### Fun Facts:

- The Wildcats and Panthers have met seven times in the playoffs, including the 1989 classic, a 31-30 win for the Joe Pickens '90 led Wildcats over the Robert Smith led Panthers.
- The Wildcats have a 1-0 record at Euclid Community Stadium, a 21-6 win in 2018. The Cats have a 7-6-1 record when playing in Euclid.

## Wildcats Storylines ...

**LUCKY #30 and #360:** The Wildcats are making playoff appearance #30 in the program's prolific history. Chuck Kyle '69 has coached the Wildcats in all 30 postseason appearances. Kyle has a 73-18 all-time record in the playoffs, winning 11 state championships and 4 national championships during his previous 37 seasons. Kyle earned his 360th coaching win last Friday, tying him for 4th in OHSA history and placing him 36th in the U.S.

**NEXT MAN UP:** Every team deals with injury at postseason time, and the Wildcats are no different. Injuries have popped up this year at running back, wide receiver, linebacker and safety, opening the door for young players to make an impact for the Wildcats. Sophomore Max Palinski is a new addition to the depth chart this week at middle linebacker.

**PFAFF SHOW:** Late in the season, Joe Pfaff emerged as the starting quarterback for the Wildcats. In the playoff opener, Pfaff played quite well, completing 10-of-16 passes for 184 yards and 2 touchdown passes, also rushing for a score on a QB sneak. Pfaff has showcased smarts in the pocket as well as an ability to operate efficiently outside of it when pressured.

**MARTY'S MACK PACK:** Marty Lenehan leads the rushing attack for the Wildcats. The junior has toted the rock 68 times for 446 yards and 5 touchdowns, including three vs. Solon. Lenehan averages 6.6 yards per carry and 89.2 yards per game after a 171-yard effort against the Comets. Fellow junior Ryan Waldron will also figure into the mix, as he got 10 carries last game.

**THE BIG UGLIES:** With two seniors and three juniors forming the starting five on the offensive line, the Wildcats are beginning to gel at offensive line. The "big uglies" have allowed just seven sacks in five games.

**NEW FACES, SAME RESULTS:** Injuries have impacted the Wildcats this season at wideout, but the position group has stepped up big-time. Steven Bodamer caught two long passes for 82 yards and a touchdown vs. Solon, spurring the Saint Ignatius offense. Colin Wiehn, Jonathan McNeil, and Patrick Kotek all hauled in the first catches in their careers on Friday.

**ATTACKING THE EDGE:** The Saint Ignatius defense has done a good job at limiting opposing ground games this season, thanks in part to the team's outstanding linebacking core. Aidan Hubbard leads the team with 25 tackles, adding 4.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, 1 interception, and 1 fumble recovery. When the injury bug bit Nick Velotta and Aidan Conway, juniors Gavin Berger and Chris Aerni have stepped up. Aerni notched 5 tackles and 2 tackles for loss and Berger tabbed 3 tackles and 1 tackle for loss vs. Solon.

**ADJUSTMENTS IN THE SECONDARY:** With Emmett Hanna out due to injury, Griffin Taliak stepped into the starting free safety role vs. Solon and thrived. The junior notched a game-high 6.5 tackles, adding a tackle for loss and pass breakup. Andrew Chime (2 tackles) slid into Taliak's strong safety spot and performed well. Braeden Lair also returned after missing the regular season finale, and recorded 3 tackles. Cornerbacks Cole Smith and Chris Snyder are each playing quite well, too. Smith and Snyder have a combined 4 interceptions and 9 pass breakups.

**CAPTAINS:** The captains for the 2020 season are #37 Nick Velotta, #48 Aidan Conway, #66 Gus Salopek, and #86 Nick Lamirand.





# ABOUT EUCLID ...

## Learning about the Panthers ...

**BACK-TO-BACK:** Euclid had the challenge of facing the same opponent in Elyria in the closing week of the regular season of the playoffs and the opening game of the postseason. The Panthers won both games, 42-20, and 21-0. Elyria held the Panthers scoreless in the opening three quarters before Euclid roared to 21 points in the fourth.

**RUNNING INTO THE SAINTS:** For six straight seasons, Euclid has reached the playoffs, facing St. Edward or Saint Ignatius in the playoffs each time. The Panthers have an 0-5 record against the Eagles and Wildcats in the last 5 postseason meetings, including a 45-21 loss to Saint Ignatius in 2017.

**RALLINGS ROLLING:** The Euclid offense runs through quarterback Andre Rallings. The dual threat signalcaller can run as well as pass. Rallings finished off the scoring on Friday with a 1-yard TD run. You'll see him run the read option fairly often for the Panthers.

**FITAZ FRENZY:** Atiba Fitz is an excellent running back for the Panthers. Fitz models his game after Kareem Hunt as a speedster who can cut East-West before churning North-South. A two-way player, the future student at Air Force takes pride in his conditioning. Fitz is a player who can make you miss, even without blockers. He'll be a player to watch.

**OFFENSIVE WEAPONS:** The Panthers have plenty of weapons on offense outside of Fitz and Rallings. Jayvon Colvin is another talented running back who figures into the mix, notching 136 rushing yards, including a 75-yard run, vs. Elyria last week. He's been compared to Duke Johnson, the kind of back who can slip out of the backfield and catch passes. Claishon Ivory is a talented wideout who is heavily targeted when Euclid passes. Armond Scott, a Kentucky commit, is another Panther to watch as a speedy wideout. Saivon Jones scored twice vs. Elyria in the playoff rematch, a 17-yard scamper and a 1-yard plunge.

**FOUR MAN FRONT:** Euclid will typically run a 4-man front on defense, rolling out a 4-3 defense on most occasions. Euclid has a talented front seven.

**AGGRESSIVE D:** The Panthers love to blitz on defense. Euclid will break out Cover 0 blitzes, relying on the cornerbacks to play 1-on-1 coverage as the front seven attacks the quarterbacks. Euclid often plays its corners on an island, hoping to shut down opposing wideouts.

**DEFENDERS TO WATCH:** Euclid has lots of talent on defense. Most notably, Michael Gravely is a star corner who can shut down opposing receivers. He's headed to Michigan State next fall. Cam Smith is also a stud in the secondary. The senior picked off an Elyria pass to spark Euclid's late run last week. Ahjay Cody stands out in Euclid's front seven as a veteran, playmaking linebacker.

### WR COLIN WIEHN '21



Colin Wiehn entered Saint Ignace as a lefty quarterback, but has since transitioned into a wide receiver. His work in the offseason to make the switch has paid off, with Wiehn hauling in 2 catches for 35 yards vs. Solon. The 6'0, 165-pound receiver has filled in nicely with several wideouts out due to injury, and will be important again vs. Euclid as a reliable pass catcher.

### LB GAVIN BERGER '22



With injuries to Aidan Conway and Nick Vellotta, Gavin Berger has stepped up big-time for the Wildcats. The outside linebacker tallied 3 tackles and 1 tackle for loss against Solon. Berger is a roving playmaker who plays opposite Aidan Hubbard. Berger is equally adept as a run stopper or a pass rusher, using his 6'1, 200-pound frame to make plays for the Wildcats. He'll be vital to shutting down the Panthers.

In the last few years, the Euclid School District has updated and renovated a number of its facilities. A large part of the project was building a new football facility.

In early 2017, Euclid began construction on a new stadium. Construction continued quickly into the fall, and Euclid hosted its first game at the new stadium on November 3, 2017. Euclid defeated Massillon Jackson, 49-29, in the Regional Quarterfinal to open the new stadium.

Work on the stadium continued into 2018, with work done on bathrooms, concession areas, and a new scoreboard. The stadium was officially christened on Friday, August 24, 2018, as Euclid hosted the Glenville Tarblooders.

The stadium's horseshoe shape is a defining characteristic of the stadium. Another memorable trait of the stadium is the close proximity of the stands to the field, as the stadium does not have a surrounding track.

The Motz Group installed a two-tone green turf with a block E at midfield. The field features blue end zones, with EUCLID at the North end zone and PANTHERS in the South end zone.

On the home side, the facility has a state-of-the-art press box with two rows for media and staff. Other highlights include a video board and a large scoreboard.

At the old Sparky DiBiasio Stadium, the Wildcats had a 4-2 record. The Wildcats have played a total of 14 games in the city of Euclid, winning seven, losing six, and tying once (7-6-1).



# GAME PREVIEW

## WILDCATS AND PANTHERS SET FOR 7TH PLAYOFF MEETING

Familiar foes will once again meet in the postseason on Friday.

The Saint Ignatius Wildcats and Euclid Panthers will do battle in the Regional Quarterfinal, facing off in the playoffs for the seventh time, and the second time in four seasons.

The Wildcats enter with a 2-3 record and a renewed confidence after a 42-14 rout of Solon, a complete team win. The Panthers carry a 5-2 mark into the contest, fresh off back-to-back wins over Elyria.

All-time, the series advantage sits 14-1 in favor of Saint Ignatius, but make no mistake, this is a stout Euclid squad led by Jeff Rotsky.

### SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. EUCLID DEFENSE

The story of the playoff opener may have the juniors on the offense. Joe Pfaff enjoyed a breakout game, completing 10-of-16 passes for 184 yards and 2 touchdowns, and adding a rushing score. Marty Lenehan broke the century mark for the second straight week, with 171 yards on 19 carries and 3 impressive TDs. And of course, Steven Bodamer broke out for 2 catches for 82 yards, both on long balls, including a 48-yard TD in the first quarter.

Injuries have affected but not haunted the Wildcats so far. John Becker, Colin Wiehn, and Jonathan McNeil all stepped up at wideout this past week, tallying clutch catches.

And of course, the offensive line has been stout. Ashton Montgomery, Brian Keane, and William Witalis have all improved over the course of the year, learning from seniors Gus Salopek and Carter Zimmerman.

For the Wildcats to continue along in the playoffs, the juniors will need to continue excelling under the auspices of key senior leaders such as Salopek and tight end Nick Lamirand.

Euclid will confront the Cats with an aggressive defense. The Panthers play a 4-3 base defense that relies on blitzing to pressure the quarterback and attack the ground game.

Reliable man coverage on the outside allows Euclid to succeed with this philosophy. Michael Gravely is a huge reason for Euclid's success, as the Michigan State commit is a speedster who can shut down the wideout on his side of the field. Cam Smith is another stud in the secondary. Smith picked off an Elyria pass to spark the Panthers' fourth-quarter run. Look for Euclid to use bump-and-run coverage so they can bring more defenders into the box to stop the run.

Up front, Ahjay Cody is a large reason for Euclid's success in stopping the run. The veteran linebacker is quick to the ball and an athletic defender. Overall, Euclid's linebackers are disciplined and savvy defenders who know what they're doing.

### SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. EUCLID OFFENSE

Just like on offense, injuries have led to significant changes on the depth chart. Plenty of youngsters are seeing playing time earlier than expected.

That's most evident at linebacker, with Nick Velotta and Aidan Conway both sidelined. Thankfully, the junior linebackers have played quite well. Chris Aerni and Gavin Berger both excelled vs. Solon, combining for 8 tackles and 3 tackles for loss. Aidan Hubbard has helped to bring the two juniors along well, while emerging as one of the team's top playmakers. Hubbard tops the team with 25 tackles, adding 4.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, an interception, and a fumble recovery. You'd expect nothing less from the Northwestern commit.

With Emmett Hanna sidelined at free safety, Griffin Taliak stepped up in a major way against Solon. Taliak finished as the game's leading tackler, contributing 6.5 tackles, along with 1 tackle for loss and 1 pass breakup. The junior has outstanding potential to be a playmaking ballhawk for the blue and gold. Fellow junior Braeden Lair and Andrew Chime have been outstanding at strong safety, while Chris Snyder and Cole Smith are dynamite cornerbacks.

The defensive line has been stellar as always, too, led by senior Bennett Adler.

Euclid's offense tends to be run-heavy, with backs who can ground and pound you.

Atiba Fitz is a stud for Euclid. The 5'9, 165-pound back models his game after Kareem Hunt, a quick cutter who can pound the rock North-South when need be. The future Air Force student is a back to watch. Also keep an eye on Jayvon Colvin, a change-of-pace back who can slip away from you. Colvin rushed for 136 yards last week, including a 75-yard dash. And the dark horse may be Saivon Jones, who scored twice vs. Elyria this past week, on a 17-yard scamper and a 1-yard dive.

Claishon Ivory and Kentucky commit Armond Scott are the top two targets when Euclid passes. Both are quite excellent wideouts.

Andre Rallings is the leader on offense at quarterback. The 5'10, 160-pound signalcaller is a dual-threat, adept at running and passing. Rallings will run plenty of read options with Fitz and his running backs.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

Special teams almost always has an impact in playoff games. The Wildcats will take field position seriously and won't be afraid to trot out Declan Mangan for a punt or field goal. The return units have also played well, as has Sean Cook, who recovered a punt that bounced off a Comet last week. Plays like that will be key on Friday.

EUCLID – The Saint Ignatius defense roared in a near-shutout performance as Jahadge “Bo” Floyd and Jack Welcsh powered through the Euclid defense. Connor Cmiel caught two touchdown passes from quarterback Patrick Delahunty. The Wildcats’ special teams scored six points. It was a complete team win.

The win by the Wildcats kept the team from starting off 0-3 for the first time since 1966. The Wildcats had the first opportunity to score with five minutes left in the first quarter, but missed a 50-yard field goal. Euclid’s offense started to gain yards. Dion Valentine completed a 22-yard pass and scampered for yardage on a scramble. Brandon Wright picked up a first down on a run. The drive stalled with 39 seconds left in the first quarter. Linebacker Caden Campolieti jumped in front of a Euclid screen pass to end the drive.

On a third and short, Floyd rumbled for 43 yards, to the Euclid 8-yard line. A Wildcats’ fumble on the next play halted the drive. After the turnover, Valentine threw to Dre’Von Lindsay for 24 yards. Tommy Eichenberg, Danny Scelza, and the Wildcats’ defense stiffened, ending the drive. After a Euclid punt, Floyd ran for 34 yards with 8:30 left in the second. On 3rd down from the Euclid 17-yard line, Delahunty passed Cmiel for a 17-yard touchdown. Rory McConville’s extra point sailed through the uprights, giving the Wildcats a 7-0 lead.

The Wildcats started with the ball in the second half. A Euclid squib kick forced Saint Ignatius to start at its own 5-yard line, but Welcsh gave the Cats good field position with a 40-yard run up the middle. Two plays later, the Wildcats scored. Cmiel caught Delahunty’s pass for a 53-yard touchdown, his second of the day. McConville converted the extra point for the 14-0 lead with 10:19 left in the third, capping a 4-play, 95-yard drive.

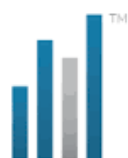
