These numbers represent our total registrations. They do not take into account move-ups or players that quit after registration. Studies done by Minnesota Hockey have shown that only about 30% of the players who register as mini-mites are still playing as bantams, so we need to continue to focus on recruiting new players into the association.

We have plateaued our Mite-age numbers slightly due to increased recruitment and reducing fees at these levels.

Rostering the younger level teams was a struggle this year due to lack of birth certificates from a number of families. We'll need to require these for Mites and Mini Mites in December moving forward.

Hockey Operations – Pat O’Leary

From a Hockey Operations perspective, the primary responsibilities of the position are to drive the Coach Selection and Tryout processes, as well as provide ongoing training for our coaches, players and families utilizing the tools and programs provided by Minnesota Hockey. All of these processes were run in a fashion similar to past years.

Coach Selection entailed formation of Coach Selection committees at each of the age levels (with the exception of the Mite levels, in which coaches were determined by the Mite Coordinator). The Age Level Coordinators (i.e. Girls, Squirt, Pee Wee, Bantam and Jr. Gold) chaired the committees. Sitting members of the committees included two additional board members, two at-large members of the association and the Eagan High School coach.

Hockey operations also solicits end of season feedback from coaches and EHA families to further improve EHA processes. As has been the case for the past couple years, meetings will take place with the coaches over the course of the month of April to share feedback resulting from this past season that will be used as input for the upcoming season. These have become a great tool to receive feedback from all coaches to improve our teams.

The Tryout process was similarly run in a fashion as in years past. Similar to the Coach Selection committees, the Tryout Committee contains two board members and two at-large members from the association. It is chaired by the Director of Hockey Operations. The process continues to rely heavily on the utilization of independent, outside evaluators to help ensure that the process is as fair to all participants as possible. Something we continued for this season to the tryout process was to run the tryouts over a longer period of time, in an attempt to prevent conflicts with fall sports (e.g. football, volleyball, soccer, school trips.) . This again seemed to help with all fall conflicts. It is impossible to avoid all conflicts but we are trying to avoid as many as possible and make the tryouts as smooth on the kids as possible.

The tryout committee does continue to look at ways to improve the tryout process; we are always open to any feedback on the process.

Hockey Operations also continues to stay involved in all complaints from different directions. This includes parent/coach/player issues, district issues and anything that needs to be resolved to make the season a success for the kids.

Ice Report – Stephan Randall

This year, we continued the agreements with Ramsey County and Inver Grove Heights that were started during the 2012-2013 season.

An Ice Committee was formed again this year, and reviewed all schedules in advance of publication.

The total ice spend was \$293,319 vs. the original budget of \$291,851. The variance was caused by the additional teams that went to Regional and State tournaments and required additional ice, per policy, to prepare for the tournaments.

Recruiting and Retention – Scott Gephart

The results of our recruiting and retention are not reflected in our numbers, we continue to see slight decrease in overall numbers in both boys and girls. Some of the activities that we have implemented this year:

Grassroots marketing:

- In September we did a grass roots blitz at the Blue Cross soccer fields one Saturday to get the word out.
- Lil' Wild program has Eagan as a host location. We handed out flyers and information to Eagan families participating in that.
- Incentives for Eagan families to have USA hockey fee waived for one player if they recruit a new family with a child that plays.

Partner with USA and MN Hockey regarding the 2 & 2 Challenge:

- This requires that we organize and conduct at least 2 suggested events.
- EHA hosted both Try Hockey for Free events and did a season kickoff. Thanks to Tracy Olson for organizing the kickoff. For each of the Try Hockey events we had 40 + participants from Eagan and surrounding communities.

- The result of these programs are grants from USA hockey for free starter equipment. The Association has more than 20 full sets that we loan to the Mite prep and 1 levels as needed.

Pre and Post season programs:

- Paul Brown did a great job partnering with the Eagan Learn to Skate program and getting that incorporated into our Mite program.
- Julie Parish, Heather Bronwell were instrumental in keeping the momentum going with the Girls program through Pig Tails and Pucks, and a post season clinic with a summer sendoff party.

Conclusion: While these programs and efforts reduce our exposure to the decline in numbers our most important recruiting efforts are through word of mouth from our existing members with potential new players. It is important that we continue make the mite program experience positive and affordable. We need to work with and educate the younger families to help bring in other families.

Player Development – Erik Anderson

We started the year offering our annual “fall clinics” including on ice sessions for each level. The clinics were again run by the girls EHS coaching staff for the girls and the High School Boys staff for the boys. The boy’s sessions were well attended and again received positive feedback on how they were run. The girl’s sessions were better attended than the previous year. Hockey Operations and I also offered a contact confidence checking clinic as a refresher for those heading to Bantams for the first time.

Devenir Goaltending was hired this year as our goalie instructors and did a fantastic job. Having a female instructor was a great shot in the arm for our girls program. We’re excited as we look towards our 2nd year partnering with Devenir.

We had a preseason mandatory “coach the coaches” on-ice session. Mike Taylor and I hosted the event that included how to implement the ADM hockey model and sharing best practices for all our coaches. We had separate meetings for both mites/squirts then another for Pee Wee’s/Bantams. The idea was to improve our quality control, to make sure that our coaches were teaching the proper techniques. We had a fantastic turnout and we will continue to grow as coaches and as an association.

We continued to promote Sweet Hockey and the benefits of dryland training with Lance Pitlick’s program.

We added more tools for our Dryland facility including more hurdles and plyometric bags to offer the best off-ice training available. We also provided all the coaches with a locker filled with balls, pucks and cones for use in the dryland facility without having to bring their own. While we received great feedback, the association lost most of the balls and pucks during the year from theft.

Our Wednesday night squirt transition sessions were provided again last the year. These sessions are designed to give our mite 3’s more ice time, give them a taste of squirt level practices, teach off-sides and put them in full ice situations to prepare them for Squirts next year.

- While the value of having the Girls and Boys teams fulfill the volunteer hours was huge, we should reevaluate if it's worth the \$5K per event cost, this will be difficult based on the 2014/15 precedent but something the board should discuss
- Really struggled to get PeeWee B2 teams for Thanksgiving shootout, we only had 5 this years due to dropping #s
- Need to have announcers at all final round games to announce penalties, game scoring, etc... (feedback from visiting team)
- Timing of hosted events – it's going to be tough to change based on the overall activities in our district and surrounding but the Thanksgiving and New Year's weekends are tough to give up from a board and volunteer perspective
- We need to coordinate with Mark Vaughn to ensure concessions are open during all scheduled tournament games. They were not always there @ the early games and fans let us know how disappointed they were about that.

Marketing/Sponsorship/Fundraising – Thomas Manzella

For the 5th year we had our Pasta Feed Fundraiser hosted by the Eagan Green Mill. Again the turnout continues to be fantastic with excellent participation. With the exception of the Jr Gold and Mite teams, all teams provided baskets up for raffle. We had over 25 baskets with a variety of themes from video games, date nights, wine tasting, restaurants from Eagan, hotel packages, cash boxes, Wild tickets, Gopher tickets, etc. This year we raised around \$ 2,000 for EHA.

The Eagan Hockey Open House event at the Eagan Civic Arena for the opening of the hockey season continues to grow and get bigger each year. There were donated door prizes, food, cotton candy, music, light show, face painting and a visit from the Minnesota Wild Mascot, Nordy. There was a great turnout for this event. Many thanks to all the volunteers who helped pull the event together.

Again this year, in partnership with the High School Booster Clubs for the boys and girls HS Hockey teams, we held EHA Jersey Day. This was an excellent success with a fun day of hockey for all and the opportunity to meet the HS Players and have autographs signed, pictures taken, little chipper games, etc.

Historically EHA has required all hockey families to participate in an annual fundraiser. For the 2014/2015 season there was no requirement. The EHA Board is reviewing the need for a fundraiser requirement for future seasons and what potential options could be. More information will be communicated out to the association membership as soon as a decision is made by the board.

Girl's Program – Rick Thissen

While the most of the team's win-loss record may not reflect it, I feel that this year was a better year for our girls than it was over last year. The girls got better, they had fun, were in many of the game that they played and had some successes at the end of the year to carry them over into next year.

This year we carried 5 teams within the program, one each at the levels 14A, 12A, 12B, 10A and 10B. Our registrants at the 8u level were too low to field a team.

At the 14A level we started the off-season with the thought that we would be fielding two teams at this level. Based on a number of girls on the High School teams leaving their program, more girls that were eligible for the 14 team(s) elected to try-out for the High

School teams and a number were selected to play. Over the summer I had been in consistent contact with coordinators from neighboring associations and parents of 14u eligible players looking to Eagan for an opportunity to play since their home associations did not field a team at this level. Those connections allowed us to bring in 5 players from the Sibley association fairly quickly to augment the team. I was glad to have concerned parents at this level and the input from the players and parents on the group of players that we did partner with. I feel that this level will continue to struggle with unknown factors that will influence the number of girls that will go to the High School program, leaving the 14 team with too many or not enough players. The EHA board should come to a consensus to have a singular vision on girls at this level to continue to play in the 14 program or to try-out for the High School teams.

The girls on the 12A team continued the successes from last year when both our 12A and 12B teams earned berths into the state tournament. This year's 12A team was the only team in recent memory to have won the District and then won the District tournament earning them the number one seed from D8 in the Region tournament. The team also won the Hopkins tournament as well as the Anoka tournament and finished in second place in the Stillwater Skate for the Roses tourney. The only losses by this set of girls were against teams that were eventually State tournament teams. This group of girls has been mostly intact as teammates since the first year of 8u hockey. I would like to see them remain with the EHA association staking in the 14 program where they have a good chance of continued success. Based on having a single goalie in the 12u program during the off-season we brought in a goalie and allowed for her to be part of the try-out process resulting in her making the 12A team. This does stress the fact that we need to continue to develop girl goalies within our own program to avoid a need to look elsewhere.

The 12B team did not have the best record, but this set of girls did make a big improvement from last year. The games this year had more scoring on our part and we gave up far less goals against. We are on the right path. Based on so many players and people that have made great contributions to their teams I was not going to name names within this update, but on this team there are two girls that I will need to call out Andrea Rarick and Olivia Kawlewski. Andrea was a seventh grader but also a first year player proving wrong that the old adage that if you didn't start hockey by 8u it is too late. It was great to see her progress from the first pre-tryout clinics to the end of the year. Olivia put the team on her shoulders when she stepped up, strapped on the pads and skated between the pipes. Much appreciated girls. This group will need to continue to develop. Olivia stepping up this year re-affirms my comments made in the 12A section of needing to develop goalies within our program.

While there weren't many tangible items for the 10A team to show success, it was all the intangible items that show that this group is headed in the right direction and doing the right things. They improved over last year and are working hard and having a blast. I am very pleased that we are starting to see more girls at this group playing goalie. This group also has a very engaged set of parents who put forth the effort in the off-season to augment training and make this a better year for the girls. I would like to see continued work off-season and taking advantage of programs that are being discussed within the Girl's Committee.

On the 10B team they had mixed results of wins and losses and were in most of the games. This is a great group of girls to be around, they are engaged in hockey and things associated with it. I would run into this set of girls at many of the functions for the High School teams or other EHA teams, they always had a smile on their face, their hockey sweater or sweat shirt on, true representatives of EHA. The girls did take second place in the Rochester tournament this year. This group will need to continue to develop in the off-season and continue in the positive direction they are travelling.

With the projected number lower for the 10u level this up-coming year I foresee concern over the level of play for this group of girls and it will not be an easy decision to be made.

At the 8u level this year our registration numbers were very low, I made the decision to have the registered girls skate in the Mite program with the boys. There is not an easy fix for this, we will have to look to do what we can to get the girls to skate in the girls program. A talented girl skater is one of many talented skaters on a boys' team, but that same girl may be a difference maker on a girls' team. At the 10u level one or two talented skater can carry a team allowing all the other girls to develop and then see success at the later years. Proof of this can be found with our current 9th graders through our current 7th graders. Recruitment efforts will need to continue to augment this age group to get the numbers up.

The girl's program has a very good set of engaged parents, thank you to all that have given me "constructive criticism" over the past year. Coming from this group of parents is the Girl's Committee created to address the needs and concerns around the girls program. In my opinion this committee is the best thing to happen to the girl's program in a number of years. I look forward to its continued success.

Mite Program Prep/1 – Paul Brown

The 2014-15 Mite Prep/1 season was a tremendous success based on the feedback I have received from parents. There was significant improvement from the beginning of the season, and all of the credit goes to the skilled group of coaches we had this year. They are why we see annual improvement in EHA, and I want to personally thank them from their time commitment and talents.

The introduction of the Learn to Skate program was very popular, as many children signed up for the lessons provided by the City of Eagan. EHA paid for the fees, and based on the feedback, we will look at expanding it next season.

Players and parents enjoyed mild temperatures for the mid-season outdoor jamboree. Everyone seemed to have fun, and the booster club gets kudos for another successful event. We will likely shorten the duration slightly next year down to three games.

The yearend jamboree went well, and it was nice to have all games the West rink. It appeared that many grandparents and relatives were in attendance. We will also likely shorten this event as well.

Finally, the booster club went above and beyond by pulling together the year-end party. I believe it something you all enjoy, but it is an effort that belongs to you the parents. We are a volunteer organization that depends on your contributions and talents, so please volunteer next year when the requests come. It has been a pleasure to work for you this year.

Mite Program 2/3 - Matt Leegwater

This season, EHA had 79 skaters participate in the Mite 2/3 program during the 2014/2015 season. There were 6 teams that included some female athletes as well. We had a great group of coaches who gave their time and energy to help your children learn and enjoy the game. Thank you to all of the coaches and team support roles that were filled by other parents. You did a remarkable job with the teams!

****Original SIX League –** For the second season, we ran a structured mini league for the mite 2/3's. It was once more, a huge success. All original six NHL teams were represented with actual team colors for both jerseys and socks all the way up to the helmets with team stickers. All teams played ten half-ice format games. The bantams helped out in a big way by donning the Zebras and were the referees for the league. This year was the first season using the USAH half board rink divider system and it made a big difference for the games and gave the games more of an authentic rink feel for the kids.

We continued our strong support of the USA Hockey's American Development Model (ADM) that stresses small area games and skills repetition. The skills kids are developing from the USA Hockey provided plans are reinforcing skills they will use throughout their playing career. The team concept we are also fostering builds camaraderie and friendships that we will last beyond hockey seasons.

The Squirt Transitions program was again a success with 29 kids participating. We owe a special thank you to Erik Anderson who directed the majority of the training on the ice. Thank you also to the mite coaches who helped out by putting in extra time to help Erik.

Our mid-winter Outdoor Jamboree was a success again this year and went off as scheduled with no issues. By coincidence, it was on Hockey Day Minnesota and that just added to the fun. Special thanks go to the High School teams for making themselves available to the kids and for some of our members who helped coordinate and run the on ice activities.

The Power Paw Jamboree was a great event. The kids all had a chance to play against their league rivals in a mini-round robin tournament. The kids and parents all seemed to really enjoy the day.

A very special thanks needs to be given to Amy Lupich. She planned, organized, and executed a year end party for all of the mites at the Eagan Civic Arena. It included disco style free skating on the West rink and turf games on the East rink with the State Tournament Semi-Final on a TV in the party room. There was pizza and other treats for the kids and a cash bar for adults.

Many thanks to the Booster Club for all the work they do for both Jamborees. I want to specifically thank Amy Lupich for her leadership and long hours leading the team of volunteers that make these events and our season so enjoyable.

Parents, I want you encourage you to provide feedback in the upcoming survey. This is your program for your children, so please help me represent your interests. Also, please think about coaching and volunteer opportunities for next year. We need your help.

Squirt Program - Brett Gugino

This year's squirt program was comprised of 4 teams, one A, two B and one C team. All teams this year finished out the year under .500 which is a benchmark that has been used in years past to evaluate the success of the season. Based on final season records this season would seem on paper as a disappointment, however, the feedback received through the survey sent to each team has initially indicated an overall positive experience.

Looking closer at the teams match-ups and you will see that across all 4 teams there were many cases in which teams lost to the same team twice but in their second/third matchups the gap was significantly reduces when looking at the goal differential. Another indicator that goes beyond win/loss is the feedback received from the coaches and parent survey which both indicate that they believe their teams continued to develop throughout the season and in most cases were competitive.

A lot of positive feedback was received about the tournaments that were selected for each of the teams. This was the first year that the Fargo Tourney offered a C level tourney and again there was great feedback form the teams that participated. This tourney is certainly a highlight every year for those teams that get to participate, we wish we could send all of our squirt teams to this tourney but unfortunately they limit the number of teams per level that are accepted.

Feedback regarding the coaching overall was very positive with a few issues mentioned in the end of year survey that we will look for opportunities to reduce these in the future. The time and commitment to the kids and the program by the coaches was overwhelmingly appreciated.

Recommendations/Concerns for next year:

1. Consider once again the number of teams at each level to improve the experience for the kids. This is determined post tryouts based on the numbers of kids and the overall talent level of the kids.
2. Consider periodic meetings with the head coaches to gauge the team progress and to also ensure that any issues are being communicated.
3. Continue to monitor each of the teams by attending their practices and/or games to keep a pulse on each of the team's progress.
4. Consider integrating paid coaches at the squirt level
5. From what we know today there is going to be issues next year with the number of goalies that will be available for each of the teams, consider inviting outside Eagan goalies and possibly allowing Mite goalies to play with the squirts.

Once we have received survey feedback from all of the squirt teams we will share in more details the results.

Pee Wee Program – Kyle Koch

We had 5 teams this season at the Pee Wee level -- one A, two B1, one B2 and one C. The A and B1 teams were very competitive this year with no team finishing under 500 which is a good indication that we placed all the teams correctly. The B2 Team was very close to being 500 but had some challenges early in the season that they had to over-come. We also had some challenges at the C level in the form of wins and losses. However the C Team showed great progress at the end of the season with a Consolation Championship win in Hastings. This is another good sign that the kids were progressing during the season.

We were very light on PW goalies again this season with one goalie per team; needless to say, concerns regarding one goal were the topic for every team. I'm happy to say that we made it through the season with all goalies.

One of the highest achievements we have at the PW level this year is our PW B1 Green team finishing 3rd at state! Most of the feedback has been positive but there were issues that needed resolution:

1. At the PWB2 level we had a young paid coach that had challenges with teaching the ADM. Unfortunately we had to remove him as head coach and transition him to assistance coach at the Bantam level. Lucky for us we had several parents step-up and coach the team.
2. There were several different concerns at the PWA level which ranged from Ice Time, Tournament Selection and Completion of play. The Board addressed all these issues but explaining the dynamic of each item and overall I believe most of the parents were satisfied.

Overall each team showed strong growth through-out the season and the feedback seem to indicate that the boys all had fun. All the coaches were amazing to work with, they responded to requests promptly and any area of concern was always immediately addressed. Most of feedback from parents echo's my feelings as well. There were a few concerns regarding parent assistant coaches showing transparencies between their own kids and others. This may be an area we as an association look at to see if we can better equip/assess our assistant coaches.

As last year, I sent out team status updates to all PW parents with the intent to try and keep everyone informed. This also provided an easy mechanism for submitting and feedback they had. Overall the response was very positive.

Recommendations:

1. Continue to build on goalie recruitment.
2. Provide areas for improvement after try-outs for each kid that coaches could focus on (The thought here is if a child make a B1 team what skill did they score low on that would help them make an A team).

Team Updates:

PWAA – Coach Tom Schadegg – The Teams overall record was above 500. The team was the Winter Classic Champion in EP and Headwaters Champions in Bemidji.

PWB1 Blue – Coaches Mario Munoz and Patrick Sparks – The teams overall record was above 500 with a 2nd Place finish in our Eagan tournament and a 3rd Place finish in Bemidji.

PWB1 Green – Coach Steve Cronkhite - had a wonderful season with a 26-10-5 record. I know Coach Steve is very proud of his players not only of their record but of their growth as players. They had several highlights starting with a 1st place finish in Somerset and ending with a 3rd place finish at State.

PWB2 Blue -Coach Scott Colbert –The team had a great year with a current record of 16-11-6. The team had a good tournament against great competition in Duluth with a 500 record, plus 3 games decided by 1 goal and a forth by 2 goals.

Bantam Program – Han Hoppe

This year's team breakdown was 1 AA team, 2 B1 teams, 2 B2 teams and 1 C team comprising a total of 81 Skaters and 8 Goaltenders in the 14/15 Bantam program. The numbers were up this season compared to last year's group which had 5 teams of 71 skaters and 10 goalies.

Eagan hosted three Bantam tournaments during the season, Thanksgiving (Bantam B2), New Years (Bantam B1) and the Bantam

AA/A District 8 Tournament. I'd like to extend a hearty thank you to those of you who helped make these tournaments a success. By the way; the Eagan teams had some great successes in the Thanksgiving and New Years tournament but showed they were great hosts by letting the visitors win.

The team qualified for the East Regions where it fell in the semi finals to a very strong Edina team. They AA team had an excellent season.

The team's district record was 3-8-5, which put them in 7th place (8-14-4 overall). This group of players had their season end too soon. Hard work from day one had them hoping for a deep playoff run but a tough OT loss in the first round of the District 8 playoff ended that dream. The team won first place in the Red Wing tournament. Despite some adversity, the boys learned a lot about themselves and the hard work they need to put in everyday to get better and compete.

They posted an 11-1-4 record in District 8 (30-10-5 overall), which gave them a tie for 1st place. The team ended up 2nd in the D8 playoffs and qualified for Regions. The B1 Green team won the South Region in convincing fashion and qualified for State where it had a solid performance. They also brought some hardware home from the tournaments they played in. Overall a very strong season for the B1 Green team that saw them play on the last very day of the season competing at the State tournament.

Bantam B2 Blue team was coached by parent coach Derek Kottke. The team posted a District record of 9-5-2 for a 5th place finish. The boys had a fun season and the coaches focused on individual skill development throughout the season. The Eagan Blue team had a great District tournament as they made it to the semi-finals.

Bantam B2 Green team was coached by parent coach Pat O'Leary. The team posted a District record of 3-10-3 for a 9th place finish. The boys had a fun season and, like the Blue team, the coaches focused on individual skill development throughout the season. The Green team brought home some hardware with the 2nd place in the Prairie Showdown tournament.

Bantam C team was again coached by parent coach Todd Haglund. The team posted a District record of 2-11-3 for an eleventh place finish in league play. The team had a great season despite the wins and losses. The team progressed as the season went along. They managed to win 3rd place in the White Bear Lake tournament but they obviously saved the best for last by winning Districts in an unbeaten run. They obviously peaked at the right time and saw a great end to a great season.

Gambling Report – Sue Downey

Eagan Hockey Association's Charitable Gambling currently employs 29 people who run pulltabs and bingo in five establishments in Eagan. Support of these five establishments is crucial in keeping our charitable gambling program successful.

- Ansari's has a pulltab booth open daily at 11:00 a.m. and has bingo every Wednesday at 7:00p.m.
- Cooper's Bar and Restaurant has pulltabs behind the bar during the day and a pulltab booth Tuesday – Sunday opening at 5:00p.m. Bingo is held on Thursday nights at 7:00p.m.
- Saga has a pulltab booth open every day starting at 3:00 p.m. and has bingo Tuesday night at 7:00p.m.
- Wildcats have pulltabs open daily at 11:00 a.m., and have bingo every Monday and Wednesday night at 7:00p.m.
- Lone Oak Grill, which we just opened March 1st has the pulltab booth open every day starting at 11:00 a.m.

Eagan Hockey Charitable Gambling has donated over \$300,000 this year from the proceeds of the five establishments. This has been the best year that we have ever had. Much of the money has gone towards ice bills and the \$35,000/year commitment that we have with the city of Eagan for the dry land facility. Historically and again this year, \$8,000 was donated to the Eagan Foundation for four scholarships that are given to two senior male hockey players and two senior female hockey players. Equipment, other youth sports, and arena improvements are other areas that received donations from our Charitable Gambling. Because of our success this year, Eagan Hockey Association families did not have to do a fundraiser. Distributions of the gambling funds are voted on at the monthly board meetings. All distributions are listed in the monthly board meeting minutes and available for all association members to view.

2015 Voting Process

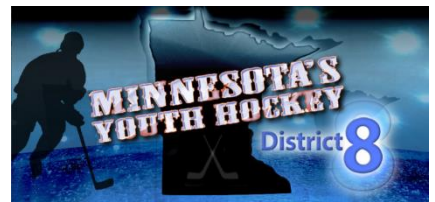
