

FROM THE RYHA PRESIDENT-TOM GRAHAM

Association members: The RYHA season is in full swing. All teams at all levels are active playing the game we all love. There is nothing more satisfying to our coaches than coming to the rink and helping kids at all levels have fun and improve their hockey skills. Along with the fun of the sport comes a level of competitiveness between teams, coaches, players and, if you can believe it, parents!

I encourage everyone to take a moment and reflect on what type of player, coach, volunteer, and parent you may fall into with regards to the competitive edge. We have teams and players at all levels—they will make mistakes. We have referees at all ages and levels----and they will make mistakes. You may have seen the posters around the rinks outlining positive sportsmanship towards referees. Posters are only good if what is being said on it will be followed.

Below is a note from our D9 President Mark Blaisdell:

D9 Association Board members: It has been brought to the attention of the District 9 Director that there have already been reports of abuse of officials. This will not be tolerated. District 9 encourages and supports associations in implementing a zero acceptance policy. Such policies can include immediate removal from arena, suspension of attending youth hockey events, to permanent removal from youth hockey events. Effective policies will ensure compliance from coaches, players, and spectators alike. Please work within your association and teams to combat the rapidly growing abuse of officials. We must support our referees and speak up when we witness such unwarranted behavior. Let the referees in your association know that they have your support.

We (families, players, volunteers, and coaches) have an obligation to keep our sport healthy and vibrant for the future. RYHA has zero tolerance for abusive behavior at any level....verbal, physical, or written. Any such behavior will be reviewed and dealt with by the Sportsmanship Committee.

Parents,

There has been a recent increase in vandalism and destruction of property both intentional and unintentional at Graham Arenas this season. Please help by addressing this with your child / children. This includes shooting balls, pucks, and playing games in the lobby and other common areas. The only place shooting pucks or stickhandling balls/pucks is in the dryland area in Graham #1. Violations, depending upon the severity, will result in disciplinary actions for RYHA players and potentially monetary actions to the family. A note, like this one, was sent to all RYHA Coaches. Together, as parents and coaches, optimistically we can work toward eliminating any further damage to our rinks. The dry-land / shooting area in Graham #1 is a great place for RYHA Players to burn off energy and work their skills. RYHA and the Graham Arena staff greatly appreciate your assistance with this issue.

As a new member of the RYHA Board, I've spent the last few months listening and learning about our hockey association, the great things we do, and some areas where we need to do better. I've been amazed by the time and effort that so many volunteers contribute to make hockey fun, well-run, and affordable for our families. I also thank the many families who've shared constructive ways they'd like to see RYHA grow and I promise to represent and share those thoughts with my Board colleagues.

There is an area where I ask the help of every family and player in RYHA. As president-elect, I serve on the sportsmanship committee tasked with finding a fair solution to some of the contentious issues that come up in an association of our size. In hearings related to topics like referee abuse, volunteer abuse, bullying, fighting, inappropriate locker room behavior, theft, vandalism, etc., I've seen firsthand that there are no winners. Children are hurt, families leave our sport, players are suspended, our rinks lose trust in us, and our fees rise. I'd like to challenge all of us to drive these hearings down to zero.

Our association is made up of some of the best families and young athletes I've ever known. In my short experience, in nearly every instance, sportsmanship committee hearings are the result of one poor decision from an otherwise great boy or girl. Next time your player heads to the rink, please take a moment to remind him or her how much their words and actions—positive or negative—can have on a teammate or volunteer. Please ask them to respect and listen to our volunteers. Please help us reinforce that every one of our athletes represents their family, their team, and our entire community with the jersey they wear. Please encourage them to treat our rinks and those we visit with the same respect we would treat our own homes.

Very few of the players I've coached have ever made a living out of playing hockey, but nearly all of them are outstanding, successful people because of the character they built and lessons they learned through our game. I ask your help in working together to make sure every player has a great experience at the rink and that our association represents Rochester proudly.

THE GOALIE CORNER

Hello Goalies and Goalie Families. By this time you, are knee deep into your practices and season and everything is getting moving. I want to take some time to write about practices and dryland for goalies as the season progresses.

During a typical practice the goalies should be getting some time to work on goalie specific techniques in skating, crease movement, shot blocking, and tracking the puck to name a few. Goalies at a young age should still be participating in team skating drills as doing skating drills and becoming a better skater is good for anyone at any age, but especially a young goaltender.

In regards to goalie specific practice time, you need to have a plan. You aren't going to get a lot of time so you need to make use of the time you are going to get. If you visit our RYHA goalie page on the RYHA website that is listed under the "Teams" tab, you will find a lot of drills that can be printed out. I would suggest that if you are working with a goaltending coach at practice that may be new to teaching goalies, then print 1 or 2 of these drills out yourself, bring them to practice and ask your coach if he can help you with these drills. Also on the page is a link to the USA Hockey Goaltending page which is a great resource for some more drills that you can use on the ice during practices.

In regards to dryland, there are also some printable drills that you can be doing during your dryland sessions. You can be working on some specific drills that will help you as a goaltender. Don't waste this dryland time. This is a good opportunity for you to get better off the ice and take advantage of that.

Lastly make sure you are attending the RYHA goalie sessions. This is a great way to get some goalie instruction from some very good goalie coaches. Also if you have a coach on your team that is working with the goalies I would encourage them to come to the sessions as well and learn some of the drills that you are working on, and that way you can start using them in practice. Keep working hard, and I hope you have a great season.
