Player Documents

- 1. Create a Team Notebook. The notebook will need to be ready for home and away games.
- 2. The notebook should contain the following information:
 - a. Team Roster
 - i. The Capitals Registrar will create and provide you with a USA Hockey Roster
 - 1. Rosters may change or need updated for tournaments
 - ii. The Roster will need Jersey numbers.
 - 1. During jersey checkout or assignment, create a player list and corresponding jersey number
 - b. Parent contact information
 - c. Cheyenne Capitals Code of Conduct signed by Player and Parent
 - d. USA Hockey Consent to Treat Form

Jerseys

- 8U Mites, 10U Squirts, 12U PeeWees, and Girls Jerseys
 - The Capitals provide these jerseys
 - o Coordinate a jersey check out day with the Capitals Manager Liaison or Registrar
 - o Document the total number of jerseys checked out, player and player number
 - Name plates or name bars can be purchased for an additional cost - coordinate with the Capitals Manager Liaison to order
 - Players are responsible to return a clean, stain free, matching set (home and away) of
 jerseys at the end of the season.
 - The Capitals Manager Liaison will need to know if any players lost, or didn't return their jersey(s). These players will forfeit their jersey deposit.
- 14U Bantam and High School Jerseys
 - o Players purchase these jerseys during registration
 - Name plates or name bars can be purchased for an additional cost - coordinate with the Capitals Manager Liaison to order
 - The Capitals Manager Liaison will work with the Team Managers to determine jersey sizes and jersey needs for the upcoming season

Home Games

- 1. The following activities will need to be coordinated for home games:
 - a. Create an assigned list of activities for each player's parent(s)
 - i. Scoreboard
 - ii. Online Scorekeeping
 - 1. Pointstreak (WAHL games)
 - 2. Sports Engine (CRHL games)

- 3. Scoreboard and Online Scorekeeping training will be provided at the beginning of the season by the Capitals Manager Liaison.
- iii. Penalty Box
- iv. Music (optional)
- v. Postgame Snacks/Drinks (optional)

Parents are responsible for their assigned day of activity. A parent can switch, swap, exchange with another parent with Team Manager notification. Parents are expected to complete their assigned home game day activity. Coaches, Team managers and their families are exempt from participating in assigned activities (they may do so at their discretion). Direct all questions/concerns/issues to Club President.

- b. Have team notebook available and current USA Hockey team roster
- c. Check on locker rooms and monitor if needed
- d. Assist in keeping unauthorized people out of the locker room area and glass/boards

Away Games

- 1. Accommodations schedule and coordinate team room hotel accommodations several weeks in advance of game
- 2. Communicate with team on travel directions, hotel information, game day arrival time, postgame snacks (optional)
- 3. Bring team notebook with current USA Hockey team roster
- 4. Check on locker rooms, locate girls' locker room for co-ed teams, and monitor if needed.
- 5. Create an assigned list of activities for each player's parent(s) for the
 - a. Penalty Box

CRHL Game Time Lengths

- 1. Midget 15 min run clock first two periods & 12 min stop clock 3rd period
- 2. Bantam 15 min run clock first two periods & 12 min stop clock 3rd period
- 3. Pee Wee 15 min run clock first two periods & 12 min stop clock 3rd period
- 4. Squirt 15 min run clock first two periods & 12 min stop clock 3rd period

WAHL Game Time Lengths

- 1. Midget 18 min stop clock all periods, game length 1 hr. 45 min, final period may be adjusted to fit ice time.
- 2. Girls 16 min stop clock all periods, game length 1 hr. 30 min, final period may be adjusted to fit ice time.
- 3. Bantam 16 min stop clock all periods, game length 1 hr. 30 min, final period may be adjusted to fit ice time.

- 4. Pee Wee 14 min stop clock all periods, game length 1 hr. 15 min, final period may be adjusted to fit ice time.
- 5. Squirt 12 min stop clock all periods, game length 1 hr., final period may be adjusted to fit ice time.

Scoring Games on the Score Board

Setting the time

Press SET MAIN CLOCK, input the number of minutes, then press ENTER. (Note that the number of minutes will include seconds and maybe tenths of seconds: 12 minutes will be "1200" or "12000" and should be obvious on display and scoreboard. If you get it wrong on the first try, just repeat.)

- Set clock to 5 minutes for warm up prior to start of game.
- Set clock to XX minutes (see game time lengths above)
- Set clock to 1 minute in between periods.
- The buzzer will sound automatically after time runs out.

Running the time

Press the START button to run the time; press STOP to stop the time.

- Start warm up time as soon as all of the skaters are on the ice and run until buzzer.
- For games with a stop clock, press START as soon as the puck touches the ice after the ref drops it and press STOP every time the ref blows the whistle. The ref will look for your "OK" at the start of each period.
- For games with a running clock, press START at the beginning of the period as the puck touches the ice.

Penalties

For a 2-minute penalty, press the PLAYER PENALTY key for the appropriate team (HOME or GUEST), press ENTER, then input the player's number on the keypad, press ENTER and then press ENTER again. The ref will come and report the number of the player and the penalty so you should wait to hear from the ref before entering penalty.

• Once the ref gives you a number and a team for a 2-minute penalty press: PLAYER PENALTY, ENTER, number (i.e., "24"), ENTER, ENTER.

For penalty times other than 2 minutes, press PLAYER PENALTY, ENTER, then input player's number and press ENTER again, input the number of penalty minutes on the keypad and then press ENTER.

• E.g., If the ref gives you a number and a team for a 5-minute penalty press: PLAYER PENALTY, ENTER, number (i.e., "24"), ENTER, "500" or "5000", ENTER.

To clear a penalty (i.e., when the other team scores on a power play), press PLAYER PENALTY for the appropriate team then use the UP ARROW (or DOWN ARROW) and look at the score clock display reading to find the penalty you need to delete. (If there is just one penalty on the board, pressing the UP ARROW once will show you that penalty. If there's more than one penalty running for one team, pressing the UP ARROW twice will bring up the "oldest" penalty.) Make sure you delete the penalty with the least amount of time remaining.

After you've found the penalty you'd like to delete, press CLEAR and then ENTER.

Posting the Score

To add a goal, press the SCORE +1 key for the appropriate team. The ref will report to the clock/book each score and how it was scored.

To change the score, press SCORE -1 or +1 for the appropriate team

Changing Periods

The PERIOD keys work the same way as the SCORE keys.

POINTSTREAK

Terminal Log-In Information for CCYHA:

This is just a brief synopsis of basic Pointstreak terminal information. Please refer to the Point Streak manual for further information.

1. Login to Pointstreak

Press the On/Off button on the terminal or touch/click the screen to begin. Login with your username and password. Click the Pointstreak logo to login. Click Username and Password fields and enter characters using the onscreen keyboard. Click Login.

2. Set-up Game Information

Click each field to highlight and select item from drop down menu. Required: League, Division, Home Team, Away Team and Referee (Note: This screen can be accessed during the game via the Game Details option in the Game Menu). Click OK to save and continue with Home and Away.

3. Select Home / Away team players

Select a Goalie (one only) and select each Player by touching player's name. Touch again to deselect. Add a New player or Edit a highlighted player's details. Click Confirm after selecting and editing Home Team players. Repeat process with Away Team Roster (Note: Rosters can be accessed during the game by using the Home / Away Roster buttons on the terminal). Click field to edit. Enter data using the keyboard or keypad. Click OK.

4. Recording game events

- RECORD A GOAL: Press the Home or Away Goal button => Select Scorer, Assists, Period, Type of Goal and Score Clock Time => Click Save (Note: To edit a Goal or Penalty later in the game, double-click the entry in the Gamesheet view).
- RECORD A PENALTY: Press the Home or Away Penalty button => Select Player, Infraction, Severity, Period and Score Clock Time field => Click Save.
- RECORD A SHOT: Press the Home or Away Shot button. The number of shots for the team is incremented by one (Note: To edit team shots, click the number for the team, enter the number).
- CHANGE A GOALIE: Press Home or Away Roster => Select Goalie Roster => Select new goalie under "Available Goalies on the Team" and click on Add To Game => Select Period On and Time On => Save.

5. Finalize and post the game to website

- Review the game information for accuracy (to edit a game event, double-click the entry).
- Press the End Game button on the terminal => Select Game Complete => Enter in Username and Password => Select Send.
- A message saying "Sending data to server, please wait" will appear. When the Pointstreak logo is displayed, press the On/Off button to turn off the terminal.

Locker Rooms

The locker rooms need to have a locker room monitor at all times. Co-ed teams will need to ensure male and female locker rooms are monitored. Coaches and managers can be locker room monitors. Parents can be a locker monitor if they complete a background check and complete USA Hockey Safe Sport training. Safe Sport Training is free, and the background check is reimbursable.

Gear

- Rental gear can be checked out through the Club for a \$50 deposit
- Capitals Gear

Hockey Socks can be purchased through the Club for \$10

Name Bar, cost is \$5-10 and purchases can be coordinated through the Capitals Manager Liaison

Capitals may have additional gear for sale on a periodic/first come/first serve basis

The Capitals Website has link to Capitals gear

Questions/Chain of Command

- Parents should bring questions/concerns to the Team Manager to present to the coach(s).
 - Unresolved issues should be brought to the Discipline Chair, Safe Sport Liaison, President, Coach-in-Chief, or Coaching Committee Chair.
- Rostering and Registration questions go to the Registrar
- Ice Scheduling questions need to go the Schedular.
 - O Additional practice/game ice can be reserved at an additional expense to the parents/team.
- Team meetings - the team should host a pre-season meeting for a meet and greet, obtain documents, outline the season, exchange contact information, etc.
- Fundraising - the forms of fundraising include selling Wreaths, selling Qdoba coupon sheets, using Safeway or King Sooper gift cards, CFD money running, and other opportunities that arise
- On Ice Help - coaches must pass a background check, complete SafeSport, complete the USA
 Hockey age appropriate module, attend a USA Hockey coaching clinic, and be current with their
 USA Hockey coaching credentials.
- Volunteers everyone in the organization is a volunteer. No one is paid
- Expenses USA Hockey Coaching certification expenses are reimbursable. The Club may purchase training aids and equipment upon request.
