Bob "Baggie" Bagniewski

Class of 2019 - Coach/Player Co-Ed - La Crosse

- ♦ Played and managed:
 - Pogy's Pizza Fastpitch team from 1963 1972 Sport's Inn 16" team from 1973-1978 Sport's Inn 12" men's slow pitch team from 1976-1984 Sport's Inn Co-Ed team from 1981-1991 (also under the name of Riversteel Co-Ed)
- ♦ His co-ed team won 6 state championships in 1982, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, and 1990.
- ♦ Was an ASA umpire and a WIAA football referee.
- ♦ He also coached girl's 16 and 18 fast pitch softball under the name of Riversteel. He loved working with the pitcher's, throughout his career.



Scott Hermes

Class of 2019 - Girl's Fast Pitch Coach - Trevor

- ♦ Started his career on the adult side of the game playing and coaching Men's fastpitch. In 1998, he started coaching youth T-ball.
- ♦ 2006 Career as a volunteer member/founding member of the Wisconsin Lightning Youth Athletics (LYA) organization.
- ♦ Scott's love of softball isn't just about his success on the field. He focuses on the life lessons that are learned on the field, in hopes that they will carry these forward for the rest of their lives. He demonstrates his strong faith and character on a daily basis and reminds all athletes that play for him to do the same.
- ◆ Scott's various teams have placed in the top 50 of the National Tournaments through USA Softball. This includes four top 15 finishes. Wisconsin Lightning under Scott's tutelage has seen repetitive success at the Class A State Tournament since the program's inception.

Class of 2019 - Umpire - Seymour

- ♦ Started umpire career in 1980 in Green Bay, WI.
- ♦ The first 20 years umpired both modified pitch and fast pitch, now only umpiring girl's fast pitch
- ♦ Has been invited to work more than 30 National tournaments
- ♦ Served as Deputy UIC for over 10 years
- ♦ Awarded umpire of the year twice
- ♦ Umpired the plate for the 16 and under Gold in 2014
- ♦ Achieved "Elite" status in fastpitch in 2016



Dale "Moose" Madson

Class of 2019 - Men's Fast Pitch Player - Eau Claire

- ◆ Softball career spans 25 years (1953-1978) including Army Service Ball in Germany, Church League Fast Pitch, Industrial League Fast Pitch, and Major League Fast Pitch.
- ♦ Wisconsin State Tournament Most Valuable Player in 1961
- ◆ Led the Eau Claire Major League in home runs, doubles, hits, and RBIs in 1961 -.397 batting average
- Western Wisconsin District Tournament Most Valuable Player in 1961 and 1963; Best Pitcher in 1963
- ♦ Selected to the Wisconsin State All Tournament team in 1961
- ♦ Won the Eau Claire Major League Batting Title in 1963, batting average of .458
- Played on five city championship teams, in seven District and State tournaments; four times in finals, and in National Regional Tournament in Aurora, Illinois
- ♦ Three hundred plus wins as a pitcher including five no hitters
- ♦ Lifetime Major League Batting Average of .315
- Selected to five Major-League all-star teams
- ♦ Pitched Town and Country Bar to Chippewa County Championship
- Pitched Chippewa Valley Sporting Goods to Superior Invitational Championship



Mark Mallow

Class of 2019 - Girl's Fast Pitch - Ixonia

- ♦ Began playing softball competitively in 1979.
- ♦ Served on the board of the Ixonia softball league for many years and helped organize and coordinate numerous leagues and tournaments.
- ♦ In 1997, organized and developed the girl's fastpitch program in Watertown along with Scott Pomerenke
- ♦ Contributed to the planning and coordination to lead community volunteers to host the ASA Girls State A and C State tournaments, ASA National Qualifiers and ASA National Tournaments.
- ♦ Mark and his wife Diane live in Watertown. Mark continues to promote the game and is proud of the positive impact his work has had on his community.



Chad Mitchell

Class of 2019 - Umpire - Hagar City

- ♦ Started umpiring in 1988 at the age of 15 and worked his first Co-ed Slow Pitch Softball game in 1990 near New Richmond, WI.
- ♦ Selected to umpire in his first National at the 1995 Men's D Slow Pitch National Championship in Battle Creek, MI as one of two father/son umpire combinations.
- ♦ Completed the 2008 ASA Slow Pitch advanced umpire school in Cincinnati, OH
- ♦ Selected to umpire in Slow Pitch National Championship tournaments in 2008 2011, 2013, and 2016. Often assigned the plate of the championship games at Nationals as well as a televised game on CBS Sports.
- ♦ Earned the classification of "Elite Umpire" for Slow Pitch in 2009 by receiving "Excellent" ratings in his prior 4 national assignments. At the time, only the second umpire in the history of Wisconsin ASA to achieve this level.
- Wisconsin ASA State Umpire-In-Chief from 2011 2015. Improved the umpiring standards for Wisconsin umpires and was able to assign over 100 National tournament umpires and get four (4) umpires to the "Elite" level.
- ♦ Earned his Slow Pitch International Certification (ISF or WBSC) after completing a certification camp in Portland, OR in 2014.
- ♦ Selected to umpire in his first fast pitch national at the 2018 Girl's FP 14B Northern National Championship in Rochester, MN alongside his son (Max).
- Over the course of his State umpire career, he worked over 50 Wisconsin ASA State Championships and at least a thousand softball games in Slow, Modified, and Fast pitch.
- ♦ During his State UIC tenure, he taught over 20 State Umpire Clinics, organized an ASA National Umpire School in 2014, and was the tournament UIC of countless Wisconsin State Championships and National Oualifiers.
- ♦ Mentoring and training youth umpires has taken a higher importance over working games and this new passion will help to create the next generation of championship umpires.
