforgettable stories and moments in Minnesota state high school hockey history that inspired our feature film, WAY OF THE WARRIORS.

HISTORY OF RED KNIGHT HOCKEY

The Red Knight hockey program began in 1958. Like all programs across Minnesota, the team practiced and played outdoors. Benilde played its home games on a rink at the school's campus in St. Louis Park. The rink was flooded and maintained by coaches, players and managers.

The team's first coach was Gene Sack, who went onto legendary status while guiding the outstanding Rochester John Marshall teams of the 1970s. Benilde competed in the Catholic Central Lakes Conference where it won four league titles and made four trips to the Catholic State and Independent Tournaments.

In 1974, the Benilde School merged with St. Margaret's Academy and Benilde hockey soon became known

as BSM hockey. The team switched soon thereafter to the Don Bosco Conference. The next several years saw only modest success as the Red Knight pucksters captured only one conference title, in 1977, and advanced to the Region V semifinals under the old one-class tournament format.

The Missota Conference would serve as the team's new conference home. The team's first Missota Conference title would end the program's title drought under its first-year head coach, Ken Pauly. The next 14 years would see the longest tenure of any of the school's head coaches. During those years, the team would win over 200 games, collect five conference titles, advance to five section championships and capture two Class A state championships. That success moved BSM into the upper echelon of the Minnesota high school hockey elite programs.

Yet another conference change occurred in 1998 when BSM joined the newly formed Metro Alliance. The team dominated conference play by winning six league titles in seven seasons. The North Suburban was the team's next conference stop in 2005. The Red Knights dominated play and won seven straight conference titles before opting to play an independent schedule. In 2006, BSM made the jump to the state's large-school division, Class AA hockey. BSM defeated the Edina Hornets at Braemar Arena in the program's first Class AA game – a fitting way to make the jump.

After a three-year absence, 2007-08 saw the return of coach Ken Pauly as the Red Knights' bench boss. His return also marked the team's return to the state tournament. The team captured the Section 6AA title



with a dramatic 3-2 overtime victory over the Minnetonka Skippers. The team went on to place third at the state tournament.


In 2012 BSM climbed high school hockey's highest mountain by winning the Class AA state championship. The Minneapolis Star Tribune called it one of the "most sentimental runs ever" as the team battled through a life-changing injury to one of its players, Jack Jablonski. Grant Besse's five goals in the state championship game, the final three of which were shorthanded, in a 5-1 win over Hill-Murray, will go down in the annals as one of high school hockey's most extraordinary performances.

The Red Knights are entering their eighth year in Metro West Conference, in which they've won or shared five conference titles. The original membership of the conference includes Bloomington Jefferson, Bloomington Kennedy, Chanhassen, Chaska and St. Louis Park. The strength of the conference continues to grow, with the addition of Waconia, New Prague and Orono, and it provides BSM with the flexibility to continue build one of the state's toughest schedules.

In 2017-18, the Red Knights captured their third Metro West title and the school's 21st conference championship in boy's hockey but, after earning the state's top ranking for 10 consecutive weeks and going undefeated in the regular season in 2015-16, BSM lost a large senior class and fell below .500 in 2016-17, the first season under that mark in 15 years.

The Red Knights return to prominence came in 2018-19 when they won 20 games, finished the season with a top-10 ranking and reached the section championship game before falling to eventual state champion Edina. The success has continued as BSM has reached the Section 6AA championship game in each of the last three seasons.

The program's winning tradition is built on the foundational principles of the Christian Faith and service to the larger community and to each other. These core themes, coupled with a commitment to excellence, define the hockey experience at BSM. They have been the foundation of the teams of the past. They will continue to shape the teams of the future and the history of Red Knight hockey going forward.

COACHES CORNER



KEN PAULY VARSITY HEAD COACH

Entering his 29th season at Benilde-St. Margaret's and 32nd season as a head coach, in 2021-22 is Ken Pauly, who is in his second stint behind the Red Knight bench.

The 2012 Mariucci Award winner, as the state's Class AA coach of the year, Pauly has 33 years of high school hockey coaching under his belt, including 30 seasons at BSM.

A Red Knight assistant coach for three years, Pauly took over the reins of the Red Knights in 1990 and began building one of the elite programs in the state, leading the team to Class A state titles in 1999 and 2001.

Pauly was the Red Knights' head coach for 14 years before taking over at Minnetonka in 2004. He stayed on with the Skippers for three seasons before returning to BSM for the 2007-08 season.

Upon returning to BSM, he took the team to its first Class AA state tournament, claiming third-place honors in 2008, and won the program's first AA title in 2012.

During his 28 years as the Red Knights' bench boss, Pauly has amassed three state titles, 15 conference championships and has compiled a 481-231-27 record, making him the winningest coach in the program's 61year history.

From 2004 to 2007 he was the head coach at Minnetonka, where his Skippers won the 2006 Classic Lake Conference title and advanced to Class AA state tournament for just the second time in the school's history, and its fourth state tournament appearance overall, claiming the consolation title.

He was named the Section 6AA coach of the year for his efforts and was also named Minnetonka High School's 2006 Coach of the Year.

In his 31 years as a head coach, Pauly has put together a 525-262-34 record. He ranks 14th in career victories among Minnesota coaches and third among active coaches. He passed Gene Sack, who coached the first





Benilde hockey team in 1958-59, during the 2015-16 campaign on the state's all-time wins list.

His 300th career win came at the St. Louis Park Rec Center, Jan. 8, 2009, when the Red Knights defeated St. Louis Park, 4-1. His 300th win at BSM came Jan. 29, 2011, as the Red Knights defeated Holy Angels, 8-6.

Pauly became the 19th coach in state history to record 400 career victories on Nov. 29, 2013, when BSM knocked off Duluth Denfeld, 7-2.

He won his 400th career game as the Red Knights' head coach when Peter Heimbold scored with three minutes, 22 seconds to play in regulation and Cade Gleekel scored with 24 seconds remaining in overtime to give BSM a 2-1 win at 16th-ranked Farmington.

On Jan. 16, 2020, Pauly became the 14th coach in state history to record 500 career victories when the Red Knights posted a 6-3 win at Bloomington Jefferson.

Pauly has also worked with USA hockey's development program, where he served on the Regional 16- and 17-year-old staffs at the Olympic Training Centers in Marquette, Mich., St. Cloud, Minn., and Lake Placid, N.Y.

In 2009, Pauly won his second Minnesota Wild 3M Excellence in Coaching Award, an honor he also received in 2007 while coaching Minnetonka.

A lifetime member of the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, he served over 10 years on the MHCA's Executive Board; three of those as President. Coach Pauly currently sits on the Herb Brooks Foundation's Board of Directors.

Pauly teaches full time in BSM's social studies department and serves as chair of that department. An award winning teacher, he earned the school's Faculty of the Year Award in 2012 and the Red Knight Leadership Award in 2015. He was chosen as BSM's commencement speaker in 1997 and in 2018, he received his 20 Years of Service honor as a faculty member.

Pauly earned a bachelor of art's degree in history from the University of Minnesota in 1989. He and his wife, Anne Marie Dominguez, an English teacher at BSM, reside in Plymouth. They have two children; Caroline, 21, who attends the University of Wisconsin, and A.J., 18, a senior who plays for the BSM hockey program.



COACHES & SUPPORT STAFF



JOHN RUSSO VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH

John Russo returns for his 15th season at BSM, where he coaches the Red Knights' defense and is in charge of the team's penalty-killing unit. He came to BSM in 2007 after filling a similar role on Ken Pauly's staff at Minnetonka.

The last two seasons have seen the Red Knights post their best penalty-kill efficiencies in Russo's 14 seasons, including a 62-for-66 mark last year, good for a .939 efficiency, the best mark by a BSM team in over 30 years.

In 26 years as a high school coach, Russo is recognized as one of the top assistant coaches in high school hockey. He has been a member of five state tournament coaching staffs and has earned three Section Assistant Coach of the Year awards (2008, 2012, 2018) at BSM, for a total of five career awards.

He has served as a head coach in the highly-regarded Upper Midwest High School Elite League and has been a part of the coaching staffs at Blake School, Orono High School and Minnetonka High School, along with three seasons as an assistant coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

In 2015 he was named the chairman of the Hobey Baker Committee, tasked with choosing college hockey's top player, and remains as a member of the board of directors. Russo is an attorney who resides in Plymouth with his wife and family.



CASEY MAIKKULA VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH

Casey Maikkula is entering his 13th season as a high school hockey coach, and fourth season with the Red Knights.

Prior to joining the Coach Pauly's staff, Casey served as an assistant coach at his alma-mater, Robbinsdale

Cooper High School for five seasons, followed by year-long stops at St. Michael-Albertville and Rogers, before a three-year stint at Maple Grove - one as an assistant with the boys program, and two as an assistant with the girls program.

While at Maple Grove, Maikkula helped each team reach the state tournament for the second time in their histories; the boys in 2016-2017, and the girls in 2018-2019.

Since joining the Red Knights in the fall of 2017, Maikkula has been tasked with various responsibilities by Coach Pauly; ranging from onice skill development to off-ice scouting and social media coordination. This season will mark his second as a full-time varsity assistant with the Red Knights.

Maikkula earned a bachelor of science degree in marketing from Metropolitan State University in 2012 and, along with coaching, has served as a social media consultant for professional athletes, musicians, and other public figures since 2010. Most notably, former Minnesota Viking running back Adrian Peterson.



DERRICK RAYMOND DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

Derrick Raymond enters his eighth season with the BSM hockey program, filling several rolls and is now the team's director of operations, providing analysis and other duties related to team operations.

Prior to joining the Red Knights, he worked for six years as a member of the staff at Robbinsdale Cooper High School.

Highly involved in youth sports, Raymond has served in numerous capacities for the Armstrong-Cooper Youth Hockey Association, where he is a member of the ACYHA player development committee.

Raymond currently resides in New Hope with his wife, Jessica, and their four children, Jeff, John, Natalie and Nicole. He is employed by Johnson Paper & Supply, Co. in Northeast Minneapolis.



CHRIS MCGOWAN JUNIOR VARSITY CO-HEAD COACH

Chris McGowan (BSM '91) returns for his 15th season guiding the Red Knights' junior varsity squad. A member of Ken Pauly's first varsity hockey team at BSM in 1990-91, He has 10 years of youth hockey coaching experience.

Over the previous 14 seasons, McGowan has led BSM's junior varsity squad to a 210-106-24 record.

McGowan served as the head bantam A coach at Minnetonka for three years prior to his return to BSM for the 2007-08 season. He also coached bantam hockey in the Edina Youth Hockey Association for seven seasons.

A three-sport athlete during his prep career, competing in hockey, soccer and tennis, McGowan attended St. Mary's University in Winona, Minn., where he played soccer for four years. He received his bachelor's degree from the school in 1995 and also holds an MBA from the F.W. Olin Graduate School of Business at Babson College.

McGowan was raised in Edina and currently resides in Victoria with his wife, Jane, and children, Caitlin and C.J. He is employed by Staples, Inc., as a Manging Director for their Healthcare & Strategic Accounts business.



TOM HLEIN JUNIOR VARSITY CO-HEAD COACH

Tom Klein enters his 17th season on the Red Knight coaching staff, serving as the co-head junior varsity coach. He has also served as the team's goal tending coach and as a junior varsity assistant.

Klein rejoined the BSM varsity staff in 2007-08, following his departure after the 2003-04 season to serve as an assistant coach with the Robbinsdale Cooper girls' program.

Klein has nearly 45 years of coaching experience at the youth, high school and collegiate levels and, as a goalie coach. In all, 10 of his goalies have moved onto play Division I hockey and three have been NHL draft picks.

After graduating from Wayzata High School in 1974, he spent three years coaching in the Wayzata Youth Hockey Association before moving to River Falls, Wis., where he served as the head high school coach for four years, leading the team to its first-ever winning season in 1983-84.

He returned to Minnesota and spent the next five seasons as an assistant coach, including one season at Hamline University. In 1989, he took over as the head coach at his alma mater, Wayzata, for one season before embarking on an eight-year stint as Minnetonka's head coach, where he led his charges to the 1994 state tournament. His teams won two Classic Lake Conference titles and he was honored as a section coach of the year and twice as the Classic Lake Conference coach of the year.

Klein was the head coach at Hopkins for three seasons (1999-2002) before joining Ken Pauly's staff at BSM in 2002. While coaching at River Falls High School, Klein completed his undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin-River Falls in 1985, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in social studies. He also earned a master's degree in history from the school in 1992.

He is a social studies teacher at Benilde-St. Margaret's. He and his wife reside in Victoria

DAVE LIEBRENZ JUNIOR VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH

Dave Liebrenz came to BSM for his second stint as a Red Knight coach in 2007 after serving on Ken Pauly's staff at Minnetonka. In his role, he serves as a practice assistant for the Red Knights, assists with stats and is responsible for set up of both varsity and junior varsity games.

He helped found and coached BSM's bantam program before joining Pauly's staff in 1992. He has over 30 years of coaching experience and also coached in the Osseo-Maple Grove Youth Hockey Association.

A 1978 graduate of Wayzata High School, Liebrenz played hockey, soccer and baseball for the Trojans and went onto play hockey collegiately at Gustavus Adolphus, where he graduated from in 1982 with a Bachelor of Arts degree, majoring in both psychology and business.

A member of both the American Production and Inventory Control Society and the Institute for Supply Management, Liebrenz holds several professional certifications. He resides in Maple Grove.



TANNER GRINA JUNIOR VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH

Tanner Grina is entering his fourth season as a high school hockey coach, and first season with the Red Knights.

Prior to joining Coach Pauly's staff, Tanner served as an assistant coach at Mankato East High School from 2015-2018

Grina followed those three years with a two-year stop at Lakeville South as the Bantam AA head coach, before moving onto Eden Prairie last season, where he served as a Bantam AA assistant coach.

While at Mankato East, Grina helped the team reach the state tournament in 2018. He also helped the Lakeville South Bantam AA team reach the state tournament in 2019 and 2020, along with helping the Eden Prairie Bantam AA team to the state tournament in 2021.

He has also served as a head coach in the Minnesota Elite Prep Development League for the past five years.

Grina was raised in Hutchinson, Minn., and currently resides in Brooklyn Park with his wife, McKensie.

He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise Science from the University of North Dakota in 2015 along with a minor in coaching, and a Master of Arts degree in Sport Psychology from Minnesota State University, Mankato in 2017, and is employed by SPS Commerce as a Sales Operations Analyst.



GRANT HOLLER GOALIE COACH

Grant Holler joined the BSM staff last season as its goalie coach.

Holler grew up in Mattawan, Mich., and played hockey for Culver Military Academy in Culver, Ind., where he graduated in 2011.

After his high school career, Holler spent two seasons in the NA3HL for the Granite City Lumberjacks and Breezy Point North Stars of the NA3HL.

In his rookie season with the Lumberjacks, Holler saw action in 14 games, posted a 3.06 goals against average and helped his team to the NA3HL title. After two seasons of junior hockey, Holler attended the University of St. Thomas, where he double majored in Business Law and Spanish Linguistics.

Holler brings diverse coaching experience from past internships with Bandits Goalie School in Michigan and Crossfit Fast Factory in St. Cloud, Minnesota.

In addition to coaching and developing athletes, Grant coaches goalies for Fortis Academy and works in compliance in the financial services industry.



CRAIG ROBERTS COMMUNICATIONS DIRECTOR

In his 16th season with the Red Knight program is Craig Roberts, who serves as the team's Director of Communications/Statistics and Analytics.

In his role, Roberts handles media requests, compiles statistics and analytical data, works with event management and provides administrative support from

his home in Marshall, Wis.

He has worked on the sports information staffs at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, Minnesota State and the University of Minnesota as well as serving as the assistant commissioner for public relations with College Hockey America for three years and as the sports information director at Macalester College.

Roberts has been involved in the planning and management of three NCAA Frozen Fours, an NCAA Final Four, the 1998 World Figure Skating Championships and the 2001 IIHF Women's World Hockey Championship.

The 2020-21 almost didn't happen.

When spring sports were canceled in Minnesota in 2020, little did anyone realize that high school hockey would be staring at the same prospect in November later that year.

November and December came and went without one high school game being played due to COVID restrictions by the Minnesota Department of Health.

It would be a year when just getting to play became the goal. That goal was finally realized when the Red Knights played their season opener on January 14th and skated to a 7-2 victory over St. Michael. The team would rattle off ten straight wins on its way to a conference title. But trouble was on the horizon.

The wins did not come as quickly when the schedule became more difficult. The Red Knights were supposed to be one of the state's best — but the team's play suggested otherwise.

Sadly, there were not many winners in 2020-21. While BSM would have loved to have counted themselves among the teams that made it to the state tournament, we all missed that iconic event in a packed stadium in St. Paul. Additional casualties of COVID were the road trips, moments in the locker room, loud arenas, school spirit, team meals, missed games, rituals, and traditions.

Thankfully, the Red Knights Hockey families led the efforts to salvage the season and maintain community. Together, we rescued meaningful pieces of high school hockey. Yes, we were "all in this together," suffering and celebrating together.




