## Wildcats Storylines ...

**THE RIVALRY:** This will be the 61st meeting between Saint Ignatius and St. Edward on the gridiron. The Wildcats own a 32-27-1 record over the Eagles; however, St. Edward has won the previous three meetings dating back to the Regional Quarterfinal in 2018, where St. Edward won 21-19. Coach Kyle has a 26-15-1 record when facing the Eagles and will seek to break the losing streak against St. Edward on the road at First Federal Lakewood Stadium.

**TOUCHDOWN STREAK:** Marty Lenehan has extended his streak in scoring a touchdown to six straight weeks. The senior running back caught his first touchdown pass on a wheel route of 36-yards in the third quarter vs. River Rouge. Lenehan also found the endzone via the ground game late in the fourth quarter. Lenehan now leads the Wildcats in scoring with 11 touchdowns this season, ten on the ground and one through the air.

**STARTING SPENCER:** The junior signal-caller Pierce Spencer will receive the nod for his second varsity start on Saturday vs. St. Edward. On the game's first possession last week, Joey Pfaff was injured as backup quarterback Spencer took over. Spencer made adjustments in the second half as he would throw 8-of-20 for 118 yards and collect his first varsity touchdown with a 36-yard connection to Lenehan. Spencer appears to have found a rhythm with the offense and they will need to be firing on all cylinders taking on the undefeated Eagles.

**FEROCIOUS FRONT:** The defensive line for the Cats continues to impress in 2021. Despite being down their senior captain in Peter Chalhoub against River Rouge, the line found ways to be disruptive in the backfield. Massive performances by Thomas Wasinski, Will Robinson, Joey Kause and Eugene Gibbons help lead the way for the Cats. Both Wasinski and Robinson came away with sacks in the winning effort.

**AERNI'S CREW:** Christopher Aerni and the linebacking crew have been masterful and prevent the run game and will need to continue that effort vs. St. Edward. The play of Aerni, Gavin Berger and Max Palinski will play a vital role in slowing a high octane offense of the Eagles down. Blase Mastrianni will be sidelined this week due to an injury sustained last Saturday; Braeden Lair will be called upon to be a part of the linebackers in week seven.

**SOPHOMORE DOMINANCE:** AJ Spellacy was brought onto the varsity as a sophomore and played a rotational role as a safety in the first couple weeks of the season. Spellacy has earned playing time and has been a significant help in the Wildcat secondary. With ten minutes remaining in the fourth quarter and River Rouge driving in Saint Ignatius' RedZone, Spellacy stepped in front of a pass for his first varsity interception.

**IN ELDRIDGE WE TRUST:** As masterful as Zeb Eldridge has been in the kicking game, he has been just as good in the punting game. Eldridge's first punt of the game in week six vs. River Rouge would pin the Panthers at their two yard-line. Coach Kyle preaches the importance of special teams and Eldridge continues to produce. Eldridge also hit a 25 yarder to put the Cats on the board in the first half and was 3-3 on his PATs in the 24-12 win last Saturday.

**OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN:** The captains for the 2021 season are #22 Marty Lenehan, #34 Christopher Aerni, #95 Peter Chalhoub and #99 Thomas Wasinski.

## Learning about the Eagles ...

**RAMOS FILE:** Starting at quarterback for the second straight season is Christian Ramos. Ramos has been brilliant through six games this season and has shown no signs of slowing down. In last season's game, the dual-threat signal-caller rushed for 93 yards and a touchdown. Ramos has thrown for over 1000 yards and is completing 64% of his passes this season. Ramos is the second leading rusher on the Eagles behind Danny Enovitch and has eight rushing touchdowns for St. Edward.

**RUSH WITH ENOVITCH:** Danny Enovitch is the running back out of the backfield for the Eagles. In last season's game at FirstEnergy Stadium, Enovitch rushed the ball 17 times for 47 yards. The senior back is having a tremendous season and coming off a massive performance against Massillon Washington on September 17. Enovitch led the way for the Eagles' 35-18 win over the Tigers, rushing for 146 yards and three touchdowns. Enovitch scored two touchdowns in the 58-0 victory over Beacon Hill (VA). Enovitch has a total of nine touchdowns this season. Enovitch is a scoring machine along with teammate Ramos.

**CASTLEBERRY TRADITION:** The Castleberry family is well known in the St. Edward community. Jordan Castleberry was an impact player for the Eagles a few seasons ago. Jaylen Castleberry graduated after last season and was a starting defensive back. Senior Joel Castleberry currently locks down the secondary for the Eagles in 2021. Joel played a vital role in the victory vs. Massillon with an interception against the Tigers. Joel is also a dangerous punt and kick returner.

**SACK ATTACK:** Michael Kilbane leads the way for the Eagles defensive front seven. Kilbane is a defensive end that can give any offensive line fits on the edge, as this season, he leads the Eagles with five sacks. Zyion Freer-Brown leads St. Edward's defense in tackles as the senior linebacker finds ways to make plays in the backfield. Matt Oudeman and C.J. Harvey are monsters on the defensive line as they both deliver pressure on a quarterback.

**KICKING GAME:** Delivering the kicking duties for the St. Edward Eagles is Dakota Jonke. Jonke is the third leading scorer on the team, behind Ramos and Enovitch. Jonke, similar to Zeb Eldridge, will see most of his kick-offs fly through the back of the endzone for a touchback, limiting an opposition's kick-return game. Jonke is a member of the St. Edward soccer program as well and when not available due to soccer, will shift kicking responsibilities to punter Ben Lavelle. The special teams game plays an essential

### WR MAX MURESAN '22



Working his way into the rotations is senior-wide out Max Muresan. Muresan has seen quite a bit of time in the last two games against Archbishop Hoban and River Rouge. Muresan is a star on Coach Kyle's track and field squad and competed at the State Championship in his first season with the track team in 2021. Muresan has the big-play ability with his lethal speed and the offense has recognized that, working the ball his way more often. The Cats face an outstanding defense that is allowing its opponents just 11 points per game. Muresan may play a massive role in waking up the Wildcats passing game in week seven.

### DL WILL ROBINSON '23



With senior captain Peter Chalhoub sidelined with an injury last week vs. River Rouge, the Wildcats defensive line required a spark. Cue in junior edge rusher Will Robinson. Robinson broke out in a big way in the 24-12 win against the Panthers as he seemed to be delivering pressure to the quarterback with each passing play. While leading 17-12 with three minutes remaining in the game, on fourth down, Robinson came away with a game-sealing sack to force a turnover on downs on the Panthers. ## FIRST FEDERAL LAKEWOOD STADIUM at St. Edward



**Bunts & Madison Ave. Lakewood, OH**

First Federal Lakewood Stadium was built in its current location during the 1930's while Franklin D. Roosevelt was in the White House. The stadium is nestled into a thriving Lakewood neighborhood, surrounded by beautiful homes and full-growth trees, at the corner of Bunts Road and Madison Avenue.

Popularly called the 'Madhouse on Madison'. Lakewood Stadium has been home to St. Edward Eagles athletics since the late 1980's, but today only the Eagles' varsity football team calls it home, as well as the Lakewood Rangers. The Wildcats played home games from 1988-2000, with the final game as the 'home' team at Lakewood Stadium in 2004.

The stadium was converted from a natural grass field to a synthetic turf surface following the fall of 1987. The Astroturf-type carpet was in place for 20 years, before the stadium received more modern field turf prior to the 2007 season. The cost of the upgrade was nearly \$700,000.

Lakewood Stadium has been the setting for many memorable Saint Ignatius football games, including the dramatic 35-34, triple-overtime victory against Saint Edward in October 1993.

In December 2012, it was announced in December 2012 that the Lakewood City Schools would receive over \$300,000 thanks to a new partnership with First Federal Lakewood. The local bank secured the naming rights to the facility for ten years.

# GAME PREVIEW

## WILDCATS SEEK TO TAKE DOWN THE UNDEFEATED EAGLES

In week six, the Wildcats faced adversity against River Rouge, losing their starting quarterback in Joey Pfaff on the game's opening possession. Pierce Spencer and the Cats made adjustments throughout the contest and came away with a 24-12 victory for their fourth consecutive win in a row.

"That is what Pierce prepares for during the week and what was needed was for him to keep composure and to read the defense," says Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69. "Pierce knows this offense and when we went to a short passing game, we were getting a better read on their defense."

Saint Ignatius, in the next three weeks, will play three of the top 10 ranked teams in the Division I AP Poll: (2) St. Edward, (9) Archbishop Moeller and (1) St. Xavier. The gauntlet is set for the Cats as they aim to be ready for the challenge ahead as they take on their rival St. Edward Eagles in a week seven contest.

### SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. ST. EDWARD DEFENSE

Starting in week seven will be Spencer after the injury to Pfaff. Spencer, a week ago, went 8-of-20 throwing the football for 118 yards. Spencer threw his first varsity touchdown on a wheel route to senior running back Marty Lenehan on a 36-yard connection. This will be Spencer's second varsity start and coach Kyle has faith in his junior signal-caller.

"What Pierce is doing this week is understanding the reads from the St. Edward secondary," explains Kyle. "We are working with Pierce to understand the concept of a window so he can read a defense and throw the ball."

The offense for the Cats thrives on the production of Lenehan and Joey Georges. Lenehan's two touchdowns last week put his total at 11 on the season. Meanwhile, Georges' 58-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter added insurance for a Wildcat victory. Both backs will play vital roles in week seven's match-up vs. the Eagles.

St. Edward's defense has been dominant this season. Through six games, the Eagles have allowed their opponents to score just 11 points per game. The Eagles are coming off of a 58-0 victory over Beacon Hill (VA) last Saturday.

"We have played great defenses all season long that has prepared us each week for the next test," says Kyle. "The caliber of athletes we are going against has helped us adapt to different schemes. It is a challenge, we have a few injuries, but we have the next-man-up mentality."

Michael Kilbane headlines a defense that is aggressive getting after the quarterback. The junior edge rusher has tallied five sacks this season and will be another challenging test for Saint Ignatius' tackles in Ashton Montgomery and Brian Keane.

Defensive back Joel Castleberry will seek to be disruptive in the Cats passing game as Spencer takes over as the starting quarterback in week seven. Castleberry has been a phenomenal athlete in the secondary for the Eagles in the 2021 campaign. If Spencer wants success through the air, he must account for Castleberry.

### SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. ST. EDWARD OFFENSE

The Wildcats defense has been terrific in stopping the run this season but will be put to the ultimate test on Saturday night when they take on St. Edward. The Eagles ground and pound is led by senior running back Danny Enovitch and senior quarterback Christian Ramos.

Enovitch, this season has been on a tear for the Eagles' offense. In week five's match-up against Massillon Washington, Enovitch rushed for 146 yards and three touchdowns in the Eagles win over the Tigers on the road. The Wildcats will also have to deal with a dual-threat quarterback in Ramos.

"Offensively, they can throw the football, the stats will show they are a great running team, but they can be dangerous through the air," explains Kyle. "We have to be balanced and read keys; we can not sell out on the run because we can get burned in the passing game."

The defensive line for the Wildcats will be a crucial piece in preventing the Eagles' rushing attack. Thomas Wasinski and Will Robinson had a terrific week six performance vs. River Rouge as they combined for three sacks in the 24-12 winning effort. Robinson needed to step up with senior captain Peter Chaloub, sidelined with an injury and he did just that, propelling the defense to hold the Panthers to 86 total yards on the ground.

Chaloub will be a game-time decision come Saturday night at First Federal Lakewood Stadium. One thing is for certain; the defensive line will need to play with even more aggression taking on an offense that averages 46 points per game.

"This is a good challenge for our defense," explains Kyle. "They have a solid offensive line and both the running back and quarterback are threats rushing the football."

Looking at the secondary for the Wildcats, they can not oversell on the rush by St. Edward. Ramos can do damage to a defense through the air. Sophomore AJ Spellacy has played a crucial role in tightening up the Saint Ignatius secondary as a safety. Spellacy intercepted his first varsity pass last week against River Rouge. The Cats will need all hands on deck to come away with a victory on the road vs. undefeated St. Edward.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

"I preach to the kids a lot and they may be tired of hearing it, but they need to win the special teams game," explains Kyle. "Controlling the field position on your opponent puts us in great shape because it is hard for any team to travel 80+ yards for a score."

Last week Zeb Eldridge showed off his talent as a punter pinning the Panthers at the two yard-line. Eldridge has been a powerful weapon in the special teams game for coach Kyle. Along with using him in the punting game, coach Kyle is not afraid to have Eldridge line up for a 40+ yard field goal. He has made one from 48 already this season and if the game comes down to a kick, the Wildcat faithful can rest knowing they have Eldridge.

Kick-off is at 7 p.m. from First Federal Lakewood Stadium for the 61st meeting between Saint Ignatius and St. Edward.

## Wildcats Win Their Fourth in a Row

PARMA - Saturday's matchup at Byers Field featured the 3-2 Saint Ignatius Wildcats vs. the 2-1 River Rouge Panthers (MI). The Panthers' previous game was forfeited by their opponent, so they went into this week having not played a game in two weeks. The contest between these two programs was not pretty and involved a lot of solid defensive play on both sides, but ultimately, the Football Cats came away with the well-earned win by defeating the Panthers by a score of 24-12.

The action got underway from Byers Field as the Panthers would kick-off to start the game. The Wildcats would then begin their first drive of the afternoon from their 22-yard line. The offensive possession started well; Marty Lenehan broke out a 22-yard run to get the Cats out toward midfield. The offense was able to gain a couple of first downs before an injury to senior quarterback Joey Pfaff caused the drive to stall out.

The Panthers' drive was fueled by several quarterback keepers up the middle by Christian Johnson. Then a substantial 45-yard completion from Johnson to Jaylen Watson propelled the River Rouge offense deep into Wildcat territory. The drive would go all the way to the Saint Ignatius 19-yard line before the Wildcat defense forced a turnover-on-downs.

After a long drive to the eight yard-line, the offense could not get into the endzone and instead brought out the field goal team. Eldridge would knock a 25-yard field goal through the uprights to give the Cats a 3-0 lead just three seconds into the second quarter.

After penalties pushed the Cats out of field goal range, the drive for River Rouge was a highlight reel for wide receiver Nick Marsh, who made two incredible catches downfield to get the Panthers on the board. They would attempt to go for two, but the Wildcats would stop the conversion.

The second half opened with more defensive solid play, as three straight punts got the third quarter underway. The Wildcats' second drive of the half started the action as Spencer threw a pass to Lenehan out on a wheel route, who ran it 36-yards down the sideline for a touchdown.

Then, the Panthers put together a drive that landed them inside the red zone after converting on a 3rd & 16.

Johnson threw a pass over the middle to Watson that he ran up the field to the Wildcat 15-yard line. The massive third-down conversion looked like a huge blow dealt for the Wildcats, but then sophomore A.J. Spellacy came up with a huge play in the endzone. Spellacy leaped into the air and intercepted a Johnson pass to give the ball back to the offense.

On Georges' first snap back in the game, he ran the ball 58 yards for a touchdown to give the Cats a 17-6 lead. It was Georges' second 35+ yard touchdown of the season.

The last play of the drive came on a 32-yard strike to Marsh, which cut the Wildcats' lead to 17-12. After the touchdown, River Rouge Head Football Coach Cory Parker kept his offense on the field to attempt a two-point conversation. The conversion attempt was thwarted by Franklin Pike.

The Panthers struggled to move the ball down the field as the Wildcat defense, led by Will Robinson and Christopher Aerni, held firm. Robinson came up with a fourth-down sack to give the offense excellent field position. The offense took advantage of the turnover-on-downs as Lenehan dashed into the endzone untouched to put the Wildcats ahead 24-12. Lenehan's second touchdown of the game put the game on ice and secured the win for the Football Cats.

The Cats got contributions from several players on both sides of the ball. Georges and Lenehan provided the sparks on offense, and Spencer got the job done at the quarterback position. On defense, SIBN Players of the Game, Robinson and Spellacy, secured huge plays that swung momentum to Saint Ignatius and proved to be huge factors. Next up for Saint Ignatius is the ever-anticipated matchup with the Saint Edward Eagles. That game will take place at First Federal Lakewood Stadium next Saturday. Kick-off is set for 7 pm.

## Turnovers Lead to Tough Loss for the Wildcats

CLEVELAND - The Saint Ignatius Wildcats and Saint Edward met at FirstEnergy Stadium. It was the 60th game in a storied rivalry. The final score was 17-0, Eagles.

After an exchange of 3 and outs, the Eagles punted. Marty Lenehan received the ball at the Wildcats' 41-yard line and ran it back to the St. Edward 12-yard line. But a second down run resulted in the first of four lost fumbles for the Wildcat offense. The first quarter ended, 0-0.

The second quarter began with French passing to Alec LaSpina for a first down. Saint Ignatius fumbled the ball and again St. Edward recovered. The Eagle offense drove down the field. Ramos threw a pass, to a wide open Watkins for an 11-yard TD. The score placed the Eagles up 7-0 with 9:40 to go in the quarter. On the ensuing drive, French found LaSpina for a 31-yard gain. Two plays later on 3rd and 2, the Wildcats again fumbled and the Eagles recovered.

After an exchange of turnovers and an Eagle punt, the Wildcats had 5 minutes left in the half. On 3rd and 3, French found LaSpina for a first down. He found Dunstan for another first down. An Eagle penalty moved the Cats to the Eagles' 6-yard line. But a rare miss by kicker Declan Mangan, caused by the more narrow pro uprights, ended the first half with a score of 7-0 Eagles.

In the third quarter, after an exchange of 3 and outs, the Eagles' Ramos fired a pass for 31 yards to Joshua Kerekes. Ramos ran the Eagles into field goal range. The kick was good for a 10-0 St. Edward lead. After a Wildcat punt, Ramos led the Eagles down the field. The third quarter ended with a score of 10-0 Eagles.

On the first play of the 4th quarter Ramos ran for a 34-yard touchdown. The Eagles now led 17-0. French began the next drive well, throwing to LaSpina for 9 yards and Lenehan for 13. French found Dunstan for an 8-yard gain. An Eagle interception ended the drive. And after a Wildcats last-ditch drive, the Eagles ran out the clock.

With the loss, the Wildcats' series advantage dropped to 32-27-1. The Eagles narrowly outgained the Wildcats on the day, 249-241. Jaxon French completed 17-of-32 passes for 196 yards, while the Wildcats were limited to 45 rushing yards. Jack Dunstan had 7 receptions for 67 yards and Alec LaSpina 5 receptions for 74 yards.
