Scripture Readings May 4: Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41, Rv 5:11-14, Jn 21:1-19 or 21:1-14 (48)

Pastor's Message The Catholic Church observes the eight-day period known as the Easter Octave, beginning on Easter and ending on Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus revealed to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open."

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy was given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you." "Whoever recites it will receive great mercy at the hour of

death."

The Image of Divine Mercy with the red and white rays that emanate from his heart, symbolizes the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification.

The focus of this devotion is that God is merciful, he forgives all sins, for he died for each one of us.

The Use of Incense #2 – We have purchased a variety of incense for those with allergies. The first instance of incense appears over a thousand years before Jesus. It was the major event on Mount Sinai in Exodus 24. The use of incense for the Israelites and the universal Church reminds the faithful of God's glory. Also, Psalm 141 states, "Let my prayer arise before you like incense." Incense is used throughout the Christmas and Easter seasons and special feasts, such as Corpus Christi. (to be continued)

Bishop Barron's Statement on the Death of Pope Francis



Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio on December 17, 1936, has reached the end of his earthly

pilgrimage. Pope Francis was a great pastor who spoke from the heart and with tender affection. I had the pleasure of meeting with Pope Francis several times during his papacy. On the occasions when he and I spoke, his comments would burn their way into my heart and mind. During a meeting with my fellow bishops, he reminded us that "the first task of a bishop is to pray."

Pope Francis' papacy was marked by two master themes: mercy and evangelization. In an interview, he famously remarked that the Church is a field hospital to those wounded by our postmodern, relativistic society. It must, first and foremost, heal the wounds. Pope Francis had a keen awareness of the destructiveness of sin, and he encouraged the Church to show the world the merciful face of Christ. He also emphasized the importance of our personal witness to the light of faith, drawing others to the life-giving joy of the Gospel.

As we celebrate Pope Francis' life and legacy, please join me in praying for the repose of his soul.
