# 2.1 WHATSAPP COMMUNICATION TOOL



# 3 AGE GROUPS & LTAD STAGES

### 3.1 Provincial Age Category Rule

No out-of-category racing will be allowed by BC Alpine. Athletes may only enter races that are classified for their age category according to their YOB. Year of birth used to classify is the start of season year. All racing out of province below FIS needs written approval from BC Alpine.

IE: 2023/24 season uses 2023-YOB=Age for season.

Kinder Racing outside the athletes registered zone, province and country needs approval from the PSO. All entries must be approved by the PSO 2 weeks prior to the first team captain's meeting.

### 3.2 Snow Stars Development Model

Snow Stars should be used as your skill development model. The goal of our entry level programs should be to progress the kids from level 1 through 5. Levels achieved should be awarded and celebrated.

### 4.1 U10 BC ALPINE TECHNICAL RULES

#### 4.1.1 U10 Race Format

U10 and younger will have girls and boys race together inside their age categories.

## 4.1.2 U10 Recognition

One set of participation awards given to all competitors.

# 4.2 U12 BC ALPINE TECHNICAL RULES

### 4.2.1 U12 Equipment Rules

- FIS Helmets are recommended (not mandatory) for U12.
  - Hard ear requirements for Teck events
  - Soft ears are ok for NGSL events
- Speed Suits:
  - o are not allowed when attending Sporting Life series NGSL events.
  - o are allowed when attending Teck series zone events.

### 4.2.2 U12 Course Setting

- For Zone Races, Course Setters must have minimum EL LEVEL ADVANCED or higher. Mentor Must be used appointed by the ROC if the setter doesn't have the minimum setting requirements). Sets should be "fair but simple". Chosen setters should be decided 2 weeks prior to the event by the zones PDs and sent to the ROC by the host PD.
- Ref's must have Officials Level 2 or CSC rules and regulations for coaches.

PSL	Max 100 M	Courses should be set with safety as top priority. Try and use runs that have a consistent vertical fall line.  The Courses should be min 6 meters apart (8-10 is best) by the 4 <sup>th</sup> gate. Spread the courses evenly over the first few gates. Use measuring devices to ensure consistency. Distance from turning pole to turning pole 11-13m. No need for delays in PSL.

## 4.2.3 U12 Course Inspection

Ski through inspection but stopping is allowed. Coaches are encouraged to keep the teams moving to avoid clogging. Limited stopping during the inspection runs. ROC's can stagger team starts to if necessary.

#### 4.2.4 U12 Draws and Results

U12 Snow Stars race and are awarded within their gender.

#### 4.2.4.1 U12 Race Format

#### U12 races are always 1 run races.

Recommended format for U12 races is hosting a 1 run stubbie course and a 1 run paneled GS gate slalom. ROC may choose to run paneled vs stubbie in either order. Coaches are encouraged to introduce blocking slalom in training environments.

#### 4.2.4.2 U12 Draw Format

Draws can be computer generated.

First one run race is random start order. Second one run race is the first run start order reversed. For one-run races, the second one-run race should use the reversed first race start list for its start list.

Recommended format for two day, two run races for is to do only one draw and use that single draw for all four start lists in the following format: (where X is the total # of racers)

#### 4.2.4.3 U12 Awards

- There will be no "Most Improved" awarded in U12.
- Awards should be presented to the top 10 per gender.
- Team results at events are encouraged when possible.

#### 6.2.1.1 Chin Guards

Chin Guards are mandatory in Slalom from U14-FIS in BC.

#### 6.2.1.2 U14 Back Protection

U14s are encouraged to use back protection for SG, GS, and SX.

# 6.2.1.3 U14 Super-G Skis

U14's Super G skis should be slightly longer and higher radius than their current GS ski. (GS Skis can be used).

#### 6.2.2 U14 Course Setting

Discipline	Vertical	Set
SL	Max. 160m Min. 100m	Open distances of 7-11 (Recommended 9m) 2-4 hairpins combinations; 1-2 flushes of maximum 3 gates; 1 Delay of 12-15m max. Flex-poles must be light poles (25-28.9 mm).
GS	Max. 350m Min 200m	*The course should have no special technical difficulties.  Open distances 15-27m; (Recommended 19-22 m). Delay min 10m between successive gates and max 27m from turning pole to turning pole; Max 3 delays; Variety of terrain suggested.
SG	Max. 450m Min 250m	25m minimum distance from turning pole to turning pole; 40m maximum distance from turning pole to turning pole;
PSL	Max 100M	Courses should be set with safety as top priority. Try and use runs that have a consistent vertical fall line.  The Courses should be min 6 meters apart by the 3 <sup>rd</sup> gate. Spread the courses evenly and over the first few gates. Use measuring devices to ensure consistency. Distance from turning pole to turning pole 11m – Max 13m. No need for delays in PSL. Discourage the double block technique.

### 6.2.2.1 U14 Course Setting and Referee Standards

#### **Course setters & Referees:**

- Provincial events: U14 PCC will appoint appropriate course setters and referees and send them to the host ROC, 1 week in advance of the first TC.
- Zone events: Setters and refs will be set at the coach's meetings.

The Coach and ROC will need to adhere to the standards below.

### 6.2.2.2 U14 Course setters & Referees for Provincial events

**Course Setters:** must have CSC - Development Level certified or higher. \*If a setter doesn't have DL certified, a mentor DL certified (or higher) MUST accompany the set. Mentors and setters must be confirmed at the first TC.

**Referees:** must have one (1) of the following:

- a. CSC Rules and Regulations for Coaches on-line module.
- b. A full Level 2 Officials certification course.

#### 6.2.2.3 U14 Course setters & Referees for Zone races

**Course Setters:** must have CSC Development Level trained or higher. Mentors must be used if the setter doesn't meet the requirements, but mentors must be fully certified DL's or higher.

Referees: Same rules as 5.2.2.2

#### 6.2.3 U14 Course Inspection

Maximum course inspection times by discipline for U14.

SL	30 minutes with a 10-minute entry window
GS	45 minutes
SG	60 minutes

#### 6.2.4 U14 Draws and Results

Draws can be computer generated.

All races will have a random start order for first run. First run start order is then reversed for second run, regardless of if the racer finishes or not. If a racer DNF's in the first run, they still start the second run where their bib dictates their start order and they still get a time. Racers who DNF/DSQ in either run will end up in the DNF/DSQ category for the race results.

One-run races are discouraged at U14, but if a zone does run them (this needs to be approved by BCA), the second one-run race should use the reversed first race start list for its race start list.

Recommended format for two day, two run races for is to do only one draw and use that single draw for all four start lists in the following format: (where X is the total # of racers)

"Interdiction to Continue after a competitor stops - If competitors come to a complete stop (e.g. after a fall), they must no longer continue through previous or further gates."

#### 6.2.6 U14 Event Specific Rules

#### 6.2.6.1 BC Games

Teams must be selected by Jan 22nd, 2024.

Each Zone is allocated 4W+4M.

Wild cards spot are available – Zone Reps must contact JohnnyC@bcalpine.com.

#### **BC Games Draw:**

**Entry:** Each Zone's BC Games Representative will submit its zone entry.

Draw: Random Draw - All races will have a random start order for the first run. First run start order is then reversed for second run, regardless of if the racer finishes or not. If a racer DNF's in the first run, they still start the second run where their bib dictates their start order, and they still get a time. Racers who have a DNF or DSQ in either run will end up in the DNF/DSQ category for the race results.

#### 6.2.6.2 *U14 Provincials*

U14 Provincials will be 2 run races. Zone events should be 2 run combined time races, but a zone may decide to run 1 run races which should be preapproved by BCA, so check your race notices for formats.

U14 Provincials Draw: See 5.2.4

U14 Provincials Out of Province Racers: Limited to 6 total entries for the event. Out of Province racers

will be included in the random draw.

# 7.2.2 U16 Course Setting

SL	Max. 160m Min 100m	Combination 4-6m (recommend 5m); Open 7-11m; Delay12-15m Max.  3-6 hairpins, 1-3 flushes consisting of 3 - maximum 4 gates It must also contain 1-3 delays (12-15m max)  Flex-poles must be light poles (25-28.9 mm). The course should have no special technical difficulties.
GS	Max. 350m Min 200m	Open 15-27m; 23m-25m recommended. Delay min 10m between successive gates and max 27m from turning pole to turning pole; Max 3 delays; Max Distance in a delay is 35m. Variety of terrain suggested;
SG	Max. 450m Min 250m	25m minimum distance from turning pole to turning pole; 50m maximum distance from turning pole to turning pole;
PSL	Max 100M	Courses should be set with safety as the top priority. Try and use runs that have a consistent vertical fall line.  The Courses should be min 6 meters apart by the 3 <sup>rd</sup> gate. Spread the courses evenly and over the first few gates. Use measuring devices to ensure consistency. Distance from turning pole to turning pole 12m – Max 14m. No need for delays in PSL. Discourage the double block technique.

# 7.2.2.1 U16 Course Setting and Referee Standards

#### **Course setters & Referees:**

The U16 PCC will appoint course setter and/or referee at U16 TECK Open Races and send to the chief of race prior to the meeting. Changes can only be made by the TD or the PCC.

Westerns and National Races, coaches will need to adhere to the below criteria:

- 1. CSC Performance Level Trained or higher / Level 3 Certified or higher
- 2. Level 2 Officials certification course

## 7.2.3 U16 Course Inspection

Maximum course inspection times by discipline for U14.

SL	30 minutes with a 10-minute entry window
GS	45-minute target (can be 30mins)
SG	60 minutes target

#### 7.2.4 U16 Draws and Results

#### 7.2.4.1 U16 PRS Points

The BC Alpine PRS points homepage is found at: https://bcalpine.com/PRS/ or under the tab "results" of the BC Alpine members website.

Points start processing immediately after the first race of the U16 Teck Open series are uploaded. Points continue to increment after each race of the series is uploaded.

Leader Bibs will be used for all but the first race of the season per discipline.

#### 7.2.4.2 U16 Zone Race Draws

U16 zone race draws will be random. The second run is the first run bib order reversed. In events that have both U14s and U16s, it is encouraged to randomize them all together and have sets that fit in both U14 and U16 setting parameters. If ROC requests to run the age groups separately and is approved by BCA, each group will be randomized separately.

\*If a racer DNFs in the first run, they still start in their normal assigned position for the second run. They will get a run time but not be included in the calculation for results.

#### 7.2.4.3 U16 Teck Open Draws

Random Draw – reverse order 2<sup>nd</sup> run. Everyone gets a second run in bib order.

#### 7.2.4.4 U16 Western Championships Draws

Random start, reverse of the full field by time.

# 7.2.5 U16 New Rules / Changes

#### 7.2.5.1 No Hiking for Slalom or GS events

BC Alpine will be following FIS ICR rule 614.2.3 regarding hiking in all age categories.

"Interdiction to Continue after a competitor stops - If competitors come to a complete stop (e.g. after a fall), they must no longer continue through previous or further gates."

### 7.2.6.1 2024 U16 Western Championships

### 7.2.6.2 2024 Whistler Cup

**Team BC 1 and 2** (seeding only): Formed from the race results from Panorama, Kimberley Teck Open Series and the Western Championship races. Best PRS points from 4 of 9 of the 3 disciplines raced. Ties go to the next best result in any discipline.

**BC additional Quota:** 10 girls/10 boys best of the rest on the PRS list. No Canada Games or Westerns results will be included.
