Alumni of the Year Gregory 'Greg' Starr Jensen '54

The 2012 Alumni of the year honor was awarded to Gregory Starr Jensen, who graduated in 1954. At BHS, he lettered in football and track.

Just weeks after he graduated, Greg entered the U.S. Marine Corps. While serving his country, he was the victim of a tragic accident that left him paralyzed from the waist down and confined to a wheelchair for the remainder of his life.

While living with his disability, he returned to the Bay Area and graduate from the College of San Mateo, San Francisco State with lifetime honors, and Stanford Law School.

During Greg's long and distinguished legal career, he served as a criminal case Deputy District Attorney in San Mateo County. He then headed the county's private defender program for juvenile offenders and was appointed in 1979 as a municipal court judge and then as a superior court judge for San Mateo County. Greg continued to be an outstanding athlete, competing in the national and international wheelchair games throughout the world. He was a middleweight weight lifter, played basketball, and competed in archery, shot put and 10K races in his chair.

Greg passed away on December 27, 2006, his 71st birthday. His incredible life touched and inspired many. (From his obituary in the San Mateo County Times on 1/6/2007).

In 1999 Chuck married a special lady, Jo Ann, bringing their combined families to six children and 10 grandchildren. Chuck started his career in the sales department of Dole Pineapple Co., eventually becoming VP of Sales Marketing, then Executive VP of US Operations. In 1972 Dole merged with Castle and Cooke where Chuck headed up marketing for several years. His next move was into general management as senior VP responsible for Development including Acquisitions. Chuck took early retirement in 1984 to purchase a "turn around" business -Arneson Products Inc. The company was purchased in 1988 by an east coast conglomerate finally leaving time for Chuck to play some golf. At Chuck's memorial service in Napa in 2011, the surviving members of that BHS group, Rog Adams, John Whipple and Pat Howard Acker attended and recalled from Willamette memories and Burlingame. In March of 2012, John and Pat spoke in the same chapel at the service for Rog Adams who passed away March 10, 2012. Sadly, Rodger Shannon and Gordon Cline had passed away earlier.

Greetings Everyone! From Pat Howard Acker '46 – It is difficult to shrink 66 vears down to a few lines, but I will try to hit the high spots (and some low spots). In the fall of '46 I headed off to Willamette University in Salem, Oregon. Following graduation from WU I went to work at my father's company in San Francisco. That only lasted about a year and a half, as in late 1951 I was married to another WU graduate. The marriage produced three children and several mailing address. We lived in Washington, Alameda, back to Salem, Sunnyvale, New York and finally Saratoga. After 24 years we went our separate ways. I had a boy in junior high, another boy in high school and a daughter aiming for a masters at Yale. I needed a job fast and my resume was only big on PTA positions - not in great demand on the employment front. Somehow I landed a job at KEEN/KBAY Radio in San Jose setting up public service announcements. From there I moved on to sales for KNBR Radio in San Francisco. That was a fun job. While trying to sell advertising to St. Claire Cadillac in San Jose, they offered me a job. That was a shock as mechanics was never my strong suit. Anyway I took the job after getting KNBR to agree to let me continue to work for them too. So I ended up holding down the two jobs for five years. When the car agency sold, I moved on to a new challenge. A friend told me that the head a Silicon of Valley venture capital company needed help while she looked for a new assistant. I ended up staying there for seven years as her assistant. The venture capital business was changing and I could sense that I might be looking for a job soon. My resume had improved but I decided to really make a change. I sold my home in Saratoga and bought a Hallmark shop in the city of Mt. Shasta. I also bought a couple of acres, designed, and built a house and there I stayed for the next 19 years. It was a good place to be, and easy to get involved in the economics of the town. But all good things must come to an end and six years ago it was becoming obvious that staving there with five feet of snow in the front vard in the winter could become a problem for me. I had had multiple surgeries in an attempt to save one of my legs, but in 2001 I decided to stop trying. I continued to live there and run the business for 5 years after the amputation, but it was getting hard to do. One of my sons was living in the Sacramento area, so I started my search there. I was fortunate to find a buyer for the business and my Mt. Shasta house. Then I found a good spot for me in El Dorado Hills and called my

friendly mover. The first three years I was here, I worked as a dispatcher for my son's business, but since then I have been sort of lazy. Now two of my kids are close by and the third is in the Bay Area. I have nine grandchildren ranging in age from 32 down to the six year old twins. I will be going to someone's graduation every year for the rest of my life. One of my kids surprised me with a Shih Tzu puppy about 4 years ago and Duffy is my constant companion. Rather than my taking care of him, he has appointed himself to take care of me. He does a good job. Best wishes to all




