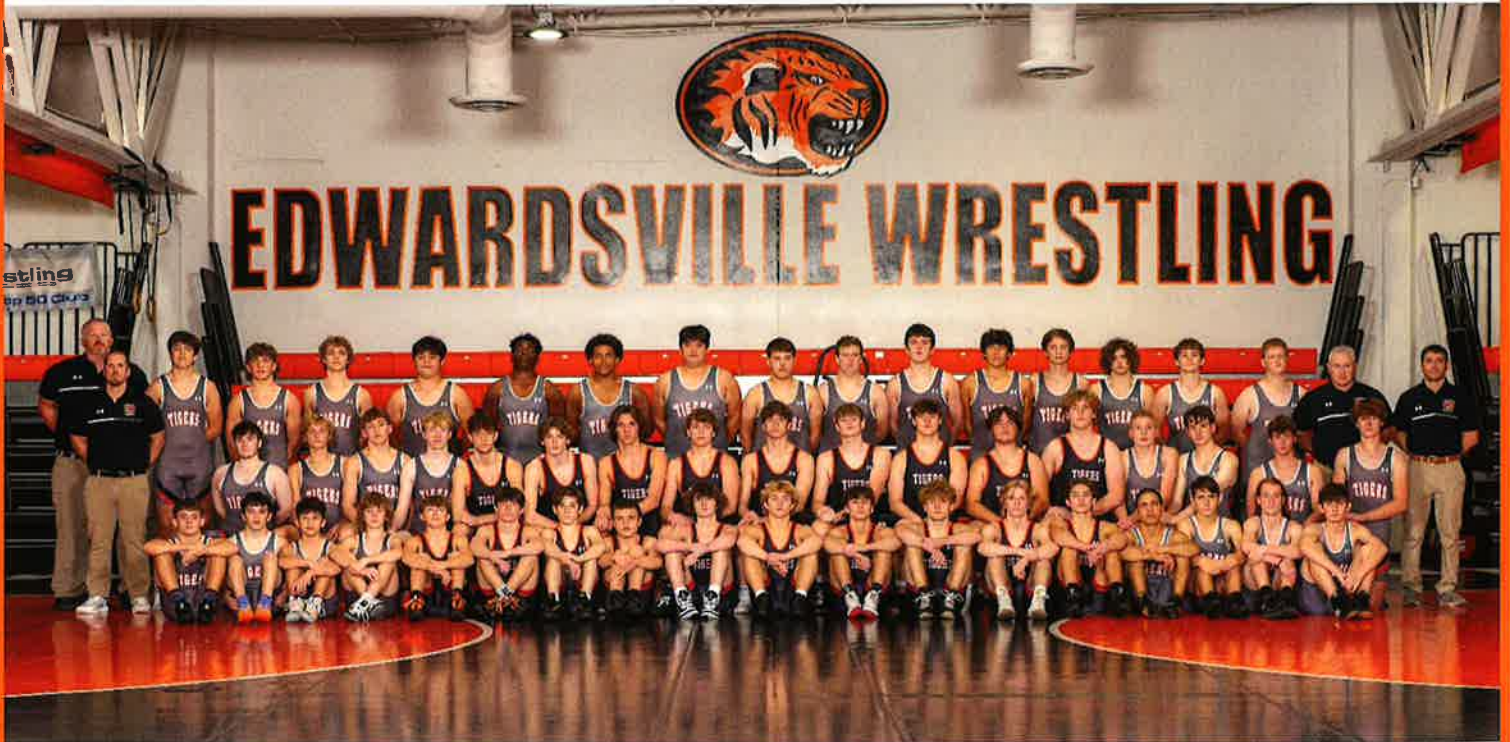

Varsity Overview

Parents, Wrestlers, and Tiger Wrestling Fans welcome to yet another remarkable high school wrestling season. As we gather here tonight, we reflect not only on the victories won and the medals earned but also on the invaluable lessons learned, the bonds forged, and the memories cherished. This banquet serves as a celebration of the resilience and spirit that defines Edwardsville Wrestling. Together, we honor the dedication and perseverance of our athletes, the guidance and support of our coaches, and the encouragement from our families and supporters.

At the start of our season we discussed our vision, ***“To compete at a high level against elite competition with integrity”***. We finished the season with a 13-5 record, which resulted in our 13th in a row Southwest Conference Title. The exciting part of competing in our conference duals is knowing we have the flexibility to explore many avenues with our lineup. The wrestlers have the ability to compete at a weight class above their certified weight and still compete at a high level. Often after going over the line up, I would have a wrestler come up to me and say, “If you want I will go the weight class lower or wherever you need me”. That *Team First* mentality is what makes it fun to coach. We had many opportunities for underclass wrestlers to get a taste of what it felt like to compete on the varsity level. After watching the underclass compete, the future is bright. The Southwest Conference Championship is not something taken for granted but was a goal the wrestlers achieved. The historic Dvorak Tournament was a good measuring stick for the wrestlers. The Tigers were able to leave the tournament with Four individual medals and a 12th place finish out of 37 teams. The next stop was the Cheesehead Tournament where every match provided learning opportunities due to the high caliber competition. Bryson Nuttall was able to crack the Top 8 to bring home an individual medal. The Columbia Hickman Tournament allowed for the wrestlers to let it fly, knowing Regionals were right around the corner. We left Columbia Hickman with a Second Place Team Finish with countless individual medals. We entered post-season with our two-week stint in Quincy for Regionals and Sectionals. The goal of the entire season is to progress as a wrestler and peak during post-season. That is what we saw in Quincy during the Regional Tournament. The Tigers were able to put 11 wrestlers into the Finals, with crowning Five Individual Champions. However, it took all 14 wrestlers fighting for each other to score team points to win yet another Team Regional Championship. With there only being four Sectionals for 3a division, there is nothing but barn burner of matches every time you step on the mat. Even though some wrestlers’ individual season ended that weekend, they competed at a high level against elite competition with integrity. Bryson Nuttall and Blake Mink punched their ticket to the IHSA State Championship by placing top 4, to be able to call themselves top 16 in the entire state of Illinois. The season was not over as we wrestled Yorkville at Dual Team Sectionals. Before that dual started, I asked the 21 wrestlers who were on the roster to do one thing, when they walk off the mat to be able to look the seniors in the eye and say they left it all out there. The wrestlers who competed did just that. We may of came up short, but I am proud of the way they represented Edwardsville Wrestling.

Tonight we will be saying goodbye to our Senior class. Even though we are graduating three senior boys, the quantity does not equal the impact they had on our program. Their coachability, work ethic, and love for Edwardsville Wrestling is immeasurable. This is a challenge to the underclass who is going to step up. Your actions will have to match your words. If I can leave you with one word it would be **Consistency**. Flashes of greatness and motivation will come. Can you be consistent in all aspects of your life?

Our theme this year was ***“New Chapter, Same Book”***. Coach Wagner’s accolades alone are big shoes to fill. My main priority going into the season was to continue with the most important part of tradition he brought to Edwardsville Wrestling: Leading with Integrity, Passion, and Support for **each wrestler** so they can develop into the best version of themselves. Thank you to the entire coaching staff for staying on staff during this transition. Without them things would not have ran as smoothly as they did this year. Thank you to all the parents for supporting your wrestler and the coaching staff this year. Thank you to the stat girls who volunteer their time and energy to film and stat the matches. Thank you to all parents who volunteered to help our program. ***Tiger Style***

Varsity Girls Wrestling Overview

What a season the Girls Wrestling Team has just completed!!!! It was filled with all sorts of wrestling, fun, hard work, and competition. It was enjoyable to watch the process of the girl's program unfolding, as it is now in its third season. Our team almost doubled in size this year, as we had 20 girls complete the season. As I mentioned last year, even as the girls' numbers increased, the will to want to succeed also increased. Although we have new girls, and experienced girls, all of them wanted to continue to develop and get better.

We increased our matches this season, adding a couple dual meets, and an additional tournament. Also new this season, was adding a regional to the state series. This made it even more difficult to qualify for state. This year we won 6 Tournament Championships!!!!!!!!!! We were Champions at Granite City, Pontiac (The Munch), Paducah, Kentucky, and our own 618 tournament. Our state tournament ended with numerous outstanding efforts, and two girls making the (STAND) Norah Swaim took 3rd Place, and Holly Zugmaier placed 6th. Congratulations to all.

This season also marked the first "All Girls" wrestling dual. We squared off early vs. a quality Wentzville Holt Team. The Jon Davis Wrestling Center was as electric as it ever has in the 15 years of its existence. The Tigers came out with a hard fought 54 – 18 victory. Thank you too all who came out and cheered us on.

Adding the extra numbers in the girl's program also gives us many personalities, which can include many good times. One of our memorable moments was the team bonding that transpired at the Kentucky tournament. The girls need support from their teammates, and this is an area that can also increase our success. We need to continue to develop in this area, so we can reach our full potential on and off the mat.

As with the boys, we want to celebrate the great season, but not be satisfied. We will be losing three (3) great Seniors – Norah, Olivia, And Tayla, but the cupboard is not empty. We will have many returners and next year looks to be just as successful: The goal is to continue to climb the ladder to even more success, while still having fun and learning life lessons. This can only be done with continued training and belief. I challenge all the girls to stay active in the sport, and let's see if we can even climb farther next season.

Underclass Overview

Our underclass wrestlers had an outstanding season. Each wrestler and their parents should be very proud of all they accomplished both individually and as a team. We believe this group can help take Tiger Wrestling to even higher levels. As their coaches we are extremely proud of their commitment, discipline, sacrifice and hard work they each put into this season. Like many successful teams before them they displayed all the traits of what we like to call "**Tiger Style Wrestling**".

This year's freshman team had a combined **dual meet record of 9-0**. They defeated all of their South West Conference (SWC) foes along with Holt, MO., Seckman, MO. and Triad. The team also competed in one tournament "O'Fallon Matzker Freshmen Tournament" where they placed ten of the eleven wrestlers (**Four Champions**, one 2nd & 3rd place finishers) that competed on the day. This was just enough to capture the **Team Championship** over a very good Lafayette team.

The rest of the season consisted of our non-varsity wrestlers competing in a series of junior varsity events and one varsity level tournament. This mixed group of wrestlers compiled a dual meet record of **13-0 on the season**. Just as the freshman did the JV team swept through their SWC opponents and added wins against Hazelwood East, Seckman, Triad, Granite City and CBC. The JV team also competed in four team tournaments: Francis Howell North JV Tournament (**1st Place**/10 teams), Jerseyville JV Tournament (**1st Place**/ 14 teams), Hallsville Varsity Tournament (**4th Place**/ 30 teams) and our annual SWC JV Tournament (**1st Place**).

Overall, all these young men did a great job all season long competing at a high level knowing in some cases they were being asked to wrestle opponents two years older than them and in some cases a weight class above. They showed toughness, grit, confidence and trust in our staff that we were putting them in the right situations to not only grow as wrestlers but preparing them individually for future success in our program.

We would like to thank the parents of all the wrestlers for supporting their sons this season, without your support it would be very difficult to be the program we are today. We appreciate the time you allow us to spend with your sons and helping you mold them into great young men of character on and off the mat.

We would also like to thank the senior wrestlers and managers for their hard work, dedication, and passion for the program. It means a lot to us as a coaching staff that we have had a hand in helping you develop in this great sport over your careers. We would also like to thank the parents of the senior wrestlers and managers for always being there for your sons/daughters/and the program.
