Hall of Fame adds five new members

DON SIVERSON

Don Siverson of Fargo had a number of athletic achievements on his resume before he ever began playing fast pitch softball. He quarterbacked his high school team to 29 consecutive wins, was a three year starter on the basketball team, a pole vaulter and played baseball on three state Junior Legion tournaments. He also quarterbacked the NDSU Bison football teams which won four conference and two National titles.

After all of that, he decided to try his hand at fast pitch softball starting in 1968 and retiring in 1992. During that 24 year period, he played in 22 state tournaments, four regionals and three National Tournaments. His teams won state championships in 1975 and 1981 and advanced to Regional play in 1975, 1984, 1985 and 1986. He played in National tournaments in 1986, 1988 and 1991. Siverson was regarded as one of the best defensive players on any team on which he played. He played third base and sometimes at first base but was actually a catcher who could and did play all positions when called on to do so. His career batting average was near .300 and he was an excellent teammate who was liked and respected by teammates and opponents alike.

JACK PETERSON

Jack Peterson of Moorhead played fast pitch softball in Fargo/ Moorhead for 23 years retiring in 1993 with a lifetime batting average approximately in the range of .290 to 295. He was a gifted outfielder blessed with good speed and a strong, accurate arm. At the plate, Peterson had power but excelled at hitting the ball in the holes between fielders. Primarily an outfielder, he could and often did play any infield position and continued to produce as a clutch hitter. He played in 24 State Tournaments, playing on five championship teams as a player and one as a sponsor. His teams also went to six Class A Regional Tournaments and four Class B Nationals. In addition to his playing career, Peterson also sponsored several teams in the Tri-River League and he served on the Board of Directors for the Fargo Fast Pitch league for

LYLE RADER

Lyle Rader has been a registered softball umpire for 44 years and currently serves on the state umpire staff as the Deputy UIC for Southeastern North Dakota. While he umpires both slow pitch and fast pitch, his first love remains

fast pitch which be started working in Minot. He has umpired in 24 National Tournaments and also umpired in approximately 50 state tournaments. He also serves as the Umpire in Chief for the Wahpeton Softball League and has been in that capacity for 20 years. He has obtained the Elite level of umpiring excellence and is regarded as the expert in fast pitch softball mechanics and rules knowledge. He has attended a number of National Umpire Clinics and is a member of the McQuade Tournament Hall of Fame. His mechanics have been described as "textbook" and his knowledge of the rules is second to none. He has also mentored a number of young umpires and continues to conduct Rules Clinics both locally and around the state.

MIKE SWANSON

Mike Swanson of Bismarck was nominated by a Hall of Fame member and endorsed by two other Hall Of Fame members and Scott Brahos, the current Vice President of USASoftballNorth Dakota. Swan son has played slow pitch softball for 22 years and is still active in the game. He has played with a number of Elite teams including Coaches Choice, Tharaldsons and Sperle Masonry. His stats at the

Elite level include an approximate batting average of .650. He has played in 27 state tournaments including 15 state titles at the highest level of softball. His teams also did well at the National Level finishing in second place in Class B Nationals in 2003. His personal stats include being named National Homerun Champ in Class B National in 2003, 1st team All American in 2002 and again in 2004. Almost as impressive as his playing ability is the kind of person Mike is on and off the field. He is well liked and respected by both teammates and opponents. The word "Ambassadore" of Softball is used often in referring to Swanson.

ROYAL CARLSON

Royal Carlson, who spent his career playing in the Tri-River League and the Fargo/Moorhead league was one of the three fast pitch veterans elected to the softball Hall of Fame at the Selection Committee's Meeting on January 19, 2019 in Jamestown. Eleven members of the committee were present and voting and seven votes were required to be elected.

Royal Carlson lived in Wolverton, Minnesota but played softball in both the Tri-River League and the Fargo/Moorhead league. His career spanned 26 years and resulted in 490 wins as a pitcher against 190 losses. He played in Wolverton for 14 years and served as manager and general manager as well as league officer and state representative for the Tri-River league. Royal was lured into Fargo to pitch for Schmidt Beer in the Twin City League where he pitched for 12 years. One of the teams for which he pitched was Western Products which won the 1991 state tournament as well as the Regional in their division and went on to play in the National Tournament in Reno, Nevada.

In addition to Royal's talent on the diamond, he was very active in the softball community helping host four National Tournaments in Fargo and one ISF World Tournament. Royal was a tireless worker devoting a remarkable amount of time to his work in promoting National Tournaments in Fargo. He also held the position of Secretary for Men's Fast pitch for the state organization for 15 years and was the league Representative to NDASA for eleven years.



JO Column for Spring 2019

Looks like it will be another full Season of Softball starting this Spring.

High School softball practice starts this year on March 18th, with the first games to be played on March 29th. According to the NDHSAA web site, 53 teams are listed to compete this spring, 21 Class A Schools and 32 Class B Schools. New teams for this year are Harvey/Wells County and Rugby, which will play a JV schedule. Best of luck to those new programs. The State Tournament for this year, is scheduled the for May 30, 31st and June 1st. Minot will Host the Class A Tournament with the Class B Scheduled in Fargo.

USA Softball of North Dakota has announced the tryout for the 12U All American games. The Tryout is scheduled for Sunday, April 28th, in Bismarck, at McQuades Diamonds starting at 1:00 PM. Please contact me, Brian Neuhardt, at brian.neuhardt@yahoo.com or call my cell at 701-425-2354. ALL girls 12U and under are eligible to tryout for the Region 8 teams that will compete in the 12U All American Games. This prestigious tournament is scheduled to be played on

June 8th – 10th, at Hall of Fame Stadium complex in Oklahoma City. Please note that weekend is right after the NCAA Championship games, which are also at that site. USA Softball of North Dakota is granted 5 players and 1 coach to send to the tournament. There are only 320 girls eligible to play that weekend. For Registration information please visit the state web site at www.usasoftballnd.com.

We held our JO annual fall meeting back in October. From the meeting, the JO tournaments were set. Those tournaments can also be seen on the website. Anyone interested in hosting a tournament please contact me and we will add that tournament to the state website.

As in previous years, and in the sense of safety and security, all players must register with USA softball before playing or practicing with their teams. As in the past this gives all players insurance for liability and medical, should something unfortunate happen to them while on the field. Most Park districts in North Dakota will not allow those kids on the field unless they have the insurance. If you need an insurance certificate, please contact me on that, and we

All coaches must have a back-ground check before being allowed to coach or be on the field with players. This includes any coach or score book keeper. Also, one coach must have a completed an ACE training component and watch the SAFE Sport Training videos. These rules will be enforced at all ND USA Softball tournaments starting in June.

The JO state tournament will be held in Minot on July 12 – 14th. This year the Class B tournaments for 18U and 16U will be combined into one tournament. This was a request from the coaches so all kids can participate in the state tournament. Also, new for this year will be a time limit rule. The new rule is at the one-hour and 20 minute, one more full inning will be completed after that 1 hour and 20 minute mark. That is a change to match the USA Softball rule book.

Ump Chat

Hopefully, by the time you get this article, it has warmed up considerably. As I write this it is -31 air temperature, which means we are all looking forward to the softball season. Once again, the upcoming season comes with minimal new rule changes which are great for both umpires and players. Elsewhere in this issue is a complete listing of the rule changes for 2019. We will go over the entire list of rule changes at all of the umpire rules clinics and all of the manager's rules clinics throughout the state. If you have any questions concerning any of the rule changes, be sure and let me know.

Several of us recently returned from the USA Softball UIC Conference in Oklahoma City. Attending the conference along with myself were DUIC's Elliott Gerhardt and Al Ziemann from Bismarck, Lyle Rader from Wahpeton, and Chris Coleman from Fargo. It was an excellent conference covering topics on umpire recruiting and retention, game management, umpire mechanics and training along with information from several speakers.

We will be holding several classroom rules clinics for managers and umpires. We will also be holding several field clinics for umpires throughout the state that everyone is invited to attend. At past field clinics we have stretched a string ten feet high and another string six feet high between the pitcher's mound and home plate to use as a training tool for umpires to see where the ten-foot limit is and where the six-foot minimum is. This is a great training tool for both umpires and players.

I highly recommend that pitchers, players, and managers take the time to attend the portion of the field clinic at the beginning where we cover the pitching height to get a true feel of where the ten-foot arc limit really is. Last year we had a lot of players attend our field clinics and a lot of eyes were opened at our field clinics by players and umpires alike when we stretch the string and start throwing pitches. So, please consider attending a field clinic and take a look at the pitching arc. There is a complete listing of classroom clinics and field clinics listed elsewhere in this issue.

We have several opportunities for players and umpires to be a part of national tournaments in North Dakota this summer. Mandan will be hosting the Men's Masters 35 &

Over, 45 & Over Men's and 35& Over Women's National Tournament August 23-25, 2019. There will be a competitive division and a recreational division in the men's tournaments which should really increase participation in these tournaments. These national tournaments are a great opportunity for our Men's and Women's Masters teams so start thinking about getting your team put together. Mandan has done an excellent job in growing this tournament each year to a very respectable level. This is also going to be an excellent opportunity for umpires as this is an Elite qualifier tournament, one of only a few in ASA that allows umpires to achieve Elite status.

We will also have a lot of great opportunities for umpires from ND to work national tournaments this summer. Besides the North Dakota Nationals, we have already secured some great opportunities this summer for some of our umpires to work a national tournament outside the state. Elliott Gerhardt has been chosen to work the Girls 18U Gold Fastpitch Tournament in Plano, TX. Ben Birkemeyer from Bismarck has also been assigned to umpire the Girl's 18U Gold Fastpitch Tourna-

ment in Plano, TX. Naomi Erdahl from Bismarck has been assigned to umpire the USA JO Cup Fastpitch Tournament in California. These are some excellent tournament assignments for some of our ND umpires.

We will also be receiving umpire assignments for the Women's JO National Tournament in Watertown, SD and some of the Girls JO Fastpitch nationals on our region. I am also working on a couple of other umpire exchanges for national tournaments outside our region. All these opportunities to work outside our state are great opportunities for our umpires to showcase their skills.

Some exciting news for our umpiring program in North Dakota and that is North Dakota has been selected by the USA Softball National Office to host a national umpire school in ND this spring. I will coordinate this effort along with our DUIC's and we will set up a committee to do all of the planning. The national school will be held in Bismarck on April 26-28, 2019. We are hoping to have 100 umpires register for this great opportunity to improve their umpiring skills. I have already had

inquiries for umpires to attend from Arkansas, MT, SD, ND, MN, NE, and MO. Nationally recognized clinicians will be conducting the national school. Three clinicians have been assigned with a fourth clinician to be named soon. Steve Riswold, from Sioux Falls, SD, Larry Montgomery from Columbia, Mississippi, and Steve Roscia from Portland, Maine will be conducting the school. Welcome again to another softball season in North Dakota. When it comes time to write this column regarding the upcoming softball season, we know we are at the tail end of winter and the softball season is around the corner.

We had a good year in 2018 for USA Softball of North Dakota. Our adult registrations were flat but enjoyed more growth in our JO program. The USA Softball ND/Monsta Tournament Series in MSP was very successful and provided a \$15,000 prize package for participating teams. There were 380 teams that comprised of 731 entries in tournaments throughout the summer for series events. Invitational tournaments in Adult and JO had a total of 1,431 teams entering events in 2018. The State Tournaments also had record numbers in 2018 with 641 teams playing in State Tournaments compared to 622 in 2017. We are grateful to Gary Tharaldson as he continues to sponsor and cover the costs of all of our trophies, medals and awards for State Tournaments. Gary's contribution to our program is significant, and allows us to keep our entry fees affordable for all teams and assists

in maximizing participation. Please thank Gary whenever you have the opportunity.

I attended the USA Softball National Council meeting in Oklahoma City this past fall as did Jack Jones, RC Courtright, and Nick Gulmon. We were all involved in many important committees at the meeting regarding USA Softball Code and Rules, as well as attending several very good trainings sessions put on by the national staff.

The Long Range Planning Committee is also working on putting together on-line training modules for local associations with classes regarding services, equipment, registration, & governance to start with. This project could be very beneficial to associations throughout the country. USA Softball of North Dakota received the USA Softball National Award for the Best Website in the country. Credit for this award goes to RC Courtright, Director of Operation in our program for all his great work in the development of the USA Softball of North Dakota web site. Congrats RC and great work. Jack Jones and Brian Neuhardt also received 5 years awards for their work. Also at the Council meeting, Mandan and Fargo received the prestigious James Ferrell Award for hosting the highest rated National Championships in the country in 2018. An award like this does not just happen, it takes hard work by the local tournament committee, a supportive volunteer base and outstanding Umpire Staff. My congratulations to Mandan and Fargo and thanks for all the great work. Mandan will also host the 2019 and 2020 MSP Masters 35, 45 as well as the WSP Masters 35 National Tournaments. Fargo was awarded the 2020 MSP E/Rec Northern National Tournament which has been highly successful when hosted in the past in North Dakota.

There are some great opportunities to participate in USA Softball National Championships in 2019 in the Northern Region. GFP 10U-C thru 14U-C in Watertown, S.D. July 25-28. GFP 12U-A and 10U-B in North Mankato, Mn. July 25-28, GFP 12U-B in Rapid City, S.D. July 25-28, GFP 14U-B in Rochester, Mn July 25-28, and GFP 18U-A in Sioux Falls, S.D July 25-28th. In the Adult program National Championships in the Region are

the MSP, WSP Masters in Mandan, August 23-25, MSP B in Prairie Island, Mn. August 23-25 and MSP C also in Prairie Island, Mn. August 30-Sept 2.

The USA Softball of North Dakota Hall of Fame Committee met in January and reviewed 25 candidate applications for the HOF. It is my pleasure to extend a sincere congratulations to Royal Carlson of Zumbrota, Mn., Jack Peterson of Moorhead, Don Siverson of Fargo. Mike Swanson of Bismarck, and Lyle Rader of Wahpeton. Women's Softball Commissioner

WOMEN'S MASTERS STATE or Old-pro state, as I have always known it to be, has made a couple of changes. We have now added some new categories for players who may have not qualified to play in the past so they can now play in our women's masters state tournament. These changes were made to allow more players to play.

Before this year, in order to play in a women's master state tournament, you had to be on an existing North Dakota USA softball women's roster and 30 years of age or over by the end of the current calendar year. If you were not on a

roster, or on a league only roster, or on a co-ed only roster, you did not qualify for this tournament.

NOW, the rule will read:

"players can be NDUSA rostered players, on a women's league only roster, on a coed roster, or a nonrostered ND bonified resident"

The new point system is as follows:

5 points – League Only / Coed / ND resident, non-rostered

5 points – Class C

4 points – Class D 3 points – Rec 1

2 points – Rec 2

1 point – Rec 3

If you're interested in putting together a Women's Masters roster, go to the USA Softball of ND website under forms (https://www.

usasoftballnd.com/forms).

And speaking of the NDUSA SOFTBALL WEBSITE – CONGRATULATIONS to RC for his hard work on our NDUSA softball website. He has earned North Dakota the best website at the national meeting this year! There will be important information posted on the USAND Softball website regarding women's softball. We are currently working on publishing the women's

database online for league reps and tournament reps to be able to access for classification information.

2019 ROSTERS – Remember to have accurate information on your roster and all players are to sign their own names on your rosters. Eventually, we see that all rosters will soon be online, but for now please fill out your information correctly and legibly.

Vanyo picked up the game of fast pitch softball while serving in the Army in Yuma, Arizona. That particular location had a number of fast pitch teams playing so Vanyo decided to take up the game. Upon his release from Military Service, he returned to Fargo/Moorhead and found his talents suitable for a Class A team sponsored by Schmidt

Beer of Fargo. He played a number of years with that team under the sponsorship of Schmidt Beer, Cactus Jacks and Coors Light. Among the players on this team were Hall of Fame members Jim Baum, Rick Fee, John Lindstrom and one of this year's inductees, Don Siverson. After an injury ended his active playing days, Vanyo remained active as a coach and manager and soon became President of the FM Softball Association. He also was a member of the various Tournament Committees which brought National Tournament Events to the FM Area. In addition to those duties, he also served on the state Classification Committee. His appointment fills the only remaining vacancy on the Hall of Fame Selection Committee.

Bismarck to host national umpire school

April 26 through April 28

A USA Softball National Umpire School will be held in Bismarck in April. Classroom work will take place in St. Mary's Grade School and outside drills will be held at the Clem Kelley Softball Complex in South Bismarck. The school will begin on Friday evening with a meeting with the Regional Umpire's in Chief who will be conducting the school. The school is designed to help veteran and newer umpires improve their umpiring skills and improve their knowledge of the rules.

Region 8 Umpire in Chief Steve Riswold from Sioux Falls, South Dakota will lead the school along with three other members of the National Umpire Staff including Dave Chandler from Indiana, Larry Montgomery of Mississippi and Steve Roscia from Maine. North Dakota Umpire in Chief Mike Wolf of Bismarck will be the school coordinator and be in charge of registrations, making travel arrangements for the clinicians, securing a host hotel and all other logistics for the school. Deputy UIC's Elliot Gerhardt, Terry O'Clair and Al Ziemann along with the Bismarck Umpire Association's Board of Directors will assist in the coordination efforts and will assist the clinicians throughout the weekend with the school.

Registration forms will be available shortly after the first of the year. At this time, the fee is anticipated to be \$75. Clinic officials are hopeful that the school will draw participants from North and South Dakota, Minnesota, Montana and Nebraska

Is there a future for 5x5x softball in North Dakota?

INAUGURAL STATE TOUR-NAMENT PROVIDES GLIMPSE AT THE NEW FORMAT

The first attempt at a Fall State tournament did not quite go as planned. With most players having ended their seasons at least a month prior and the increasing likelihood of colder-than-normal temperatures as the event drew closer, few teams registered for any of the four separate tournaments scheduled for the first weekend of October. There was, however, a glimmer of hope in the form of a tournament featuring a fairly new format to North Dakota - one that would pit three teams head-to-head-to-head on the same field. Six teams from four cities participated in Tier 2 of the inaugural Men's Fall 5x5x5 state tournament - a format that has started to take hold in Minnesota, Alaska, Washington, and elsewhere across the country. Based on the reaction from those who withstood the 45° temperature to get their first experience with this format, there is reason to be encouraged that we may see much more of this in future seasons.

WAIT....WHAT EXACTLY IS 5x5x5 SOFTBALL, ANYWAY?

In the 5-man tournament, teams were allowed rosters of anywhere from 5 to 8 players. They could bat any number of players, but everyone who batted had to also play defense. At the start of the game, one team would play the four outfield positions and pitcher, the second would play the four infield positions and catcher, and the third team would bat. Each inning, the teams would rotate from outfield to infield, infield to batting, and batting to outfield. Since there are 9 total outs each inning instead of the usual 6, games were scheduled for only 5 innings. In pool play, the team with the most runs would be awarded two wins; the team scoring the next most runs would get one win. While ties in pool play would results in wins being split between the teams, in the championship, it was "one-tie, all-tie", meaning

each team would advance to extra innings and still have a chance at the title even if one was well behind the other two after 5 innings (a scenario that played out in this year's tourney).

All of this makes for a very busy set of games for most players. Many played both the outfield and infield. Therefore, they would be in the field for 6 outs each inning. That makes a 5 inning game feel like a 10 inning game. A similar effect was felt on offense. With a shorter batting order that turns over quickly, there were times a player would score a run and immediately go to the on deck circle or, sometimes, right back into the batter's box. Some of the players in the championship game batted over 30 times in 4 games. It definitely helped keep the guys warm on that chilly Sunday, but it was physically demanding since there were no breaks between games in this particular tournament.

INITIAL REACTIONS FROM PLAYERS & FANS PROVED TO BE ENCOURAGING

By the time the final game had been played, the responses both at the complex and online were overwhelmingly positive. Colby Hans Aasand - representing Sportsman's Lounge, one of three Wahpeton teams that made the trek to Fargo that day - described it as "awesome" and an "all around great tournament". Colby added, "We were already talking about next year." Nick Alan of tournament runner-up Wahpeton Overthrown posted in a Facebook comment, "Really a fun tournament to play in! Would definitely come again." Aaron Backer, whose 6-for-6 with 6 runs scored in the opening game for eventual state champion Jamestown KCs/Wildside Creations set the tone for the day, really enjoyed the challenges presented by the new format: "It's more action than standard slow pitch. You bat more often with a smaller lineup. Defense is interesting because you play a different position depending on where you are at in the inning. It was fun!"

Most comments shared a common thread coming out of that weekend - a lot of players were looking forward to doing it again, not just in a state tournament, but in invitationals as well. Williston who hosted the first and only 5x5x5 invitational back in May - plans to bring it back twice in early 2019. Darin Kreuger, Williston's league representative and Executive Director of the city's Parks & Recreation District, has been a vocal advocate for the format since beginning the state's only 5x5x5 league two seasons ago. "Our players love it," says Darin, "It is a lot easier to get 5-8 players to commit to play vs 10-12." While it allows some players to gain a little different perspective on defense when forced to play out of their comfort zone on the infield or in the outfield, Darin points out that a major selling point for most is getting more cuts. "I feel that the best reason to try it early in the season is for the AT BATS!" Lest we forget that this is still a game and we ultimately want everyone to have fun, Darin also stressed that 5x5x5 encourages camaraderie with those you are competing against by making you work with both of your opponents on defense each inning. "5x5x5 allows you to meet other players from teams. You will be playing defense together vs the other team. It's an interesting dynamic as you need them to beat the other team, yet you are trying to beat them, too!"

Beyond Williston, there is talk in other cities of giving the format a try next summer as well. Furthermore, it would also be no surprise to see most, if not all of this year's state tournament teams return the second time around (quite possibly at least a couple of weeks earlier).

So, is there a future for 5x5x5 in this state? Our belief is that the more people get to experience it, the more people will get hooked.

NOTE: All changes below are EFFECTIVE January 1, 2019 unless otherwise noted.

Article Number Change Article 301 C 02 b

b. Armed Services Teams. The Women's Armed Services team must play in Women's Class Open Slow Pitch and the Men's Armed Services team may play in teh Men's Class A and/or Class B Slow Pitch.

<u>Comments:</u> Allows Men's Armed Services to play in Men's Class A and/or Class B Slow Pitch

Article 301 C 02 c 02

c. Fast Pictch.

02. In all adult Fast Pictch, no USA Men's National Team Member may participate below the Major level.

EXCEPTION: A member of the USA Junior Men's National Team may participate below the Major level in a National Championship Final. Non-pitching members on USA Softball Men's National Team may pitch at the Open level, but cannot bat or assume any other defensive position.

<u>Comments</u>: Allows non-pitching members of the USA Softball Men's National Team to pitch at the Open level, but not bat or play any other defensive positions.

Article 301 C 02 e 02

e. Slow Pitch

02. A restricted slow pitch players list will be compiled by a USA Softball committee representing slow pitch. The restricted slow pitch players list will be available on the USA Softball website and this list will be updated, modified and/or revised on a regular and continous basis but will be finalized by August 1 each year for the current year's National Championship Finals. Players on the USA Softball restricted slow pitch player's list may only play Class A and Super. Any team that participates in the Men's Class A may not have more than five (5) players from the USA Softball restricted slow pitch player list. Any appeals regarding this list can be made through the National Office to the slow pitch sub-committee.

<u>Comments:</u> Increases the number of restricted players on a Class A team from three (3) to five (5).

Article 301 D 06

06. Industrial Qualifications. Deleted from code

<u>Comments:</u> Removes Men's Industrial Slow Pitch as a USA Softball National Championship. This also removes Men's Industrial Slow Pitch from Articles 306, 309 and 315

<u>Article 303 A 05</u>

05. Pick-up players must be from the team's same or lower classification. (Adult Slow Pitch Only) A Player who is individually classified may be picked up by a team with the same classifications. Said classified players may only play one Class lower than their current team's classification. For those players who are not individually classified, their current team's classification applies.

Comments: In Adult Slow Pitch, a player who is eligible by their individual player classification may be picked up by a lower classified team. For example, a Class D player playing on a Class C team may be picked up by a Class D team.

10. Military / First Responders Slow Pitch

NOTE: The Military / First Responders playing guidelines, championship dates, and location will be established by the USA Softball Executive Director.

<u>Comments:</u> Adds a Military/ First Resonder Slow Pitch National Championship, with dates and location established by USA Softball Executive Director.

l. Open Co-ed. This Natoinal Championship Final Shall have Dates established and approved by the Executive Director.

<u>Comments:</u> The Executive Director will establish and approve dates for Open Co-ed,

Article 309 C 01 m

m. Class C, Class D and Class E Co-ed. This National Championship Final shall have dates established and approved by the Executive Director.

<u>Comments:</u> The Executive Director will establish and approved dates for Class C, Class D and Class E Co-ed.

Article 310 B

B. At-Large Berths. Deleted from Code.

<u>Comments:</u> Teams qualify through their local association; there are no berths to be awarded.

Article 312

National Qualifier Tournaments. Deleted from Code

<u>Comments:</u> Teams qualify through their local association; there are no National Qualifiers.

Article 313

USA Softball Gold Qualifying Tournaments (Junior Olympic 16 Under and 18 Under Gold Only)

A. Eligible Teams.

01. Registrations. All USA Softball registered Girls' 18-Under Gold and 18-Under Gold Fast Pitch Teams within their respective age groups may participate in any Gold National Qualifier.

02. Previously Qualfied.
Teams previously qualified for the National Championship Finals are eligible to compete in any Gold National Qualifer.

B. Assessment Fees. A \$15.00 per team assessment fee to be paid to USA Softball.

C. Site. The site of these tournaments shall be determined by a vote of the council members within their respective regions.

D. Region Administrator. The Regional VP will appoint a Gold Administrator for their respective Region. This individual, along with the Regional VP, is responsible for ensuring all Gold National Qualified information is posted on the TournamentUSASoftball.com

website & for communicating the dates/sites of their events to the National Office.

E. Notification. All Gold National Qualfiers must be posted on the TournamentUSASoftball. com site by January 10 each year. Associations who have not passed their events by Jan 10 may lose berths allocated to their Region, and the berths will be redistribted.

F. GOLD Qualifying Tournament Procedures.

01. National GOLD Qualifying Touraments.

a. Qualifers within a region will be based on mutual agreement from the associations with region. Only associations within the region that have Gold teams will be allowed to host a National Qualifier. If mutliple sites are selected to host a qualifier within a region, those events cannot be held on the same weekend. Gold National Qualifiers may be held during the week if agreed upon by the association JO commissioners within the region.

b. If no agreement can be reached, the association with the most Gold participation will set their date first followed by the association with the next highest participation.

c. Qualifiers may be held for the following year at any time the conclusion of the current year's National Championship, with agreement from their respective Region.

02. Sites / Number of Teams. Any associations hosting Gold Qualifying Touraments must do so at sites that can accommodate all Gold teams who have entered prior to the tournament entry deadline.

03. **Tourament Bracket.** In accordance with **Article 311 (A)** (**Exception**) of the USA Softball Code, the official double elimination or three-game bracket is to be utilized for all Gold National Qualifiers.

04. Tournament Entry Procedures. Sites may accept entries at any time after the event is listed on the USA Softball tournament website. Any teams wishing to enter must submit the following to the respective tournament directors the following:

a. Approved - USA Softball Offical Tournament Entry Form

b. Approved - USA Softball Championship Roster

c. Tournamet Entry fee. Receipt of the entry fee and roster does not guarantee a team a spot in the tournament.

05. USA Softball Website Posting.

a. Tournament directors must follow Procedural Manual Article 105 (D) (14) with regard to posting and using www.tournamentUSAsoftball.com

b. Tournament directors must submit, to the National Office, an official order to finish and tournament bracket within 24 hours after the conclusion of the tournament.

c. Tournament directors will be scan/email the original rosters and official tournaments entry forms (completed) to the National Office and the host director for the National Tournament.

d. Failure to submit paperwork on time will result in assessment fees to be raised from \$15 per team to \$50 per team to be paid to USA Softball.

06. Master List of Qualified Teams. The National Office will maintain a master list of all Gold teams who have qualified and accepted berth(s) for the National Championship Finals. Maintaining this list will require each Tournament Director to submit on Monday following the event they have hosted, a list of teams that qualified at the event they hosted. Inclusive in the report will be the following: Team Name, as it appears on their USA Softball Official Tournament Entry Form, Manager's Name including Street Addresss, City, State, Zip Code and Telephone Numbers.

07. Notification of Unfilled Berths. Tournament directors must advise the Regional VP and Regional Gold Program Administrator immediately if any Gold berth gose unclaimed from the event they hosted. In the event regional berths are not awarded, the following process will be used:

a. Unused berths will be added to the next remaining qualifier scheduled within their respective region. Unused berths will continue to be passed down until all remaining qualifiers within a region have been held.

b. In the event all qualifiers within a region have concluded and unfilled berths remain, the unallocated berths will be returned to the National Office for distribution to other regions.

08. Entry Fees. Tournament directors are asked to review the tournament fees in light of the double elimination or three-gam bracket format and adjust accordingly.

09. **Awarding of Berths.** Weather permitting; teams must participate in order to receive a berth.

a. If the tourament has fewer entries than the number of berths, then the number of berths will be reduced for that tournament. The number of berths shall always be at least one (1) less than the number of teams entered.

b. Berths shall be based on the number allowed by the USA Softball Code for each Region and by the number of teams participating.

c. Regions will be retain the option to offer less berths but cannot offer more than allowed by the USA Softball Code without permission from the National Office.

04. **Berths.** The first and second place team in each Regional National Championship Finals shall receive a berth to the Junior Olympic Girls' USA Softball National Championship Finals in the team's current or succeeding year's age classification provided the team has five (5) participating players from the previous year's roster on the current year's roster and physically present at the current championship tournament site prior to the start of their first game.

<u>Comments:</u> Changes Territorial Championship Finals to Regional National Championship Finals and allows regions the option of combining 2 or more regional events.

2019 USA Softball Rule Changes with Comments as of November 30, 2018

NOTE: All changes below are EFFECTIVE January 1, 2019 unless otherwise noted.

Rule 3, Section 6:

Remove: Coaches, players and team representatives from displaying the names or logos of other softball assocations on their uniforms.

Comment: Allow for other organizations logos to be on players and coaches uniforms.

Rule 3, Section 6A Effect 2:

(Female Fast Pitch and all Slow Pitch) Ball caps and visors are optional for players. If worn, they may be mixed and must be worn property, colors to include: black, white, gray, beige or team colors. The colors may be mixed and are not required to be the same for all team members. Handkerchiefs do not qualify as headwear and cannot be worn around the head or neck. Plastic visors are not allowed.

Comment: Allows colors to be mixed when wearing caps or visors in Female Fast Pitch and all Slow Pitch Classifications of play.

Rule 3, Section 6D:

An Arabic whole number (0-99) of contrasting color, or outlined in contrasting color, at least three inches high, must be clearly visible on all uniform shirts.

Comment: Revises the requirement for the size and location of the number placed on the uniform jersey.

Rule 4, Section 1C [1c]:

When batting up to all roster players, any additional

batters shall be listed as an EP and may be listed anywhere in the batting order and may play defense at any postition.

Comment: Clarifies where EPs may be listed in teh batting order for JO Fast Pitch Pool Play.

Rule 5, Section 3A:

All games played using a Time Limit will be considered Regulation Games regardless of the number of innings completed/played. Comment: Specifies that all games ending as a result of the Time Limit Rule will be considered Regulation Games.

Rule 7, Section 3B:

(JO Boy's 14U and 18U Slow Pitch) The batter shall assume a one ball, one strike count upon entering the batter's box

Comment: Adds JO Boy's 14U, 16U and 18U Slow Pitch Classifications of Play to those who will start with a one ball, one strike count.

Rule 8, Section 10A [4]:

Defensive changes involving the pitcher or catcher must be reported to the Plate Umpire to ensure the correct player must have a courtesy runner.

Comment: Requires teams to report those defensive changes involving the pitcher or the catcher.

2019 USA Softball Procedural Manual Changes with Comments as of November 30, 2018

Affiliated Members may vote with either the Local Association Region, Territory, and Section in which they live or with the Local Association, Region, Territory, and Section in which the organization's National Office is located.

<u>Comments:</u> Gives Affiliated members the option to vote with the Local Association, Region, Territory and Section in which they live or where the organization's National Office is located.

Article 112 B

A. Affiliated Members. A non-profit association or organization may become an Affiliated Member of the Association upon meeting the requirements set forth in the Code and Procedural Manual with 60% affimative vote of the Council. All applications for Affiliated whether such organization had qualified for membership status, before submission to the Council. Affiliated Members may vote with either the Local Association, Region, Territory, and Section in which live or with the Local Association, Region, Territory, and Section in which the organization's National Office is located.

<u>Comments:</u> Gives Allied members the option to vote with the Local Association, Region, Territory and Section in which they live or where the organization's National Office is located.

Article 113 A

A. **Purpose.** To honor those men and women who have played a major role in the growth and development of softball, one of the great sports of the United States. Also, to bring to the attention of the public, the widespread value of, and interest in, the game of softball by so honoring those who have made outstanding contributions to its' success. Their contributions must exceed the expectations of their regularly assigned postition.

<u>Comments:</u> Clarifies requirements for Hall of Fame nominees

Article 11 B 01 a 03

03. Prereqisites.

a. Fast Pitch. The minimum requirements for consideration are three selections as an All-American including at least one selection to the First Team; or

three selections as a member of Team USA or any combination of the three.

NOTE: The selection process developed by a joint venture of USA Softball and the approval of the United States Olympic Committe must be utilized in selecting the national team. Multiple selections to Team USA during the same year will be limited to one (1) per season in determining eligibility for Hall of Fame induction.

b. Slow Pitch. The minimu, requirements for consideration are three selections as an All-American including at least one selection to the First Team; or three selections as a member of Team USA or any combination of the three.

<u>Comments:</u> Separates prerequisties for Fast Pitch and Slow Pitch Hall of Fame noninations.

Article 113 B 01 b

b. Umpires. In order to be selected as an umpire, an umpire must meet the following criteria: 01. Umpired for a period

of fifteen (15) years

02. Umpired in three (3) national championships, at least one at the highest available classification.

03. Must have been retired at least three (3) years from major competition.

04. Contributions to the National Umpire Program. 05. Contributions to the success of the Umpire in

Chief clinic.

06. Effective as a clinician of the National or International level or for the military level.

07. Effective as an instructor at National Umpire Schools.

Comments: Requires umpires to have umpired at the highest available classification in order to be nominated to the Hall of Fame. Administrative and Clinican requirements have also been removal because many umpires are not afforded the opportunity to serve as a Regional UIC

or member of the National Umpire Staff.

C. Managers / Coach.

01. Managed / Coached for a period of fifteen (15) years.

02. Managed / Coached in five (5) national championships.

03. Must have been retired at least three (3) years from major championship play.

<u>Comments:</u> Adds the word Coach to go along with Manager.

d. Head Coaches. In order to be selected as a head coach, a coach must meet the following criteria:

01. Must have been the head coach of a national team (Team USA) for a period of five (5) years

period of five (5) years. 02. Win a minimum of two (2) WBSC approved international Championship events (World Championships, World Cups, International Cups, Border Battles and or the Olympics).

<u>Comments:</u> Adds a Head Coach category for Hall of Fame nominations requiremtns.

This person's contributions must have reflected an impact at the national level.






