TODAY'S GAME

The U.S., winners of Group B, meets Slovakia, fourth-place in Group A, here today in the quarterfinals. Team USA will be the home team and will wear its blue jerseys for the third time.

THE SERIES VS. SLOVAKIA

The U.S. owns a 4-2-1-4-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) record in 12 tournament meetings against Slovakia. In 2019, the two teams opened tournament play in Kosice, Slovakia, where the host nation skated to a 4-1 victory. Today marks just the second-ever quarterfinal meeting between the U.S. and Slovakia. On May 11, 2000, Slovakia defeated the U.S. by a 4-1 and went on to reach the gold-medal game where they fell to the Czech Republic, 5-3.

10TH-STRAIGHT QUARTERFINAL APPEARANCE

This is the 10th straight Men's World Championship the U.S. has advanced to the quarterfinal round. All-time, Team USA is 6-3-3-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L) in 23 appearances and has won three of its last five quarterfinal berths (2-1-0-2). Quarterfinal games have been played in the tournament since 1992 with the exception of 1997, 1998 and 1999. Of the 23 years quarterfinals have been played, the U.S. has qualified all but twice.

Team USA's eight goals allowed is the fewest by a U.S. entry in group play since the tournament format change in 2012 ... With Team USA's win over Italy (4-2), the U.S. is now 9-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) on the second night of back-to-backs and 15-2-0-4 (W-OTW-OTL-L) overall in back-to-back situations since 2016 ... On June 1, it was announced that captain Justin Abdelkader will miss the remainder of the tournament due to a lower-body injury and Brian Boyle will serve as captain moving forward ... The U.S. record in Latvia has been similar to the gold medal-winning U.S. National Junior Team this past year. More on page 2 ... U.S. defenseman Matt Tennyson and Slovakian forward Marian Studenic skated this season together with the New Jersey Devils while Slovakian goaltender knows both U.S. forwards Tage Thompson (through Univ. of Connecticut) and Colin Blackwell (through Hartford Wolf Pack) ... Slovakia's head coach, Craig Ramsey, was both an assistant and interim head coach (Florida Panthers 1992-95; Philadelphia Flyers (1998-2000) for teams that featured goaltender John Vanbiesbrouck, who's here with the U.S. Men's National Team in Riga, Latvia.

2021 U.S. Men's National Team Game Notes

Quarterfinal vs. Slovakia • Thursday, June 3, 2021

ABDELKADER OUT: BOYLE TABBED CAPTAIN

On June 1, USA Hockey announced that U.S. captain and forward Justin Abdelkader (Muskegon, Mich.) will miss the remainder of the 2021 IIHF Men's World Championship due to a lower-body injury sustained during the second period of Team USA's 2-0 win over Germany. He is expected to remain with Team USA here in Riga, Latvia, and in Team USA's win over Italy was able to stand behind the bench with the coaching staff.

In addition, forward **Brian Boyle** (Hingham, Mass.) has been tabbed captain of Team USA for the remainder of the tournament alongside alternate captains **Matt Roy** (Detroit, Mich.) and **Colin Blackwell** (North Andover, Mass.). A veteran of 13 NHL seasons with the Florida Panthers, LA Kings, Nashville Predators, New Jersey Devils, New York Rangers and Toronto Maple Leafs, Boyle was named the 2017-18 Bill Masterton Trophy award winner as the player who best exemplifies the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey. During training camp that season, he was diagnosed with chronic myeloid leukemia, a type of bone marrow cancer. He made his season debut Nov. 1 and scored 10 goals in his first 25 games, including one on Hockey Fights Cancer Night.

RECAPPING GROUP B PLAY

The current tournament format, with seven games in the preliminary round, began in 2012. In the nine tournaments since, the U.S. has finished second or better in group play five times (1st - 2015, 2017, 2021; 2nd - 2012, 2014, 2018).

Following its tournament-opening 2-1 defeat to Finland, the U.S. claimed six-straight regulation wins. It is the third time ever the U.S. has won six-straight in a Men's World Championship (1990, 2017). With overtimes and shootouts, the U.S. also won six preliminary-round games in 2015 and 2018. The most wins a U.S. team has ever earned in a single IIHF Men's World Championship is eight, when the U.S. squads did so in 2015 (7 regulation, 1 OT) and 2018 (6 regulation, 2 OT).

TEAM USA'S EIGHT GOALS IS FEWEST ALLOWED SINCE 2010

Team USA enters today having surrendered a tournament-best eight goals in preliminary-round play. The eight goals allowed in group play is the fewest a U.S. team has allowed in group play since the current format was established in 2012. Prior to this year, the fewest goals allowed by a U.S. team in the current tournament format was 14 (2015, 2017).

In 2010, the Ù.S. finished group play - just three games - with just seven goals allowed. However, due to three-straight one-goal losses, the U.S. played in and won the Relegation Round to finish 13th overall and just 10 total goals surrendered.

TIES TO GOLD MEDAL-WINNING 2021 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM

There are some growing similarities between the 2021 U.S. Men's National Team and the 2021 U.S. National Junior Team that captured a gold medal this past January.

Like the U.S. Men's National Team, the U.S. National Junior Team lost its tournament-opening game (3-5, RUS), won its remaining preliminary-round games, finished first in its group, and met Slovakia in the guarterfinal (W, 5-2).

Seven individuals here with Team USA that were part of the gold medal-winning U.S. squad include: **Matty Beniers** (forward), **Nate Leaman** (head coach), **Scott Aldrich** (equipment manager), **Jason Hodges** (athletic trainer), **Kyle Huson** (digital content), **Stan Wong** (athletic trainer) and **John Vanbiesbrouck** (management). One other connection between the two teams is **Ryan Donato**, whose father, **Ted Donato** (head coach, Harvard), was an assistant coach on Leaman's staff for the gold medal-winning team.

FANS RETURN

June 1 marked the first tournament gameday with fans in the building as Arena Riga (2,660) and Olympic Sports Center (1,058) will be able to have limited fans.

TEAM USA IN RECENT BACK-TO-BACKS AT MEN'S WORLDS

With Team USA's wins over Germany (2-0) and Italy (4-2), the U.S. is now 9-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) on the second night of back-to-backs and 15-2-0-4 (W-OTW-OTL-L) overall in back-to-back situations since the 2016 IIHF Men's World Championship. ROSTER'S NHL EXPERIENCE

In terms of NHL experience, the 27-player U.S. roster has a total 3,672 of NHL games. Of those games, **Brian Boyle** (805 GP) and Abdelkader (739 GP) account for 1,544 of those games. The next most experienced NHLer is **Kevin Labanc** (339 GP), followed by **Chris Wideman** (181 GP) and **Ryan Donato** (180 GP). Five players have yet to make their NHL debuts while another 10 have played in 90 or fewer NHL games. Full breakdown on page 2.

ROSTER'S 'BLUE COLLAR' MENTALITY

Over the last few years, the U.S. roster has featured NHL All-Stars, first overall NHL Draft picks and Stanley Cup champions. While this year's roster has one Stanley Cup champion in **Justin Abdelkader**, its primarily built on late-round or undrafted players. Team USA's roster features just 3 first-round selections, followed by 7 second-rounders, 1 third-rounder, 3 fourth-rounders, 2 fifth-rounders, 2 sixth-rounders, 3 seventh-rounders and 5 undrafted players. In addition, one player has yet to be drafted, but is expected to be a first-round selection in this year's NHL Draft. With more than half of the roster (15) consisting of players taken in the fourth round or later (or undrafted), the team's character is driven by a blue-collar, earn it mentality.

"This team's ability to pick things up, implement system details, adjust to the opponent, all of it has been phenomenal, and that's a credit to the character within the room," head coach **Jack Capuano** said earlier this tournament. "Most NHL teams have a handful of guys who are late-rounders or undrafted guys who've had to earn their stripes, earn their spots. You walk into our room and our whole room is guys like that. Now add being able to wear the USA crest, a lot of them for the first time. It's a special group to be a part of, and as a staff we're very honored to be leading them in this year's world championship."

FROM PAST GAME NOTES (THROUGH JUNE 1)

On May 31, the U.S. took its team photo in their white jerseys ... Cal Petersen and Jake Oettinger have combined to give Team USA the tournament's best save percentage (95.05%), goals-againstaverage (1.15) and fewest goals allowed (8). Coincidentally, both Petersen and Oettinger wore letters in their final collegiate seasons. as Petersen captained Notre Dame while Oettinger served as an alternate captain for Boston University ... U.S. forward Jason **Robertson's** first goal in an IIHF World Junior Championship and IIHF Men's World Championship both coincidentally came against Finland. Even more ironic, both were breakaway goals scored through the five-hole ... In addition to coaches Jack Capuano, Nate Leaman and Adam Nightingale, Team USA's staff on the bench include athletic trainers Stan Wong (USA Hockey) and Piet VanZant (Detroit Red Wings) and equipment managers Dana Bryson (LA Kings) and Jamie Healy (Columbus Blue Jackets). Off the bench are athletic trainer/compliance officer Jason Hodges (USA Hockey's NTDP), equipment/team leader Scott Aldrich (USA Hockey), massage therapist PeeWee Willman (USA Hockey) and team physician Dr. Doug Weiss (USA Hockey) ... Piet VanZant is in his 14th season with the Detroit Red Wings, Jamie Healy has been with Columbus since the club's inaugural 2000-01 season ... Dana Bryson, who's been with the LA Kings since the 2005-06 season, recently worked his 1,500th NHL game earlier this season ... Stan Wong, one of Team USA's two athletic trainers and a beloved figure of players and staff alike, is working his 46th international event for a U.S. hockey team. A 2010 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team silver medalist and the only U.S. staff member to serve on all five gold medal-winning (2003, 2010, 2013, 2017, 2021) U.S. National Junior Teams, this is the 14th IIHF Men's World Championship he's worked ... The U.S. support staff features several members associated with USA Hockey on a recurring basis, including Scott Aldrich, Jason Hodges, team physician Dr. Doug Weiss, and PeeWee Willman ... Jason Robertson and Sasha Chmelevski are international teammates for the second time (2019 IIHF World Junior Championship; silver) after once playing together on youth hockey teams in both California and Michigan ... From Scituate, Mass., U.S. forwards Conor Garland and Ryan Donato once skated together before now doing so here again in Riga.

FROM PAST GAME NOTES (THROUGH MAY 25)

Brian Boyle (36) and Matty Beniers (18), the oldest and youngest players on Team USA, both hail from Hingham, Mass., and scored in the 4-2 over Latvia ... The U.S. has 12 sets of former/current club teammates who have reunited here in Latvia with Team USA, including three with Columbus Blue Jackets (3), University of Connecticut (2), Detroit Red Wings (3), Harvard (3), LA Kings (6), N.Y. Rangers (3), Ottawa Senators (3), San Jose Sharks (3), Tucson Roadrunners (2), Youth hockey (Mass.) (2), Youth hockey (Calif./ Mich.) (2) ... Defenseman **Chris Wideman** and forward **Sasha** Chmelevski coincidentally use the exact same stick blade ... On May 24, Team USA took an IIHF-approved excursion to Jurmala Dune (White Dune). Having the space to themselves, the team took part in spike ball, throwing football around, and enjoying the sunshine ... Kevin Rooney celebrated his 28th birthday on May 21 here in Riga ... In a team meeting on May 21, head coach Jack Capuano announced that Justin Abdelkader (Muskegon, Mich.) will captain Team USA while Matt Roy and Colin Blackwell (North Andover, Mass.) will serve as alternate captains ... Team USA has a 27-player roster (14 forwards, nine defenseman, four goaltenders) ... Players on this year's team have accounted for 18 total medals in world championship play, including seven gold medals ... The roster has an average age of 26, making it the oldest U.S. entry in an IIHF Men's World Championship since 2004 and 2005, when Team USA's average age was 27.6 and 28.1, respectively ... At 18 years, 6 months, of age, Matty Beniers is the fourth-youngest player to dress for the U.S. in an IIHF Men's World Championship ... Team USA's journey to Riga, Latvia started on May 15 when players and staff convened in Newark, N.J., before boarding a charter the following day wtih Team Canada, among other players ... Over the last five world championships, the U.S. has registered a 27-5-1-13 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record while earning four top-five finishes (2019-7th, **2018-bronze**, 2017-fifth, 2016-4th. 2015-bronze). Team USA's eight wins in 2018 tied for the best-ever by a U.S. team in a single world championship while the team's 12-2-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record between the 2017 and 2018 events was its best-ever stretch in tournament history ... Team USA's host here in Latvia, Georgijs Pujacs, is a three-time Olympian who skated for the Latvian National Ice Hockey Team in the 2006, 2010 and 2014 Olympic Winter Games.
