National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

September 30, 2022

September 30th is the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation is a federal statutory holiday which gives the public a chance to recognize and commemorate the intergenerational harm that residential schools have caused to Indigenous families and communities, and to honour those who have been affected by this injustice. The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation responds to the 94 calls to action presented by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. **Towards Reconciliation** / Commemoration **call #80**:

We call upon the federal government, in collaboration with Aboriginal peoples, to establish, as a statutory holiday, a National Day for Truth and Reconciliation to honour Survivors, their families, and communities, and ensure that public commemoration of the history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process.

The Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association stands in solidarity with truth and reconciliation, affirms the calls to action, and requests that all schools make time on September 30th to recognize the significance of this day and engage in reconciliation.
