Tryouts - March 11-16, 2024

Players will be evaluated on the following skills and attributes:

- **THROWING** Arm strength, accuracy, form
- **FIELDING** Ground balls, fly balls, reaction, form
- **HITTING** Form, contact, power
- **BUNTING** Form, contact
- **SPEED** Players will be timed in a variety of drills
- **PITCHERS** Accuracy, velocity (radar gun), pitch variety
- **CATCHERS** Receiving, blocking, awareness of the game

Miscellaneous:

- Knowledge of the game
- Character
- Attitude
- Effort

Eligibility Guidelines

- Students in grades 9-12 attending Woodbury HS are eligible to tryout.
- District Policy does not allow middle school students to try out for softball. Exceptions: If parents feel they have an exceptional athlete with evidence to support it, it must be discussed with the head coach before tryouts. If tryout evaluation would put her at JV or Varsity level, she would be considered for one of these two teams.
- Other situations an 8th grader would be considered:
 - After 3 days of tryouts we determine we are short of 9th grade players we would then invite younger players to be considered.
 - After 3 days we determine there is a shortage of pitchers or catchers we would then invite younger players to be considered.

Attendance Policies

- Softball players should treat their membership on the team as a privilege and recognize those responsibilities, expectations and behaviors that go with their membership.
- Players are expected to attend all practices, scrimmages, and games. Missing will affect your playing time.
- If player is going to be late or be absent, Coach Stohr (or your respective coach) must be notified in advance.

Excused Absences

- Schoolwork Must have a teacher or parent/guardian note/email
 * Player is expected to manage school work with team responsibilities.
- Medical Appointment Must have parents note/email.
- Sudden Illness Must have parent note/email by next practice.

One (1) unexcused absence:

Sit part or all of the next game/scrimmage. You still dress and attend.

Two (2) unexcused absences:

Sit all of the next game/scrimmage. You still dress and attend.

Three (3) unexcused absences:

Sit additional game/scrimmage and possible dismissal from the team.

Listen and respect the wishes of the coaching staff. Decisions are made for the best interest of the whole team, not the individual. Each coach has a thorough knowledge of the game, players have had many coaches in the past, but you are expected to follow the directions of this coaching staff.

Players are to be respectful of the umpires, opposing players, fans and the opposing team's coaches.

After the Game:

Win or lose, do it with pride. Do not comment to any opposing team member other than the congratulatory "Good Game"

Cell Phones:

All cell phones are turned off once a player comes to practice/game. They must be turned off, not just on vibrate or silence.

Behavior and Conduct

Social Media:

- It is critical that students are thoughtful and respectful about what and where they post material.
- Playing and competing for Woodbury High School is a privilege. As a student-athlete, you represent Woodbury and are expected to portray yourself in a positive manner at all times.
- Social media comments and posts are an extension of your personal behavior and you will be held to high standards in alignment with the Woodbury High School Code of Conduct as well as the MSHSL Code of Conduct.
- Think about who you represent: yourself, your family, your teammates and coaches, and your school. Protect yourself by maintaining a self-image which you can be proud of for years to come. Your athletic eligibility and more importantly, your character and reputation depend on it!

To be eligible, a student must be fully enrolled in her high school in good standing. A student who is under penalty of exclusion, expulsion or suspensions, whose conduct violates the Student Code of Responsibilities and is not in good standing, shall be ineligible for a period of time determined by the principal.

STUDENT CODE OF RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. I will respect the rights and beliefs of others and will treat others with courtesy and consideration
- B. I will be fully responsible for my own actions and the consequences of my actions
- C. I will respect the property of others
- D. I will respect and obey the rules of my school and laws of my community
- E. I will show respect to those who are responsible for enforcing the rules

Participation Pyramid

- Student Athletes in high sports programs will experience a "participation pyramid."
- This means that there are fewer opportunities as participants move from the 9th grade team to the Varsity team.
- Competition for spots becomes more competitive as players move through the program.
- Players will need to continue to develop and understand the skills needed to move from 9th grade to JV and from JV to Varsity.

Varsity Philosophy/Playing Time

- Understand that winning is a priority at the varsity level
- It is important to note that expectations of a player are high
- Playing time is based on skill, effort, attitude and desire
- Playing time <u>will not be equal</u>
- The team will consist of a minimum of 12 players
- Everyone on the team will have a role and your role depends on your ability, effort, and attitude
- The varsity roster can be fluid. Players who do not give 100% in practice or do not demonstrate an ability to play at a high level, may be placed on JV or sat for a period of time

JV/B Squad Philosophy

- Playing time may not be equal and all players may not play every game.
- Players are expected to give 100% effort.
- Decisions on playing time will be based on attitude, effort and ability. It is up to the athletes to prove themselves.
- The focus of this team will be to continue to develop the softball skills in the athletes for future varsity competition.
- Playing time is not determined by a players' age or grade, but by ability and hard work.

Woodbury Varsity Head Coach typically tries to accommodate as many players as we can to participate on the 9th grade team. The exception is a player whose ability creates a safety issue for themselves. Players with no prior softball experience can be at risk catching a ball thrown by an experienced player or facing pitchers/pitching machine that throw in the vicinity of 55 mph. Coaches will evaluate players that may fall into this category to determine if they feel the player can progress fast enough to compete at the 9th grade level without concerns for their safety.

- Playing time will be as equal as possible, but can still be up to the coaches' discretion based on attendance, attitude, effort and academic eligibility.
- The focus of this team will be to develop the skills in the athletes and prepare them for potential JV/B-Squad and Varsity participation.

Academics

All players must be academically eligible to participate in any athletic competition. Each student athlete must be making academic progress to graduate. If a problem exists, the player may return to the team only after notification from a high school administrator. A varsity letter is something that is earned, not given away.

Varsity letters will be earned only under the following conditions:

- 1. Play in one fourth of all innings played by team and you complete the season as a member of the team.
- 2. All seniors who have played in the program throughout their high school career with a high level of dedication and a positive attitude.
- 3. Coaching staff has the discretion to letter individuals who have made significant contributions to the program, but may not be a player (i.e. Manager, Statistician).
- 4. Being a member of the Woodbury Royals Varsity Softball Team, but at the coaching staff's discretion.

The following awards will be voted on by each varsity team member and coaching staff:

- Most Valuable Player
- Most Improved Player
- Offensive Player
- Defensive Player

An additional award chosen by coaching staff:

• Coaches Award - Player who played with the most heart, determination, team play and effort over the course of the season.

Players will vote on captain(s) at the end of the season. Their vote will be used as a <u>quide</u> to help the <u>Varsity</u> coaches make the final decision.

Please consider the following when casting your vote:

- Is this an experienced player who can serve as an on field leader by example and style of play?
- ✓ Is this a player who has the respect of the other players and can "hold court" as the groups vocal leader?
- ✓ Is this a player who can organize and remain ultimately responsible?



A banquet will be held following the season for coaches, all players and their parents.

This season's banquet will be Friday, May 31st at 6 pm at Prestwick Golf Club in Woodbury.

Tickets for coaches and each player will be paid for by the softball booster club and parents will be able to purchase tickets. More details will come later.

Player Commitments

- All players are to follow rules set forth by coaching staff. Do not put yourself in a situation in which you violate the rules.
- Players are required to participate in all fundraiser activities that the team has.
- Most important is attitude. Keep a positive attitude. The attitude of this team will determine what type of season we will have. A negative attitude will reduce your playing time.
- Be coachable. Listen to the coaches. You are not a coach. It is not your responsibility to determine who is on the field, or how well somebody is playing.

- Push yourself and others. You practice like you play. If you strive at every practice to succeed, it will push the people around you to keep up and improve.
- Be a role model. Younger kids see you and they look up to you. Have a positive image of yourself and you will reflect well on others.
- Be a team player, you are part of a team.
- Have fun. Softball is a fun game. Positive attitudes, hard work, and personal discipline will lead to the success you want.

Royal Parents

- 1. **Attitude.** Have a positive attitude in the stands and with your daughter. If a parent has a bad attitude towards the coaches and other players, it reflects in your player. This makes your child difficult to coach and to play with.
- 2. **Do not coach.** You are not the coach. Do not try to position your daughter while she is in the field. Do not try to coach her while she is in the batter's box. Coaches are responsible for who is playing where and when.
- 3. **Do not approach the coaches at the end of the game with displeasures.** Please follow these guidelines and steps to address an issue:
 - A. Player should request a meeting with the coaches to discuss their issue
 - B. If you have an issue, please set up a meeting with the coaches 24 hours after the end of the previous game or practice.
 We will only discuss your daughter's situation.

If steps A and B does not resolve player/parents' issue, we will set up a meeting with the coaches, parent and activities director.

4. Stay out and away from the dugout area. This is for players and coaches only.




