


MISSION STATEMENT

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT

Fun and skill development are the focal points starting at 8U hockey. As the child progresses through the age spectrum from Mite through High School, competitiveness gradually increases, while inclusiveness generally decreases.



ATHLETE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

CYH Member Athletes have access during the hockey season to the CYH Athlete Assistance Program (AAP) at no cost. The AAP was created as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic to address the negative impacts associated with desocialization and the de-structuring of athlete's normal day to day routines - no inperson school, no lunch time with buddies, no recess, no structure - and its unknown impact on our young athletes.

The service is completely anonymous, and an athlete can receive up to three (3) one-hour counseling sessions through the AAP to discuss challenges facing an athlete. The AAP remained an active option for CYH athletes during 2022-2023.

Due to a tragic event that occurred during the 2022-2023 season, we did have membership take advantage of the AAP. For that, the CYH Board of Directors is thankful for our associated therapist providing services to the organization and for members having the courage to take advantage of the services offered.

SPORTSMANSHIP & ZERO TOLERANCE

Youth sports are a great opportunity for a child to build self-esteem and learn fundamental skills. It is also an opportunity for adults to become positive role models and to teach the value and importance of good sportsmanship. Our priority is development, not winning. Our club philosophy is long term player development, and again, winning is not the only goal. CYH wants you to enjoy the great game of hockey, and we are providing this information to assist n gaining a greater understanding of player development and the game of hockey.

Incidents involving aggressive and unacceptable behavior towards players, parents, coaches and referees has increased in recent years, leading CYH to adopt a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY. This policy applies to all coaches, players, parents and other supporters and referees effective immediately. Drinking excessive alcohol, smoking (including vaping), or use of illegal substances is prohibited during CYH practices, games, or events. Abusive and obscene language, violent play, violent conduct, fighting, and other behavior (including but not limited to sarcasm, gesturing, taunting, etc.) will not be tolerated during any CYH event. Ultimate responsibility for the actions of coaches, players, parents and spectators resides with the CYH membership.

It is the responsibility of the CYH Members to provide referee support and positive spectator interactions. This policy applies at all times prior to, during, and after games, practices or other team events, at the hockey rink, team hotels and/or other facilities supporting or hosting events in which CYH membership is participating.

2022-2023 DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE SUMMARY

- One (1) formal complaint filed against a CYH team, investigation closed through amicable resolution between parties with no further action required.
- One (1) match penalty situation, CYH Player accepted the offer of compromise from Mid Am Hockey.
- Two (2) Safesport Complaints, one (1) resolved with letter of admonishment, one (1) dismissed for lack of prosecution.
- We lodged one (1) complaint against the parent of another organization for inappropriate parents/child interactions following a game.

GOALIE PIPELINE

2022-2023 Season Highlights included onboarding of two (2) goalie coaches (Chuck Fry and Braden Phelps) to replace the void left by the relocation of CYH's last partnered goalie coach. We implemented dedicated, goalie specific training utilizing both small ice and regular practice ice touches.

CYH additionally partnered with the Bloomington Blades organization to provide additional ice time opportunities for our 14U goalies due to Bloomington's inability to roster a 14U goalie. Feedback from both organizations was positive and the experiment reinforced a different lens through which to view developmental opportunities.

Overall Commentary

- Received well and great participation by many goalies!
- Good examples of "Shut-Out" games across the teams
- Coach Phelps (1st season coach) commented loved this involvement and "wants more"

CYH Goalie Focus (Squirts, Peewee, Bantam)

- Approx. 7-10 goalies in any one week
- Large ice practices (Fry & Phelps supporting Team Practices)
- Emphasis on warm-ups, monitor/critique goalies during full team practices and scrimmages
- Carry observations from practice and game input to small ice sessions.
- Small ice focus practices (Fry & Phelps, support by Iceman goalie (Blanz))
- Returning Goalies focus 2x per month in Nov-Feb
- Target recommendation move to 4x per month for 2023-2024 season.

New Goalies Focus (1st yr. Squirt, 8U Mites, Girls, House)

- Approx. 14-15 goalies throughout season (including 2 girls)
- Small ice sessions weekly rotating groups every other week.
- One (1) House goalie moved into Squirts mid-season!

Clinics

• Coaches to work out 2-3 weekend clinics in summer/pre-season.

ALUMNI INITIATIVES

During 2022, CYH resumed its Annual Icemen Alumni Game, typically held the last weekend of each December. The event was very well attended for our Young Guns, graduates from 2010-2022. The Legends showed up in smaller numbers, because many are on crutches or in wheelchairs, but for graduates from 1974-2009, the old timers battled to a well-deserved 6-6 tie game. Odd-numbered Young Guns cleaned house, 13-5. The Alumni Committee has recreated all rosters (exc. four) from 1975-present for its record keeping purposes. We continue to evaluate the best path forward for Alumni-based initiatives.

DIVERSITY INITIATIVE

CYH formed a new Diversity Committee, the goal of which is to increase CYH membership in non-traditional groups underrepresented in the sport of ice hockey.

The Committee has been tasked with two (2) main areas of focus;

- Talent attraction and acquisition diversity growth in players and coaching staff (minorities and females)
- 2) Disciplinary and Corrective Actions Education of the CYH membership, how best to protect our CYH Members from stereotypes and inappropriate behaviors

CYH continues to be a leader of Indiana Hockey Organizations on matters that are being considered by our National Governing Body, USA Hockey/Mid-Am Hockey and taking steps to provide the Membership with first in class awareness and support.

Our Diversity Committee completed translations of marketing materials directed to our Hispanic population to activate greater involvement. CYH engaged two local minority hockey players to attend a Try Hockey for Free event and spread the good word of ice hockey and encourage a broader participation within our diverse community. Much work remains to be done and dedicated volunteers are always welcome to assist.

CHRIS HAHN MEMORIAL AWARD

Chris spent his formative years on the ice at Lincoln Center where he helped create many of the traditions which are on-going today. At an early age, Chris chose hockey as his sport and worked hard to capitalize on his abilities and maximize his skill level. Chris lived each moment to its fullest and took great pride in everything he did.

He loved people and the things he did whether he was on the ice, at home, at school, or among friends. Additionally, he listened and applied what he heard, not only to his game, but to his other life activities as well.

The initial Columbus record books were written by Chris and his brother Eric. One of the major highlights of his high school hockey years was the Icemen's second place win in the 1977 Indiana State High School Hockey Championships. Chris completed his hockey career as a four-year letterman for the Icemen graduating in 1978. While returning to Michigan State during his freshman year of college he was killed in an automobile accident.

Chris will always be remembered with a smile on his face, a warm spot in his heart and an ear to the world. The Chris Hahn Memorial Award is given annually to a Columbus Youth Hockey Team or Individual Player in his memory.

JIM HENDERSON AWARD

Jim Henderson was involved in Columbus Youth Hockey for many years, dating to the early 70's when his three sons Jim, John, and Jeff played in the CYH program. During Jim's tenure with CYH, he was President of the CYH Board and coached several teams. Under his leadership CYH grew substantially. Jim was instrumental in the original campaign in 1976 to enclose the rink, allowing for year-round programming. Jim also co-chaired the facility restoration project in 2014.

The Jim Henderson Award honors a CYH volunteer, who over the years, displays continuous long-term support of and commitment to CYH. In addition to, and even more important than tenure, the honoree must also embody Jim's passion for continued growth of the CYH program and development of its players through innovative thinking, strong leadership, hard work and respect.
