



Memorable Games in SHS Baseball History

Season scorebooks saved from:
1956-1962, 1967-1971, 1973-1977, 1979-1987, 1989-Present

Home games were played at Riverside Park from 1937 through 1983
and at Tahpah Park/Joe Schleper Baseball Stadium from 1984 to present.

1937: Shakopee High School played its first season of baseball. **E.J. McDonald** was the head coach. The namesake of SHS's baseball field **Warren Stemmer** was a freshman on the team. **Paul Rosen, John Kline, Lawrence Hamilton, Harold Huss, and Ralph Lebens** were also on the first squad. Games were played against Montgomery, Chaska, Jordan, and Bloomington; Shakopee did not join a conference until 1941.

1943: The first baseball conference championship was recorded. The 1943 team went undefeated; they were also the District 18 Champs (there was no state high school baseball tournament at that time).

June 27, 1951: The 1951 team took its unblemished 10-0 record into the school's first ever baseball state tournament game at Owatonna but lost 2-1 to Austin. On June 28, S.H.S. was ousted from the tournament by St. Paul Washington 6-5 in 13 innings, finishing the season 10-2.

May 8, 1956: Shortstop **Chuck Kreuser** went 4 for 4 including a triple and walk with 4 runs scored in an 18-9 victory over Watertown.

May 15, 1956: S.H.S. pitcher **Lowell Stark** threw a three-hitter and struck out 15 Eden Prairie batters in a 13-1 Shakopee victory.

May 22, 1957: Shakopee trounced Eden Prairie 18-0 behind a two-hit pitching performance by freshman **George Lill**. **Lill** struck out 10 in the gem. Left fielder **Mike Williamson** and **Lill** led the offense. Both players went 3 for 4. **Williamson** scored 4 runs and belted 3 RBI's with 2 doubles and a triple. **Lill** scored 3 runs and had 4 RBI's while swiping 3 bases.

May 18, 1958: S.H.S. recorded the biggest margin of victory in school history with a 32-0 thumping of Eden Prairie. Shakopee recorded 21 hits in the contest; Eden Prairie committed 15 errors (ouch)! Sophomore **George Lill** threw a one-hitter in the game for Shakopee, striking out nine. **Lill** also went 3 for 4 with 3 runs scored and 7 RBI's. **Ron Lebens** scored 4 runs, and **Larry Ricklick** was 3 for 4 with 3 runs scored. Catcher **Don Hamilton** was 3 for 4 with 4 runs scored, and captain **Bob Ayd** went 4 for 6 with 4 runs and 4 RBI's.

Co-captains **Tim Theis** and **Chris Nelsen** had 2 hits apiece. **Nelsen** homered and doubled – scoring 2 and driving in 2. **Theis** drove in 3 and scored 1 run. **Scott Theis** homered, doubled, scored 2 runs, and drove in 2 runs. **Brett Bahr** smacked 2 doubles and scored 2 runs. **Luke Groff** homered, scored 2 runs and drove in 2 runs. **Josh Gregor** had 2 hits and scored 2 runs, and **D.J. Busch** scored 3 runs.

May 18, 2001: Shakopee dropped Prior Lake 12-2 in five innings. Pitcher **Chris Nelsen** launched a first-inning grand slam and finished with 2 hits, 3 runs, and 4 RBI's. **Scott Theis** collected 3 hits, 3 runs, and 2 RBI's. Catcher **Sam Pond** was 2 for 2 with 3 RBI's.

Senior tri-captain **Kyle Green** threw six masterful innings to senior tri-captain **Kenny Dellwo** to gain the victory on the mound.

Sophomore **Jacob Rhinesmith** and junior **Austen Leadstrom** each belted out 4 hits & **Dominick Schleper** and **Miks** had 3 hits each.

Sophomore pinch-hitter **Tyler Sloss** worked out a walk to leadoff the Sabers 8th inning and advanced on **Jacob Rhinesmith's** second hit of the game. April 9, 2014: Shakopee opened the season with a 1-0 victory at Stemmer Field over New Prague. **Sheldon Miks** out-dueled Daniel Feneis by facing just 23 batters in the 2-hit shutout. Senior **Justin Winterfeldt** went 3-3 on the day with 2 homeruns over the green monster in leftfield, finishing with 5 RBI's and 3 runs scored. As the uncertainty of the Coronavirus pandemic continued, the spring season for all athletes was officially canceled at the end of April. The 13 seniors of 2020: **Tommy Bazzarre, Alex Ege, Connor Masloski, Jack Schleper, Wilson Mack, Zach Schultz, Owen Seppanen, Gavin Stadler, Eli Temp, Jackson Toenges, Jaymeson Ungar, Thomas Wilkie, and Zach Winterfeldt** were not able to play their senior baseball season at SHS. We dedicate our future seasons to them.

April 22, 2021: Shakopee rocked Apple Valley 22-5 w/10 different players collecting hits and RBI's, plus 11 scoring runs. The Sabers knocked out 22 hits and stole 11 bases in the 6-inning contest. Junior **Vinny Schleper** tied the school record of 5 hits in a game going 5-5 with 2 doubles, 2 RBI's, and 2 runs. Leadoff hitter **John Sullivan** collected 3 hits and scored 4 runs. After intentional walks to **Ryan Vosper** and **Alex Duncan**, **Jaden Case** "drove in" the winning run with a HBP. **Roder** and **Duncan** each had 3 hits in the game, and **John Sullivan** was the winning pitcher tossing 4 innings of relief.

May 30, 2022: The Sabers opened Section play at home vs rival Prior Lake on Memorial Day in front of 500+ fans at The Joe. Down 3-0 after 4 innings, the Sabers rallied for 2 runs in the 6th and 7th to walk off the Lakers. **Connor McGee** and **Jaden Case** led off the 6th inning with singles. **Caden Lang** and **Tanner Ho** each had groundouts in the inning that produced runs. In the 7th inning, **John Sullivan** led off with a single. **Joe Roder** was HBP. Both **Sullivan** and **Roder** advanced on a passed ball. **Ryan Vosper** singled home **Sullivan**. **Alex Duncan** walked. With the bases loaded and one out, **Jaden Case** delivered a deep fly to left-center for the walk-off win.

June 1, 2022: #4 Shakopee upset #1 Chaska on the road with a 2-1 victory. **John Sullivan** made an amazing, diving catch in right-center in the first inning to limit Chaska to their 1 run. From that point on, starting pitcher **Vinny Schleper** retired 20 straight Chaska batters to seal the victory. The Sabers manufactured a run to tie the game in the 3rd inning when **Ashton Pauly** walked with 2 outs, stole second base, and advanced to 3rd and scored on the same wild pitch. **Cade McGraw** plated the winning run in the 5th inning with a 2-out triple to right-center that scored **Jaden Case** who had reached on a walk earlier in the inning. **Schleper** allowed just 2 hits and 3 baserunners in the game while striking out 4.

June 7, 2022: The Sabers recorded their 3rd victory of the season vs. rival Prior Lake, knocking them out of Section 2AAAAA play while advancing to the finals in a 12-9 slugfest. **Joe Roder** went 4-4 in the game with 4 runs scored. **Alex Duncan** added 2 hits and 3 RBI's. **Caden Lang** smashed a bases-clearing double down the RF line in the Sabers 6-run 5th inning, and **Jackson Ungar** walked, scored, and delivered a huge 2-run double in the bottom of the 6th.

June 8, 2022: Senior **Vinny Schleper** pitched his second straight complete game of Sections in an 8-3 win at Chanhassen to advance the Sabers into the Section Championship game (lost 2-0 the following night). **Joe Roder** continued his hot hitting, going 4-4 once again with 2 runs and setting the school record with 10 consecutive hits. **John Sullivan** added 3 hits and 2 runs, and **Alex Duncan** had a double and 2 runs scored.

April 13, 2023: For the second straight year, the Sabers opened the season with a 10-0, 5-inning no hitter. This time the victim was Waconia with junior pitcher **Jack Morris** getting the win hurling 3 innings and recording 6 K's. Senior lefty **Jaden Case** tossed 2 innings, striking out 2. Senior 2b **Tanner Ho** went 3-3 with 4 runs, 2 doubles, and 2 RBI's. Senior LF **Alex Duncan** had 2 hits, including an opposite-field home run and 3 RBI's.

May 6, 2023: The Sabers traveled for a Saturday night non-conference matchup in New Prague and defeated the eventual 2023 5A state champs by a score of 14-3 in 6 innings. **Tanner Ho, Alex Duncan, Connor McGee,** and **Jaden Case** had 2 hits apiece. **McGee** scored 3 runs while **Ryan Vosper** and **Ben Turcotte** tallied 2 RBI's each. **Wynn Strait, Duncan,** and **Case** each scored twice. **Jack Morris** was the winning pitcher and **Dylan Stuwe** threw a clean 6th inning.

May 31, 2023: Senior **Jaden Case** led Shakopee to a 3-0 playoff victory over Bloomington Jefferson in a rare noon start weekday game at The Joe. Case faced just 24 batters, while fanning 14. **Tanner Ho** led off the game with a single, stole 2nd, and scored on a **Ryan Vosper** double. **Connor McGee** and **Jaden Case** both walked to leadoff the 4th followed by a Sac bunt by **Jack Morris** which led to a 2-run single by catcher **Charlie Toenges**.

Memorable Games in Shakopee High School Baseball History- Con't

April 25, 2024 and May 15, 2024: The game started at Target Field between the Sabers and Prior Lake. It was an amazing opportunity for our entire program. The game started as a pitchers duel as we scratched for 2 runs without a hit. The first run came on a safety squeeze. The second run was scored on a well executed 1st and 3rd steal. PL came back in the bottom of the 7th to score 2 and tie it up. We played the 8th inning and then the game was suspended due to the time limit at Target Field. The game was set to resume at 6pm on May 15th in Shakopee. **Nick Johnson** pitched 5 shutout innings.

**** Continuation of the suspended game vs PL.** The game started up in the top of the 9th with a 2-2 score. This game went scoreless until the top of the 18th inning! The Sabers scored eight runs in the inning, which helped them defeat Prior Lake 10-2. **Nick Johnson** doubled, scoring two runs with 2 RBI's, **Keegan Hutson** doubled, scoring two runs, and **Aidan Rau** doubled, scoring three runs, and had 3 RBI's. **Connor McGee** had 3 hits with one run scored. **Landon Heller** threw 6.1 innings of scoreless ball and **Charlie Toenges** picked up the win going that last 4.2 innings.

May 3, 2024: **Ryan Vosper** drove in five runs on three hits to lead the Sabers past Lakeville North 13-2 on Friday. Vosper singled in the second scoring two, singled in the fifth scoring two, and doubled in the fourth scoring one. The Sabers scored eight runs in the fifth inning on the way to victory. **Kaden Olson** singled, scoring one run, **Nick Johnson** scored after tagging up, Teddy Juare induced **Logan Krosch** to hit into a fielder's choice, but one run scored, Vosper singled, scoring two runs, **Connor McGee** singled, scoring one run, and Johnson doubled, scoring two runs. Tanner Heller earned the win for the Sabers. He gave up three hits and two runs over five innings, striking out three and walking two. The boys amassed 13 hits in the game. Vosper and Johnson each collected three hits each. Olson and **Ryder Peace** each collected multiple hits.

May 8, 2024: Sabers ousted #2 ranked Farmington 6-2. Shakopee got on the board in the bottom of the first inning after **Logan Krosch** tripled, and Krosch scored after tagging up a sac fly. An error extended the Sabers lead to 4-0 in the bottom of the second inning. **Nick Johnson** earned the win. April 10, 2025: We hosted Lakeville North in our second game of the season. We were getting no hit into the bottom of the 6th inning. **Ryder Peace** then steps in and hits a 2-run homerun to put us in front 2-1. We hung on to win the game with a huge hit!

April 16, 2025: Sabers defeat Burnsville by a score of 8-0. Pitchers **Nick Johnson** and **Tanner Heller** combined to throw a no-hitter. Johnson went 5 innings while striking out 8 and 0 walks. Heller threw 2 innings and struck out 3. The catcher for this game was **Keegan Hutson**.

May 15, 2025: We hosted Farmington for the final game of the regular season. We ended up losing the game 8-6 despite outhitting them and it wasnt for a lack of power. The team finished with 4 home runs on the night. **Carson Schroeder** smacked 2, **Kyser Boran** and **Ryder Peace** each had one.

May 19, 2025: Shakopee Sabers move up to #1 in the state rankings with a record of 16-3 and then finish the season 18-5 overall.

Shakopee High School's Warren Stemmer Baseball Field Dedicated June 5, 2008



Warren Stemmer was born in Shakopee on August 3, 1922. He played on the first-ever baseball team at Shakopee HS in 1937 and graduated from SHS in 1940. In the summer of 1940, Warren played CF for the Shakopee Indians town team that won the state championship. He was drafted by the Boston Red Sox and played 2 years professionally for the Eau Claire Braves in the Northern League. He served his country in the US Army during World War II.

After a brief stint with his family's business, Warren attended the University of St. Thomas and then taught social studies at Belle Plaine High School from 1952-1953. He spent the rest of his teaching career in Burnsville and was also their varsity baseball coach.

Warren raised his family in Shakopee while playing for the Shakopee Indians town team for several more years, coached throughout the Shakopee youth baseball program, and was one of SHS baseball's biggest fans until the time of his death on October 14, 2005.

Warren was known to be one of the best baseball players to ever play for Shakopee; however, he was equally known for his class and sportsmanship. In 2000, the Shakopee High School baseball team created the Warren Stemmer Class Act Award, which is given each season to the player who best embodies fair play, sportsmanship, and dedication to teammates and the game.

May all involved with games played here at Warren Stemmer Field follow his example of respecting the game, while representing themselves and their community with class!
