BASEBALL/SOFTBALL COVID 19 ACTION PLAN

To Whom It May Concern,

Below are the guidelines MPAA will implement as their action plan to comply with current Covid 19 Guidelines:

1. MPAA will hold practices and games during this time. Parents understand they are responsible for the actions and behavior of their children and themselves. Coaches and board members will do their best to monitor these guidelines, but in the end, it is the responsibility of the parent practice CDC guidelines.
2. Only one team will be allowed to practice at a time per field.
3. Teams will enter from opposite sides of the field in between practices.
4. Players will not handshake or bump fists/elbows after games. They will line up on the baselines (6' apart) and tip their caps/visors.
5. Parents will be required to bring their own chairs and will be advised to not congregate.
6. Bleachers will be for players at 6' social distancing requirements.
7. Batting Cages are now open. Only one coach and one player in cage at a time. Only one kid waiting outside cage. Teams are not allowed to line-up outside the cage waiting to take turns. They need to stand away from the cages 6' apart while waiting.
8. No sharing of equipment will be allowed.
9. Bat Bags will be hung on the inside of the fences between the dugout and the outfield a minimum of 6' apart.
10. Each player should have their own hand sanitizer.
11. If a player is sick they will stay home.
12. Parents will notify Chris Mesh immediately if their child has tested positive for Covid 19 or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid 19.

13. If you receive a letter from the school regarding Covid exposure, we ask that you forward that to your sport director.
14. If the concession stand is open, parents/players should stand 6' apart.
15. Only 3 people at a time in bathrooms. The line will start against the outside wall and parents/players should stand 6' apart while in line.
16. We request that you keep an eye on your children if you choose to use the playground. This is open, but is not monitored by anyone.
