Chad Buchanan was a 2005 graduate of Bowling Green High School. Chad played hockey for BGHS for 4 years, serving as Captain of the JV team his Junior Year. In addition to his involvement in hockey, Chad was an active member of the Bowling Green High School FFA, Varsity Tennis teams, and several activities through Wood County 4-H. Chad went on to attend Owens Community College and Bowling Green State University receiving associate and bachelor's degrees in Business and Sport Management.

Chad took his love of hockey to a new level while at BGSU – playing and serving as the BGSU Club Hockey coach for nearly 5 seasons. He took great pride in fostering relationship with younger players, helping the underdog, and instilling the love for the game in each player he coached. Chad was kind, loyal and shared his passion for hockey with all the younger players he came in contact with. Outside of hockey, Chad enjoyed working alongside his Dad doing construction, spending time with his family, friends and his cat Simba. Chad had a great smile and his wit and laugh were unmatched.

Unfortunately, Chad's life was cut short in November 2018. To honor his legacy and to continue building the Bowling Green Youth Hockey program to continue to benefit other young men like Chad, his family has chosen to create a scholarship in his name.
