#### Sunday, Apríl 13, 2025 Palm Sunday,

**Scripture Readings April 20:** Acts 10:34a, 37-43, Col 3:1-4 or Cor 5:6b-8, Jn 20:1-9 (42) or Lk 24:1-12 (41)

Pastor's Message Palm Sunday: The triumphal tone of Jesus' entrance as the "King of Glory" takes a rapid and downward spiral with the Gospel proclamation of His passion/suffering. At Mass, today and on Good Friday, the Gospel is divided into many "parts" separating the different stories and observations from various perspectives. The music between these accounts provides time to reflect upon the scriptures.

<u>Holy Thursday</u>: Is the beginning of the Triduum/the Three Great Days of the Church year. In essence, there is no end to this Mass, for it flows into Good Friday, and culminates with the Easter Vigil. We will have the "Mandatum" / the "command to serve others" as we commemorate this by washing feet. You are invited to participate by having your feet washed on this night. The final moment of this liturgy is the procession with the Eucharist around the church to the altar of repose, reflecting on all that occurred the night in the garden of Gethsemane.

<u>Good Friday</u>: We gather and leave in silence, pondering the sacrificial death of the Lord. In Ezekiel it is written, "Our crimes and our sins weigh us down; we are rotting away because of them." The proclamation of the Gospel according to John is the key focus of our contemplation followed with a procession to venerate the cross/the crucified Christ.

Easter Vigil: This is the holiest night of the Church's year. Allow the mystery to wrap you in awe and wonder. We gather outside in darkness and the Easter fire is lit, symbolizing His resurrection. Christ bursts forth from the darkness of the tomb, and as a congregation, we enter the church with candles. In the second part of the liturgy, the Scriptures recap various stories of how God has constantly saved his people. We remember, as well, in our own individual lives the defining moments when God has come to our rescue. Moving into the third part of the liturgy, is the reception of Kevin Rosendahl and Brian Swedberg into full communion of the Church and the renewal of our Baptismal promises. Climaxing with the fourth part is the celebration of the Eucharist.

Ringing of the Bells during Mass — There are three times that bells are rung during the Eucharistic prayer. The first time, when they are rung just once and the priest is holding his hands over the bread and wine, as the priest prays that God will send down His Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of His Son ("Epiclesis").

The second and third times that the bells are rung (3 times each), are at the Words of Institution, often called the Words of Consecration. This is when the priest prays the words of Jesus himself found in the Gospel, as the elements become the actual Body and Blood of our Lord.
