The question for the Trojans will be which squad takes the ice? The one which won four of its last five games or the team that lost seven straight from Jan. 20 through Feb. 5? Regardless, playing in the Metro West Conference has made New Prague a surprisingly tough out this postseason. "We trust our schedule," Trojans coach Brad Drazan said. "Our schedule has prepared us for this."

The Trojans' run through the Section 1A playoffs included an overtime win over top-seeded Northfield in the semifinals. To keep their hot streak going, senior goaltender Carter Puente must continue his stellar play. He allowed only five goals in the section playoffs, stopping 77 of 82 shots for a .939 save percentage. While goals don't come often for the Trojans, five players (Charlie Turnberg, Will Andersen, Luke Portner, Willy Seymour and John Schmidt) accounted for the 56 percent of the team's goals. Schmidt, the team's leader in most every way, and Seymour each have 10 goals. Turnberg had two in the section championship win over Albert Lea.

DEFENSE:: Three juniors, Peyton Becker, Breck Hagen and Hugh Goggins, join three seniors, Layton Kuehner, Ryan Brinkhaus and Kai Johnson, to comprise the blueliners. Brinkhaus leads the team with 24 penalties. And penalties were an issue as opponents converted on nearly 25 percent (24.7) of power-play opportunities. **GOALIES: Carter Puente has been the** starter the past two seasons and keeps showing signs of improvement. inside scoop

Minneapolis players were whooping it up in their locker room after a late-December victory over Totino-Grace, fully enjoying the spoils of a season that has been 27 years in the making. "They are a fun group to be with," Minneapolis coach Joe Dziedzic said with a grin after that game in Brooklyn Park.

And that was months before reporters, photographers and TV cameras became regulars at practices and games, documenting one of the season's great feel-good stories. It was also long before Minneapolis beat Section 2A rival Delano 2-1 on Jan. 18 for one of the team's signature wins of the regular season.

Of course, the most fun for Minneapolis was knocking off Delano in the game that mattered the most, a 3-1 triumph in the section final that sent a Minneapolis team to its first state tournament since Minneapolis Edison's appearance in 1994. Coincidentally, that's when Dziedzic was a star forward for Edison and on his way to winning the state's Mr. Hockey award.

FORWARDS: Sophomore John Bebler starred for Minneapolis in the section title game, scoring twice in the triumph over the Tigers to give him eight goals this season — three of them game winners. Senior Jack Hanson is the leader of the group with 24 goals and 28 assists. **DEFENSE: Drew Pitts and Joel Hanson,** both juniors, give Minneapolis a skilled duo capable of playing huge minutes and shutting down the opposition's top scorers. They're counted on for offense, too, as Pitts ranks third on the team with 34 points and Hanson sixth with 16. **GOALIES: Alex Lamont is the workhorse,** having started every game and playing all but 15 of the available minutes. His statistics are respectable, but he has a habit of elevating his play when the stakes are highest, as he did in the section final when he stopped 30 of 31 Delano shots.

coach joe dziedzic

Dziedzic has endured some lean years in his 10 seasons leading Minneapolis, and he recalls opening some practices with the most basic of drills, "Here's how to catch a pass," as many of his players were new to the sport. Dziedzic played four years at the University of Minnesota and spent parts of three seasons in the NHL with Pittsburgh and Phoenix.

FORWARDS: Sophomore Christian Theuninck, who scored the game-winner in the Section 3A title game, has two goals and two assists in the postseason. Theuninck is joined by Andrew Bastian, Parker Anthony and Quintin Steindl with 11 goals while Brayden Borgmeier has added 10.

DEFENSE: Gavin has four goals and four assists with the man advantage. Aiden Prochaska has a team-high 25 assists. East's defensemen are encouraged to join in on the offense at every opportunity. "We like to keep our D in the play as much as we can," Fries said. "We use them a lot."

GOALIES: Brueske, a senior, has been the mainstay in goal after taking almost all of last season off. "He's been a leader all year long, telling the team, 'I'm going to St. Paul, and you guys are coming with me."



FORWARDS: Mahtomedi doesn't have the star power to match some of the other top Class 1A teams, but the Zephyrs possess speed, grit and an unflagging work ethic. And some skill, too, as evidenced by junior David Wolsfeld's 22 goals and 24 assists - huge numbers considering Mahtomedi plays one of the toughest schedules in the state for a Class 1A team. **DEFENSE: Senior Grant Dardis, Ben's triplet** brother, and junior Cav Bruner are leaned on heavily for their poised play and pinpoint passing. They pitch in on offense, too, as Bruner has 17 points and Dardis has 15. GOALIES: Ben Daris, the state leader with a .939 save percentage, is one of three finalists for the Frank Brimsek Award that goes to the state's top senior goaltender. He has five shutouts this season to give him a whopping 20 for his career, a possible state record. The Minnesota State High School League website lists Adam Coole of Duluth East (1995-98) and Michael Sperl of Little Falls (2005-09) as the career shutout record holders with 17 each.

Poeschl knows all about standout goaltenders. He starred in goal for Hill-Murray for three seasons from 1977-80. Poeschl, in his 25th season leading Mahtomedi, has a 424-246-22 record. He coached previously at St. Thomas Academy.

With Ben Dardis in goal, and the defense in full shutdown mode, Mahtomedi has the potential to steal a game from any team, as it did in the 2020 Class 1A championship when it beat Hermantown 3-2 despite being outshot 42-12. The Zephyrs are likely to reach the semifinals, but the odds get long from there.

The Moose are cutting loose. Again. After winning Section 5A as the No. 4 seed, Monticello enters the state tournament 6-1-1 in its last eight games. The Moose, making their fourth state tournament appearance in the last six seasons, have rebounded from losing five of their first six games to open the season and a 3-7-0 stretch from Dec. 23 to Jan. 22. Monticello's victory over St. Cloud Cathedral in the section championship game is believed to be the Moose's first win over the Crusaders in program history.

Scoring is concentrated heavily on the stick of senior forward Wilson Dahlheimer. His three goals carried the Moose in the section championship. His 46 points are 22 more than the Moose's No. 2 scorer, defenseman Gavin Simon. He'll be needed to continue that level of play as the Moose often struggle to generate offense, having scored more than three goals in just 10 games. "Right, wrong or indifferent, we've got Dahlheimer and then 11 guys battling for ice time," said Monticello coach Eric Nelson, who often deploys all four of his forward lines.

They have combined for 11 power-play goals, leading an attack that converts 24.4 percent of the time with the man advantage. Brooks Wilson and Tyler Miller have scored 21 and 18 points, respectively.

DEFENSE: Upperclassmen fill five of the six spots. Senior Gavin Simon has demonstrated his prowess on the power play, netting three goals and assisting on 11 others. Sophomore Cameron Schmitz is third among blueliners with seven assists. GOALIES: Senior Michael Biller has logged more than 1,200 minutes in net and stepped up his play lately, stopping 133 of the last 143 shots he's faced for a .930 save percentage.



The good part about being a state tournament underdog is the lack of pressure. Hey, it's easy for a team to play all free and loose when nobody expects it to win.

The bad part about being a state tournament underdog is, you know, there's a reason—or several—that your team isn't expected to win.

As the No. 5 seed, Alexandria is taking the free-and-easy approach to this week's state tournament. And why not?

Yes, the Cardinals (19-6-2) feature one of the tournament's best forward tandems in Josiah Gronholz and Brycen Berg, but there's no need to announce that to the rest of the field.

And shhhhh, don't mention the fact the Cardinals have gone 11-0-1 in their last 12 games. Or that they outscored their three Section 6A opponents by a combined 33-4. Or that sophomore Gavin Olson has emerged as something of a super secret playoff scoring specialist, firing home seven of his 11 goals, including the third-period winner in the section final against Fergus Falls, in his last three games.




coach patrick andrews


coach joe pankratz
