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Mighty Mites

Great Falls Termites-Mites Hockey Tournament December 9-10, 2023

GENERAL: This is a USA Hockey sanctioned event. Tournament will be played under USA Hockey rules unless otherwise specified.

PARTICIPATING TEAMS & CREDENTIALS: All US teams and players must be registered and rostered with USA Hockey. All Canadian teams must be registered and rostered with their approved, governing Canadian Association. Eligible players are those born 2014 and later. U8 (Mites/Novice) team suggested ages 7-8, U6 (Termites/Timbits) suggested ages 6 and under, however teams may roster as they see fit. Associations may roster as many teams as they wish in either division or both.

<u>PLAYERS & COACHES ON THE BENCH:</u> Only 4 people, other than the dressed players, will be allowed on each team bench.

<u>GAME TIME:</u> All teams must be dressed and ready to play 15 minutes prior to the scheduled time, in case we run ahead of schedule. Any team not on the ice within 10 minutes of their scheduled game time will forfeit the game. It is the responsibility of each coach to verify his teams next game time.

LENGTH OF GAMES: U8 games will be 5 on 5, with goalies, on half ice. U6 games will be 4 on 4, no goalies, on half ice. Games will consist of 3 – 15-minute run-time periods. Each game will have a 3-minute warm-up. There will be a 1-minute intermission between the periods. Line changes will be every 3 minutes at the buzzer. Quick faceoffs by the referee at center will resume play. When goalie covers the puck, the referee will blow their whistle and immediately throw the puck to a corner to resume play. Faceoffs after a goal is scored. No official score will be kept.

POOLS: A minimum of 4 teams per pool for four game guarantee. Pools will be established once registration is finalized.

SPORTSMANSHIP: This tournament stresses sportsmanship. Following every game, teams will line up on their respective blue lines for the handshake and demonstrate good sportsmanship. Fighting, abusive behavior or unsportsmanlike conduct by players, coaches, parents or spectators will not be tolerated on or off the ice. Such conduct shall be grounds for disqualification from the tournament. The Tournament Director has the right to remove any individual in violation of USA Hockey and/or Great Falls Amateur Hockey Zero Tolerance Policy. Game officials have the authority to direct the removal of any person acting in an objectionable manner as well as the authority to end any game at any time, if they feel that continuing the game would constitute a danger to the players. The outcome of any such game shall be determined by the tournament director.

<u>PENALTIES:</u> If a penalty is called the player involved will need to leave the ice for remaining shift for further explanation and instruction from the coach and another player will be substituted for remainder of the shift. In the event of a flagrant infraction the player will remain benched for an additional line change (monitored by coaches). An Official may utilize a penalty shot for a penalty if he/she feels the penalty was in the act of shooting or sees recurring and/or intentional penalties by the same player.

<u>JERSEYS:</u> It will be the responsibility of **the home team to wear dark colored jerseys and the visiting team to wear light colored jerseys.** The home team will be listed in the top position on the tournament brackets. Updated brackets will be posted at the rink. Team placement on these official brackets is final.

EQUIPMENT: All US players must adhere to USA Hockey rules and regulations. Mouthguards are recommended, not required. All Canadian players must adhere to their own CHL rules and regulations with regards to equipment.

LOCKER ROOMS: A locker room schedule will be posted daily and may also be published in the tournament program. This schedule is subject to change, if necessary. Great Falls Amateur Hockey and the Great Falls Community Ice-Plex are not responsible for any belongings left or stored in the locker rooms or at the rink. It is the responsibility of every team to make sure your equipment is secure. Coaches are responsible for the cleanliness and condition of the locker room after their played games. It is the responsibility of every team to clean up and throw away all garbage and leave the locker room clean for the next game.

LOCKER ROOM SUPERVISION: It is the policy of USA Hockey that all teams have at least 1 responsible adult present directly monitoring the locker room while participants are present and also to make sure the locker room is secured during time when participants are on the ice.

<u>DAMAGE TO FACILITIES:</u> All repair and replacement costs associated with any damage caused to any property at the ice arena, hotel or other facility, will be the responsibility of the team(s) and/or the individual(s) causing such damage. Immediate arrangements for restitution must be made and violations of this rule are cause for disqualification from the tournament.

PROTESTS: The line of protest is as follows: 1) On-ice official, 2) Protest Committee, consisting of the tournament director, rules committee and/or other appointed personnel. There may be no protests on the playing rules, interpretations of playing rules by on-ice officials or judgment calls. If a referee or linesman fails to appear for a game and the coaches agree to play, the coaches lose the right to protest any aspect of the game. A \$50 cash fee must accompany each protest. If the protest is upheld, the fee will be refunded. If the protest is denied, the fee will be forfeited. The protest committee will rule on all protests before the next game of either team.

RULES COMMITTEE: A rules committee, consisting of the Tournament Director and 2 members of the tournament committee will be responsible for ruling on all grievances and protests. Any occurrences addressed or not addressed in these rules will be adjudicated by the Tournament director and/or the rules committee and their decision is FINAL.
