Well, I don't really have much to say this time around for the mainsheet. I've just been sitting back enjoying one of the best times of the summer, Regatta Season. It's been fun to follow our youth sailors at all their regattas. They just finished X and Opti Inlands out in Clear Lake Iowa. We can all be so proud of their hard work and performance this year.

The only other thing I'd like to help promote is LBYC's first ever **blood drive** coming up on **August 12 from 11:00am to 4:00pm.**

Our ongoing blood shortage is a real problem which I recently personally experienced. Since starting my chemotherapy for my Acute Leukemia in March, I have required around 20 units of blood products. At times my red blood cells and platelets go so low that a transfusion of these blood products is the only way to survive. My last cycle of chemo decreased my platelets so much that my doctor wanted me to receive two units of platelets. I was at St. Lukes in Milwaukee which is one of the largest Hospitals in the state, they only had two units of platelets in the whole hospital so I only got one and went back the next day for the second. Blood donations are truly a life saving act of kindness and I hope that many of you will take the time to do it. You can sign up on line at the link provided in this mainsheet.

Kitchen Vision

When the existing oven/ ranges were purchased in 2019, LBYC was offered a "deal" on the South Bend appliances that were part of a mass purchase by the supplier. It was a price that could not be refused. One (1) oven would have given us less burners, two (2) ovens would give us two additional burners. The kitchen committee formed to review the purchase of the ovens selected the two oven option.

The pilot lights on these commercial ovens/ ranges have been a problem. Safety concerns have caused the height of the pilot lights to be throttled down to the barest of minimums, which have sometimes caused the pilots lights to blow out.

The storage shelf wainscot on the back of the oven has further caused problems when used for storing hot pads and the reach required across open flame to use them.

South Bend and others (Vulcan, American, Kitchenall) do make a commercial grade, pilotless ignition, 10 burner oven/range. 60" wide, similar stainless steel backsplash high shelf. Multiple options on cook top are available (griddles, etc). Ovens are 26" wide; is this adequate.

There is an energy savings with pilotless ignition, plus it will reduce the heat gain in the kitchen which is always warm and eliminate the safety hazard.

Our LBYC Kitchen manager, David Berg, has suggested that a year end survey of the Cookout/ Special Event committee chairs and Caterers would be beneficial to track their menus and determine what appliances are utilized and how they were utilized. Further, we should determine how the chairs formulated their menus and was the food brought in pre-cooked or prepared on site. To cater or not to cater, that is the question. As part of our data set, Dave has suggested that we should determine how often the burners on the stovetop are used.

How are the ovens used? To cook, to hold? Would a cook and hold piece of equipment be helpful?

How often is the grill used versus the ovens?

Are we still utilizing the nescos? Would a warming oven or cambros provide more efficiency? And more...

Hopefully, working with D.A. Berther, we could trade in the one or both of the existing (6) burner range/ ovens if the survey determines they are under-utilized. D. A. Berther was LBYC's original kitchen equipment consultant/ supplier and can supply any equipment required. They are located in West Allis.

Hot Kitchen

Preparing food for Regattas, Wednesday Nite Cookouts and other Special Events produces a lot of heat in the kitchen. The original design of ceiling registers and a ceiling transfer grille between the foyer and kitchen to cool the kitchen has proven to be ineffective for the amount of heat now produced for these events. The transfer grille is a gravity fed system designed to "pull", transfer air, from one space to another.

The size of the ductwork which distributes cool and warm air to the kitchen limits the amount of conditioned air that can be distributed from the ground mounted air handling units that heat and cool the space.

We have contacted Conditioned Air Design, Ltd. to provide supplemental cooled air to the kitchen via a mini-split system. This upgrade to the air provided the kitchen has been on the Prioritized Wish List for a number of years. It will be a surface wall mounted unit or a unit recessed in the ceiling space of the kitchen. We have asked Conditioned Air to update their proposal number that was originally included on the Wish List. Electrical power would need to be run above the ceiling space to the new unit.


