- Conducted end of season coaches wrap up meetings
 - o Mite 1-4 3/23 (9 coaches attended)
 - o JR Mite & Mite 5-12 3/29 (11 coaches attended)
 - Well received 2nd year. Feedback to do more often and at ALL levels
- Held Mites to Squirts Parent Meeting 3/29
 - o 10 families attended
 - o 2nd year of this meeting and goal is to help with retainage of players and debunk rumors about Squirts (cost, commitment, tryouts)

 - o Great feeder for kids which was the initial plan but an indirect result is it has created more coaches out of the gate for JR Mites.

Peewees:

AA TEAM:

From the head coaches, Matt Knutson and Rob Ruprecht:

We had a successful 22-23 PeeWee AA season. We had a few challenges with sickness and injuries at the beginning and end of the season but made it through the bulk of the season. We saw a steady incline of improvement from the start of the season, and we played our best at the end of the season when it counted the most. We had most of our players play both on offense and defense, teaching them the concepts of both so they understand the position they're playing from both sides of the puck.

We finished the season 19-23-5. Except for the 4 returning PWAA's this was likely the most competitive schedule these boys have played, with playing District 10 teams during our regular season. Many of the games we lost or tied, could have easily gone either way.

We were competitive in all our tournaments this year. STMA provided high quality games, we would recommend this one again. The Paul Bunyan International tournament was good and overall, the teams favorite, winning the international division. A well-run tournament and staying at Rutger's was a perfect fit for the team(nice rooms, good gather-community spaces, and a restaurant attached). Woodbury provided us a very challenging schedule with many of the tops teams that made it into the state tournament. We would do this tournament again as well, to compete against top level teams. The district tournament this year was good, the boys played well ending up finishing first and making it into regions. Regions had very good competition and was an awesome experience for these boys to participate in. Winning our first game against Elk River, then

losing a close one to Chaska-Chanhassen, and playing a tough game and losing against Stillwater. The boys understand that the season doesn't have to stop with District play and District playoffs. These boys all progressed well over the season, and we believe the improvements they have made have positioned them well for their next levels.

One item we would change is to add a few more double games/scrimmages leading up to the end of the season, to have the team prepared for playing multiple games during districts and regions.

Things I would like to see SCYHA consider:

- Having teams selected sooner than we currently do.
 - ∘By the time we play our first games, most associations are already 5-10 games in.
 - oScheduling scrimmages can be harder, especially at the B levels as a lot of teams have already locked in a good chunk of theirs
- Take advantage of the fact that we don't have to have rosters locked in until 12/31 of each year (and only do this for your top 2 teams at the Peewee and Bantam levels. All other teams are set after tryouts):
 - oWe have all been part of teams where skaters try out poorly or try out well and end up on teams that don't allow the player to truly maximize their potential for that season (either playing above their heads and fall behind or playing at a level where the competition does not push them to their max potential). My oldest son played at Peewee AA his 2nd year, and in all honesty if there had been roster shuffling, he probably would not have stayed on that team.

oIf we have preliminary teams set by October 1st and have final rosters locked in by November 15th, it would give coaches for the top two teams the time to evaluate players for 6 weeks after tryouts to ensure that SCYHA does all we can to put skaters in a spot where they have the best chance to succeed.

Top 2 teams practice together for those 6 weeks and coaches are able to shuffle rosters as needed to evaluate kids.

B2 TEAM:

From Head Coach, Craig Boyle:

In all it was a good season. We had our issues, We had our up and downs, We had frustrations, and We had a very interesting group of kids again this year. At times it was very tough to watch and it was even tougher to keep the skaters engaged. Had to become a very good back checking team. I will not get into why. Each of you know that answer. We didn't fair to well in the tournaments we were in. Our First one down in Egan was a blow out. We played a lot of cities teams that were more like B1 teams. Our second tournament was in Sauk Center. Again, we were out of our league at this one too. This was an open "B" tournament. Other than us and Jamestown. All the rest were B1 teams. Our Third tournament was in Elk River. This one was more of our style. We were able to compete at this one. For district playoffs, With D5 rearranging two of the teams we went from ranking 3rd to the ranking 1st for the playoffs. We went 2 and 2. Beat Sartell 13 to 1 in our first game and put up 79 shots to their 3. Beat Monticello in our second game 3 to 0. Put up 50 shots to their 9. Then it all went downhill. We lost the next 2. Boys did not show up to play.
