Lacrosse, America's oldest team sport, dates to **1100 A.D**., when it was played by the Haudenosaunee, or **Haudenosaunee people**, in what now is New York and areas in Canada bordering the state.

Native American oral traditions cite the first lacrosse game played between birds and mammals. Some Native Americans believe the sport was a gift from the Creator to be used for enjoyment and as medicine (medicine game).



#### LYL | 2024 Season Overview - GIRLS

- Lacrosse stick: The crosse, or stick, for girls has a shallower pocket than the boys sticks
- Goggles: Must be SEI certified no later than January 1, 2020
- Women's lacrosse helmet (optional) for players that want additional head protection
- Mouth guard: Must be readily visible color other than clear or white
- Adequate shoes for grass and artificial turf fields





# Students Complete the IB Diploma


- Middle Years Program for all students in grades 9 + 10


