- Previous award recipients are Jody Christensen, Debbie Thomas, Neil Accola and Paul Wilson.







## **Building Operations**

- Updates this Season:
  - ▶ Motion sensor lights; locker rooms and Mez save \$ electricity
  - New compressor
  - Switch from Cintas to Huebsch
  - Kraft Hockeyville \$10,000 Updates for consideration
- Future Updates:
  - Replace wood and rubber floors in both benches
  - Wall sheeting in stairways and behind bleachers
  - Storage/shelves above lockerrooms for LTS and HS equipment
  - Storage racking
- Ice Maintenance, Greg Leier
  - Focus on ice maintenance this year in response to rentals
  - 4 compressors up and running
  - Ice was in 3 weeks early
  - Maintained the Zam

## Fundraising, Building Events, & Bingo

These 3 areas account for ~\$150,000 in income to support our program from sources many times outside of our Association membership

- Goal: to raise money to help sustain the program and keep skater fees reasonable
- We could eliminate these events and some required volunteer hours, but that would result in a registration fee increase of about \$650 per skater

## Positive Cash Flow of ~\$15,000

- Fairly amazing when we look back at where we were starting the season from even our projections up to the November Board Meeting
  - Thank you to everyone for contributing to these results
- Net Revenue (gross income less attributable expenses) of \$270k required to break even for RFYHA
  - Net Revenue Example: Concessions Gross of \$35k less \$21k expenses = Net of \$14k to go towards paying the expenses outlined in the RFYHA Expense pie chart which totals ~\$270k.

## Challenges this Season

- Replenishing and adding to longer-term savings
  - Made it through the year with positive cash flow and slight replenishment of accounts
  - Realistically need to net around \$40,000 \$45,000 to be viable with the facility we have
- Gas Bill extra \$3,000 in February & \$1,500 in March

### Positives this Season

- Stayed open with positive cash flow
  - There is value in being private and not part of city / county
- Tournament income stable
  - Although lots of team movement
- Compressor system re-design is paid off
  - Was \$135,000 investment 2 years ago

#### 3/31/21 Liabilities


- → Mortgage \$531,000 (\$65,000 reduction in '20-21)
- ← Line of Credit \$14,000 (\$6,000 reduction in '20-21)
- Rink Tec (compressor system) paid off
  - (\$19,200 reduction in '20-21)

### Looking forward: 2021-2022 Season

- Starting with projected cash flow of \$20,000
- ◆ Would like to be at + \$40,000 \$45,000
  - Ideas to replace lost revenue due to COVID-19?
  - We believe some of the events from the past will be finished for good
  - Always room for new ideas / ways to generate revenue with our facility during off season




