### Membership update – Technology Committee Report – (Michael Bouton)

Betty, Barbara, Craig, Michael B, met with Sports Engine.com, owned by NBC sports.

Patrick Sheely from Sports Engine was who met with committee

It is complete program that will meet all needs for non-profit clubs, individuals will have their own accounts to manage their personal information, members can pay (bypass PayPal) online for membership, charge is 3.1% transaction fee – as the number of transactions increase, the cost per transaction can lower to 1%. This would be for trips and events. All count toward the dollar amount to

reduce the fee.

Other organizations that have used this service? Tristate ski association, Vermont, CT, ME are using it – go visit their web site, which will be sent out via emails.

Sports engine moved beyond tracking ski racers to targeting non-profit organizations.

Benefit to keeping all in one site, just need to be careful of contractual agreement. This would be a LARGE Effort and it will not happen overnight

## can use hash tags (Instagram, Twitter) – to help gain new members and younger members

- 1) Photo contest to generate interest post photo prizes? Membership to the club.
- 2) Different ways to get new members that we can support from the website. We can do this and reduce the manual efforts
- 3) Make it relevant to the target audience

CRAIG – Sports Engine can handle all eblasts, on line articles, posting pictures, we could get quicker turn around because feedback can be within a few days. Of course this depends on person or structure of privileges for all users. Sports Engine has a scrolling type of news release so people can scroll down to see history. Sending out emails is controlled by us; they will take our current setup and migrate to Sports Engine. The web address will be the same; Sports Engine is more interactive, users can set meet dates, trip coordinates can manage coordination/communication for trips, fill out online for scholarship application and memberships. People can also fill out forms from their smart phones.

Today, we send out 500 eblasts only about 30% are opened, how many moguls are read vs trash? Print 150 to 200 and cost usually is \$300. Moguls are used for marketing and that should continue.

Lots of effort up front, but more options and flexibility with Sports Engine. This integrates our systems, memberships, emails, web sites, etc.

Sports Engine said it can sort membership on any field, trip coordinators/event leaders can use that functionality, self populates from previous trip, some reporting tools on members, trips, financial, makes deposits to our banks would be helpful.

QUESTIONS - What all do they get? Do they sell our data? Do they email our membership? Need to find this out...

BETTY – we can put all our docs out there, unlimited storage, can we have a private storage??

## Trip Planning for 2017/2018 Ski and Summer Season

**Salmon River Raft Trip with MFWO Trip – Aug 9 – 15, 2018.** 8 people committed but agreement was 10. Willis agreed to refund the extra 2 slots we paid for so Anna sent check for 8 people.

Norway Hiking, Biking and Kayaking – GO - Aug 13 – 27, 2018. – (Mary Pribble leader) There are 15 people committed. Trip is full – and a go!!

**Sun Valley Trip** – not put together yet – first week in January Sunday 6 – Sat 12 by intermountain ski council

**Zermatt – January 24 - 27 (28?) 2019 – Michael –** word from Maxine offered 4<sup>th</sup> night with reduced rate and breakfast each morning... waiting to hear back from her for official price. Still planning to ski 3 resorts, (3 days skiing Brighton, Solitude and Sundance – all \$55 or less) be involved with Sundance. \$75 for screening at the Sundance resort – small facility – more in Park City @same price \$75. Target number is 40... takes 6 hours to go in bus. Keeping price at \$800. Will promote to other clubs if needed to get more members, but maybe plan to keep locally to begin with and contact the Snow Riders.

**Can trip coordinators coordinate between clubs?** Roxann to reach out to Renee... and Idaho Falls ski club. They are coordinated through the Council.

Whitefish - Feb 20 – 24, 2019. Anna will lead and is already booked. This will be a Wed – Sun trip and will use airline to get to destination. This trip had 24 people sign.

Roxann Jensen – August Cape Town Africa –Africa trip July 2019 - able to extend the dead line for payment to Dec 1<sup>st</sup> July is peak season for Africa. Trip is limited to 12 people. Get our own guide, world class trainer and birder, 1 night in Johannesburg to get to Canella – spend a few nights there, then 3 hours to airport to Durban to Penda, private game preserve and then Cape Town where wide variety of options, winery, Robins Island, Cape Point, Table Mountain, penguins, gardens. The cost is \$7300 + air fare. Airfare would be around \$1500 - already have 3 people signed up. Water shortage is concern... but not an issue in the outlying area... Carol needs write up for web site.

Craig needs write up for eblast.

Motion by Craig to approve this trip for BBSC, Sandra second, motion carries.

**Paul researching – trip to** San Moritz – Feb 2020 – 27, 28, 29 and early March. Cost is \$208 per day, \$1200 for airfare, with several days in London 5 days.
