

Wildcats Storylines ...

MILESTONE ACHIEVED: With the Wildcats' win over Archbishop Moeller, Coach Chuck Kyle '69 now has more wins (351) than every other Saint Ignatius head coach combined (350).

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: The Wildcats play three of the four teams in Greater Catholic League (GCL) South this season. The Wildcats have defeated both Elder and Archbishop Moeller, and look to defeat St. Xavier on Saturday to claim bragging rights as the unofficial champs of the GCL. Moeller claimed the official title by defeating Elder on October 5, 24-21. Only once in program history have the Wildcats beaten three Cincinnati teams in one season – in 2008. The Wildcats defeated La Salle (50-0) and St. Xavier (19-16 in OT) in the regular season and Elder (28-20) in the state championship.

OL' RELIABLE: The Saint Ignatius passing attack has reliably provided the Wildcats with points during the team's six-game winning streak. The Wildcats have notched a passing touchdown in each of the last six contests. Quarterback Patrick Delahunty has thrown for 150 yards in each of the last 5 games, totaling 1,289 yards and 12 touchdowns on the season.

THREE YARDS AND A CLOUD OF DUST: Jahadge "Bo" Floyd and Jack Welcsh have toted the rock this season, wearing down defenders and opening space for the passing game. Floyd has 401 yards and 5 touchdowns on the year, while Welcsh has 284 yards and 4 scores. As a team, the Wildcats have reached the end zone 13 times via the ground, including at least once per game in the last five weeks.

UNDER PRESSURE: Since Tommy Eichenberg moved to middle line-backer in Week 3, the Wildcats' defense has been nearly unstoppable. Opponents have scored just 33 points, including just 7 against the Wildcats' starters. As a team, the Wildcats play a 3-3 stack, mixing up coverages under Defensive Coordinator Ryan Franzinger '02. The Wildcats will look to stop St. Xavier's run game without bringing a seventh man into the box and limiting pass coverage vs. the spread.

NO FLY ZONE: The Wildcats' secondary has heated up in recent weeks, shutting down the passing games of Euclid, Elder, and Moeller. The Wildcats allow just 5.3 yards per pass and 117.8 passing yards per game to opponents.

KICKING CANCER, ONE POINT AT A TIME: The Wildcats special teams unit has dedicated the 2018 season to raising money for pediatric cancer research. Teaming up with Kick-It for Cancer, the Wildcats have tallied 50 points and raised \$3,600 for the cause thus far this season. Since Matt Colella '14 began the Kick-It program, the Cats have helped Kick-It raise \$1 million for children's cancer research.

OFFERS: Several members of the Wildcats have received offers in recent weeks. Tommy Eichenberg drew offers from Ohio State and Michigan, Zach McMahan received one from Lake Erie College, and Pat Otter received a preferred walk-on offer from Louisville.

Learning about the Bombers ...

IN NEED OF A W: The 2018 Bombers find themselves in a situation similar to the 2016 season – with a 4-4 record entering the annual showdown vs. Saint Ignatius. In 2016, St. Xavier lost to Saint Ignatius but defeated Louisville St. Xavier to clinch a playoff spot. The Bombers won five straight playoff games to win the state title.

FAMILIAR FACE: The head coach of the Bombers and the head coach of the Wildcats know each other well. Coach Steve Specht and Coach Chuck Kyle are good friends and legendary competitors on the field. Since 2004, when Specht took over as St. Xavier's coach, the Bombers have a 9-6 record vs. Saint Ignatius.

SPREAD IT OUT: St. Xavier employs a spread offense, lining up universally in shotgun with 4-5 wide receivers. The Bombers' offense can balance the run and pass well, using run-pass options, jet sweeps, and zone reads to keep defenses guessing.

THE GUNSLINGER: Quarterback Wyatt Hudepohl leads the St. Xavier offense. The 6'3, 197-pound signalcaller has 1,397 yards, 13 touchdowns, and 8 interceptions through the air and 113 yards and 2 touchdowns on the ground. Hudepohl has a strong arm and is capable of finding running room on quarterback draws and RPO's.

PLAYMAKERS TO WATCH: St. Xavier has dangerous options on offense. Chief among them is Jared Kreimer. The 6'0, 177-pound playmaker can line up at wideout or quarterback, often runs jet sweeps, and serves as the punter. He leads the team with 31 receptions for 486 yards and 4 touchdowns. Chris Payne is the squad's top rusher (367 rushing yards, 5 TDs). Tight end Marshall Lang (294 yards and 2 TDs) and wideout Liam Clifford (193 yards, 4 TDs) are others to watch.

DEFENSIVE SCHEMING: Much like the Bombers utilize a 3-3 stack on defense. The approach makes it difficult for opponents, as the QB can't read the defense until after the play starts. The Bombers like to blitz and play man-free coverage. As a team, the Bombers have 3 defensive TDs this season.

DEFENDERS TO WATCH: St. Xavier's linebackers are the backbone of the defense, as Nathan Arthur and Thomas Kiessling lead the defense in tackles. Tucker Hundley is a beast in the secondary, with 2 interceptions and 27 solo tackles. Keep an eye on DBs Trevor Potts and B.J. Ferguson.

SPECIAL BATTLE: The Bombers have strong special teams. Kreimer is a rugby-style punter who has successfully faked punts this year. Kicker Joe Sullivan has only notched one field goal but is a perfect 15-of-15 on extra points.

TE JAKE LANG '20



A reliable red zone and middle-of-the-field target, Jake Lang is an important piece of the offense. The junior is a reliable option for QB Patrick Delahunty, offering a safety valve. Lang is also a solid blocker on run plays, helping to pave rushing lanes for Bo Floyd and Jack Welcsh. Look for Lang to make an impact vs. St. Xavier.

DL AIDAN WELLS '19



The Wildcats' two-way star caught his first career touchdown pass vs. Moeller and notched a tackle. As the season has evolved. Aidan Wells has developed into an important playmaker and leader for the Wildcats as a tight end and a defensive end. Wells will continue to play a crucial role vs. St. Xavier in attacking the ballcarrier and in creating open lanes for the Wildcats' rushers.

GAME PREVIEW

WILDCATS PREPARED FOR TRIP DOWN I-71 TO FACE ST. XAVIER

History repeats itself, as the old adage goes. The Wildcats sure wouldn't mind if it did on Saturday.

The Saint Ignatius Wildcats and St. Xavier Bombers enter Saturday's annual game in similar situations to 2016. The Wildcats enter with a 6-2 record following a big win over Moeller and a playoff spot nearly secured. The Bombers enter with a 4-4 mark looking for a win to clinch a playoff berth.

In 2016, the Wildcats defeated the Bombers at Ballaban Field, 31-14, springboarding the team to a deep playoff run. Despite the loss, St. Xavier won the next week and won five straight playoff games to capture the title.

Saturday's game will be important, with playoff implications for both squads in the 26th meeting of the Jesuit schools. The contest will also mark 20 straight seasons of the annual regular season game.

ST. XAVIER OFFENSE VS. SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE

As is tradition under head coach Steve Spect, a good friend of Wildcats' head coach Chuck Kyle '69, the Bombers run a spread offense. St. Xavier will run its offense exclusively from the shotgun, using 4-5 wide receiver formations.

Quarterback Wyatt Hudepohl leads the Bombers' attack. The junior anchors an offense that can effectively pass the ball downfield and keep you honest with a solid ground game. Hudepohl has 1,397 yards, 13 touchdowns, and 8 interceptions through the air, and 113 yards and 2 scores on the ground this year.

Hudepohl's top target is Jared Kreimer. The 6'0, 170-pound athlete can do it all – throw, run jet sweeps, catch passes, and even serves as a rugby-style punter. On the year, Kreimer has 241 yards and 3 touchdowns at QB, 104 rushing yards and a score as a RB, and 486 yards and 4 TDs as a WR.

Chris Payne leads the team in rushing with 367 yards and 5 touchdowns, adding 3 receiving TDs. The Bombers rely on the zone read and run-pass options to gain yards on the ground. Tight end Marshall Lang and wideout Liam Clifford are also players to watch for the Bombers.

On defense, the Wildcats will counter with the traditional 3-3 stack. Led by Tommy Eichenberg at middle linebacker, the team will use a variety of blitz packages and coverages to stop the spread.

As Coach Kyle believes, the most important thing in stopping the spread is shutting down the ground game with six defenders in the box.

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. ST. XAVIER

DEFENSE

Just like the Wildcats, St. Xavier employs a 3-3 stack on defense. And similar to the Wildcats' Linebacker Legion, the Bombers have a great corps of 'backers that form the soul of the defense.

Linebackers Nathan Arthur and Thomas Kiessling top the team in tackles and flow to the ball well. Ethan Lynch and Noah Taylor also rotate at linebacker for an aggressive defense that likes to blitz five players. The Wildcats' offensive line worked in practice this week to stop the "tidal wave," as Coach Kyle called it.

The 3-3 stack offers unique challenges for an offense, particularly in reading the defense after the snap. The quarterback must quickly diagnose the blitz to avoid losing yards.

St. Xavier's defensive backs also make things difficult for opponents. Defensive back Tucker Hundley has a knack for finding the ball, as the junior is third on the team in tackles and has two interceptions on the year. B.J. Ferguson and Nathan Stockman each have returned an interception for a touchdown, as has Arthur. The Bombers have recovered six fumbles on the year, too.

On offense, quarterback Patrick Delahunty has found his groove. The senior has passed for a touchdown in each of the six wins this season, along with 1,289 yards through the air. His offensive line has improved its pass protection, and Delahunty has the ability to scramble when he needs more time.

Running backs Jahadge "Bo" Floyd and Jack Welcsh have also benefitted from a hard-working offensive line. The duo can pound opponents and open space for the passing game to operate. The two will look to wear down the Bombers this week.

A myriad of options exist for Delahunty in the air, particurly multi-sport athletes Connor Cmiel and Jack Kennedy. Ethan Biacsi, Jake Lang, and Nate Conry are also reliable targets.

SAINT IGNATIUS SPECIAL TEAMS VS. ST. XAVIER SPECIAL TEAMS

Battles between the Wildcats and Bombers often come down to special teams. The Wildcats hope to have the upper hand in this one.

One challenge is St. Xavier's rugby-style punting, which poses coverage challenges and the possibility of the fake. The Cats will be preparing accordingly.

In the kicking game, the Bombers have only made one field goal, while the Wildcats converted four last week, two apiece by Rory McConville and Declan Mangan. Saturday's forecast calls for 18 mph winds, so field position will be crucial.

MOELLER RECAP

WILDCATS HELP PLAYOFF CAUSE WITH WIN OVER MOELLER

In a game with major playoff implications between powerhouse programs from Cincinnati and Cleveland with a combined 20 OHSAA State Championships, the Saint Ignatius Wildcats dominated the visiting Archbishop Moeller Crusaders, 32-7.

The teams started the game with punts. A trick flip from Jahadge "Bo" Floyd to Ethan Biacsi on the Wildcats' second drive kick-started the action. Moeller stood strong on defense following the big play, forcing a lengthy Saint Ignatius field goal. Declan Mangan converted the 50-yarder against the wind, an impressive kick to give the Wildcats a 3-0 lead with 5:23 left in the guarter.

The Wildcats defense again limited Moeller on the following drive. The offense started to drive down the field thanks to passes to Jack Kennedy and Jake Lang. But a Ryan Mullaney strip sack gave the football to the Crusaders on their own 32-yard line with 2:22 left in the first. On the very next play, the Wildcats' Anthony Gerace recovered a Moeller fumble on a running play, giving the offense the ball on the Moeller 32. The Wildcats managed some yards on a Delahunty to Cmiel pass, but Moeller stopped the hosts from picking up a first down. Declan Mangan still made Moeller pay, converting a 43-yard field goal with 2:22 left in the first. The score remained 6-0 Wildcats entering the second quarter.

With 8:04 left in the second, facing 4th and 1 on the Crusaders' 41-yard line, the Wildcats decided to go for it. Moeller stopped the Wildcats just short of the first down marker.

The Wildcats stood strong on defense. Jack Kennedy intercepted a long Moeller pass at the Wildcats' 23-yard line with 7:02 left in the half.

The teams traded the ball before Moeller's offense finally found traction with the run before beating the Cats over the top. Quarterback Malik Verdon floated a perfect pass over coverage to RJ Khayo in the nearside corner of the end zone. Moeller took the 7-6 lead with the extra point.

The Wildcats' Delahunty navigated the offense down the field in the waning moments of the half. Delahunty connected with Kennedy, Cmiel, and Jack Welcsh on clutch passes. Welcsh's reception was crucial. Forced to scramble, Delahunty found his trusty running back down the field. Welcsh bounced off several Moeller defenders and dashed to the 1-yard line. Following a timeout, Delahunty finished off the drive with a 1-yard strike across the middle to Aidan

Wells. The senior tight end's catch snatched the lead back, setting the Wildcats ahead 13-7 at half following a Rory McConville extra point.

On the second play from scrimmage in the second half, the Wildcats stripped the ball from the Crusaders. Welcsh recovered the fumble and fought through a number of would-be tacklers to the Moeller 11-yard line. On the next play, Delahunty dashed into the right side of the end zone. Nick Schwitzgebel and Jack Kennedy provided the key blocks on the read option. Delahunty's third rushing score of the game extended the Wildcats' lead to 19-7 before Moeller blocked the extra point.

The Wildcats' defense continued to impress on the next drive, forcing a quick Moeller punt. The Saint Ignatius offensive line went to work, paving the way for Floyd and Delahunty and a drive that ended with a 25-yard Rory McConville field goal to set the advantage at 22-7.

With two minutes left in the third quarter, Connor Cmiel picked off a Moeller pass at the 45-yard line. The junior corner followed an open seam to the left side into the end zone, following blocks by Anthony Gerace and others. McConville's PAT advanced the score to 29-7 Wildcats.

Despite a switch at quarterback, the Crusaders struggled against the Wildcats' defense. The front six continued to pressure the Crusaders' backfield, as Gerace, Tommy Eichenberg, Caden Campolieti, and others held firm. The Wildcats stopped the Crusaders on fourth and short late in the third quarter.

On the final play of the quarter, Delahunty found Jack Kennedy on a last-second pass for 17 yards, putting the Wildcats in scoring territory to end the third.

The Football Cats continued to pound Moeller's defense to begin the fourth quarter. A Floyd off-tackle run pushed the Cats to the Moeller 7-yard line. The Crusaders stood strong to keep the hosts out of the end zone, but McConville converted from 25 yards out, placing the score at 32-7.

On its ensuing drive, Moeller tried to pass the ball, but the Linebacker Legion prevented Moeller from earning any yards. A failed Moeller punt gave the Wildcats the ball at the Moeller 31-yard line with six minutes remaining.

With time dwindling, the Wildcats burned clock with short passes and runs. Following a turnover on offense, the Wildcats' defense once again stepped up to thwart the Moeller attack, ending the game at 32-7.

Built in 1962, Tom Ballaban Field at St. Xavier Stadium has seen many great teams play on its field, as the Bombers have fielded some impressive teams.

However, by the late-1990s, the field had begun to deteriorate, as the facility did not have stadium lights, had a grass playing surface, and a seating capacity of under 4,000.

Then in 2000, the school and athletic department began a capital improvement campaign of \$3.6 million for a new football stadium and athletic facility. In 2004, St. Xavier completed the project, as the newly constructed Ballaban Field was opened to the public.

When opened, Ballaban Field was one of the best athletic facilities not just in the Cincinnati region, but all of Ohio. The seating capacity was increased to nearly 7,000, lights were added, and artificial turf was installed.

The facility also now includes a state-of-theart press box, which can accomodate nearly 40 members of the media, along with coaches and game day staff.

In addition to football, Ballaban Field houses soccer, lacrosse, and rugby at St. Xavier.

The namesake of the stadium is legendary Bombers head coach Tom Ballaban, a 1951 graduate, who played offensive line there and began teaching and coaching football in 1953. He accrued a 142-91-8 record in a quarter-century as head coach.

Wildcats avenge state title loss, downing the Bombers at Byers

PARMA - The 8-1 Saint Ignatius Wildcats defeated the previously undefeated and state's top-ranked St. Xavier Bombers, 28-14, and ended defending state champion and Associated Press Poll Division 1 top ranked Saint Xavier's 14 game winning streak, 28-14. Saint Ignatius avenged last year's 27-20, double-overtime loss to St. Xavier in the state title game.

Saint Ignatius' defense limited the Bombers to a net 31 yards on the ground. The Wildcats, behind 215 yards rushing off 36 carries by tailback Jahadge "Bo" Floyd, totaled 269 rushing yards.

Jahadge opened the scoring with a 75-yard touchdown burst off a third-down-and-5 from the Wildcats' 25-yard line with 2 minutes and 33 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Kicker Matthew Trickett added the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

The Bombers quarterback Chase Wolf passed for 203 yards. Wolf was 19-for-43 with a TD pass, a 2-point conversion throw and one interception.

Saint Ignatius quarterback Danny Alexander passed for 97 yards, including a 31-yard touchdown strike to wide receiver Sammy Snyder that led to a 14-0 Wildcats lead early in the second quarter, and Danny rushed for 67 yards and scored on runs of 10 and 3 yards.

Linebacker Tommy Eichenberg's sack on Wolf resulted in a fumble recovery by defensive end Bradley Andrich. That play led to Alexander's 10-yard TD with 6:18 left in the third quarter and gave the Wildcats some breathing room after St. Xavier scored on a 21-yard touchdown pass from Wolf to receiver Andrew Wittrock late in the first half

Eichenberg made a diving interception at the Bombers' 28. Three plays later, Alexander, went untouched into the end zone from 3 yards out. Trickett's PAT was good, and Saint Ignatius held a 28-6 lead with 5:54 remaining in the third quarter. The 'Cats turned the Bombers away after Wolf scored on a short TD run and added a 2-point conversion pass to senior Cameron Specht with 8:59 left to play.
