A FLASHBACK TO 1988 By ... Eddie Dwyer - 2011

Until the fall of '88, the Saint Ignatius Wildcats had never qualified for the OHSAA football playoffs, which began in 1972.

After regional victories over Euclid and Stow, the excitement that accompanied the practices that state-semifinal week was truly something special. And one of those practices took place on Thanksgiving morning, as the Wildcats were preparing to meet the Panthers from Toledo Whitmer. Yes, time passages.

Although they were designated as the "home team," the 1988 Wildcats had to travel to the Glass Bowl in Toledo to face Whitmer. In what is now a Wildcats tradition, Coach Kyle brought some dirt from Wasmer Field and spread it around the surface of the Glass Bowl. In those days, Wasmer Field was a combination of dirt, mud and a few rocks, to say the least.

After a stirring pre-game talk by Coach Kyle's high school coach - Saint Ignatius legend, the late John J. Wirtz - the Wildcats went out and dominated Whitmer, 31-8. The following weekend, in what was one of the most intense Division I championship games ever played in Ohio, the Wildcats, behind a dramatic goal-line stand, turned away heavily favored Cincinnati Princeton, 10-7, at Ohio Stadium in Columbus and brought home the first of those record 10 state-title trophies.

All-American and All-Ohio quarterback Joe Pickens and All-Ohio tailback Peter Fitzpatrick, two of the outstanding players in Wildcats history, were junior starters in '88 and they fondly recalled that first state-semifinal encounter with the Panthers from Whitmer while attending today's Thanksgiving morning practice on the new turf surface at Wasmer Field.

What started with a small group of fans at Lakewood Stadium in 1988, the Thanksgiving practice, whenever the Cats advance that far in the playoffs, has grown into a tradition that draws former players from almost every decade of the 100 years of Saint Ignatius football.

Wildcats Storylines ...

THE MATCHUP: The Saint Ignatius Wildcats will take on the Stow-Munroe Falls Bulldogs for the second time in program history. In the first and only meeting, the Wildcats came away with a 35-8 victory in the Regional Final. The Cats would go on to win the Division I State Championship in 1988. These two programs will match up again in the playoffs in the Regional Quarterfinal. Saint Ignatius is coming off a 35-32 win over the Mentor Cardinals, while Stow defeated GlenOak 40-12. The winner on Friday night will take on the winner of Medina/Cleveland Heights in the Regional Semifinal.

MAKING HISTORY: The dynamic duo of Marty Lenehan and Joey Georges helped lead the Wildcats to an opening-round win vs. Mentor. Lenehan toted the rock 17 times for 116 yards and a touchdown, while his teammate Georges had 22 carries for 132 yards and a touchdown. For the first time in program history, Saint Ignatius had two backs that went over 100 yards rushing. Lenehan and Georges will look to have similar success against the Stow Bulldogs in the Regional Quarterfinal. Lenehan eclipsed 1,000+ rushing yards in the season early in the second half vs. Mentor.

OFFENSIVE BALANCE: Since the beginning of the 2021 season, Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69 and the offense has been looking for a balance of the run and pass to open up their offense. They got just that last Friday vs. Mentor as the rushing game opened up the pass offense for senior quarterback Joey Pfaff. Pfaff would go 8-of-15 throwing the football for 131 yards and two touchdowns. Pfaff showed great precision with his deep passes to Max Muresan, Colin Vollmer and Jonathan Merimee. Having the senior leadership of Pfaff back as the signal-caller has put the offense into a rhythm and just at the right time.

MEN UP FRONT: When your two offensive backs rush for a combined 248 yards, the offensive line is doing something right. The line was remarkable in the 35-32 win over Mentor, creating running lanes for Lenehan and Georges. The two veteran tackles of Ashton Montgomery and Brian Keane set the edge, while the interior linemen of Will Witalis, Patrick Lavelle and Dominic Ference open the holes through the A and B gap. Reliable is the best term to describe the O-line this season.

AGGRESSIVE DEFENSE: The tough regular season for the Wildcats gave the defense experience for battles they will face in the playoffs. The defense accepted the challenge and played aggressive vs. Mentor. The Cats allowed just 10 points to their opponent through three quarters and were a crucial part in the third quarter breakaway for Saint Ignatius. Mentor would go on a run in the fourth quarter, but the Wildcat defense did just enough to win the game for the Cats.

ROTATION OF TALENT: Coach Kyle has said it all season long about his defensive linemen and that is they play with so much heart. They are not the biggest to play the position, but their speed and athleticism have made them a force in 2021. Will Robinson led the way last week with ten total tackles and 1.5 of them being for a loss. Peter Chalhoub and Thomas Wasinski demonstrate their leadership on the line, while Ryan Boomer, Eugene Gibbons and Joey Kause bring the reinforcements when the starters need a breather. They have been an integral part of slowing down the Stow offense.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: The captains for the 2021 season are #22 Marty Lenehan, #34 Christopher Aerni, #95 Peter Chalhoub and #99 Thomas Wasinski.

Learning about the Bulldogs ...

SPEEDY PRESTON: Stow's feature back is Xavier Preston. Preston last week vs. GlenOak opened the game with a 72-yard touchdown run. Preston finished the game with 171 yards on 19 carries with three touchdowns. Preston is a handful at 6'1" 195 pounds and runs behind a strong Bulldogs offensive line. Leading the charge on the line is a Kent State commit, Mason Mennell. Preston is also a star on the Stow track and field team. Preston's career game came against North Royalton in week six, where he rushed for 235 yards and saw pay dirt three times. Preston has totaled 1,665 yards on the ground and has a remarkable 20 rushing touchdowns. The Wildcats will have to find a way to contain Preston.

BOOZER FILE: Nate Boozer entered the 2021 season as the back-up to Owen Bainbridge. Bainbridge is a Bowling Green State University commit. Bainbridge has dealt with some injuries, allowing Boozer to get reps this season. Boozer vs. GlenOak was the starter for the Bulldogs. Boozer went 4-of-5 through the air for 54 yards and a touchdown. Boozer this season is 10-of-22 through eight games, throwing for 173 yards and three touchdowns. Stow kept the ball on the ground last week with their talented running backs and may look to have that same success vs. Saint Ignatius.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Stow has a powerful offensive line that is led by two Division I commits. Mason Mennell is committed to playing at Kent State, while Van Shyjka will continue playing at Akron. The Bulldogs have a terrific run game that can come out of the single back formation or a jumbo package. Xavier Preston's success begins with the men upfront and the force of Mennell and Shyjka. The Wildcats will look to limit the Bulldog's run game in the Regional Quarterfinal.

FULLBACK: Stow's offense will use a heavy dose of the fullback. As a part of the jumbo package, the Bulldogs will add an extra blocker or runner in a fullback. This was evident in last week's 40-12 win vs. GlenOak as Ryan Orosz used his big frame to break through the defense for a 40-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Teddy Gregory is used as a fullback as well in the Bulldog offense.

A DEFENSIVE LOOK: Coming into the 2021 season, Head Football Coach Tom Phillips noted the strength on the defense is the defensive line. The Bulldogs run a base 3-4 defense and have massive bodies upfront. At the defensive end is Kaden Spiegel (6'1", 230 lbs) and at nose guard is Courtney Reynolds (6'2", 325 lbs). Teddy Gregory anchors the interior linebacking core. Luke Abernathy is on the outside for the linebackers, a returning starter on Phillips' defense. Vance Sheppert in the secondary was Stow's only returning starter at cornerback. The defense has been strong this season, allowing just 19 points a game to opponents. Can the Bulldogs slow down the Saint Ignatius running attack?

OL PATRICK LAVELLE '23



The Wildcat offense accounted for 259 rushing yards in the 35-32 win against the Mentor Cardinals. Joey Georges and Marty Lenehan led the way as, for the first time in program history, the Wildcats had two 100+ yard rushers. After the game was over, Georges and Lenehan praised the offensive line and credited the men up front. Patrick Lavelle is the anchor of the offensive line at the center position. Lavelle directs traffic with the offensive line and this season, the line has done a bang-up job opening holes for Georges and Lenehan. This will be key again as they head on the row to Stow. Lavelle and the rest of the offensive line will look to have similar success with their run blocking.

DL RYAN BOOMER '22



This season the defensive line has had a terrific rotation of athletes in the trenches. Ryan Boomer is one of those players that has worked well in coach Ryan Franzinger's '02 defense. Boomer this season rotates with Thomas Wasinski at the nose guard position and both have been a one-two punch that opposing offenses have had a complex time handling. This was evident in the first round of the OHSAA Playoffs as Boomer found his way in the backfield for a sack on Mentor quarterback Jacob Snow, giving the Wildcats all the momentum in the third quarter. Boomer will need to step up again in the Regional Quarterfinal against Stow as they have a high-powered offense that can strike at any time. Boomer and the defense will look to slow down the Bulldogs and advance to the Regional Semifinal.

GAME PREVIEW

THE CATS LOOK TO PLAY SPOILER ON THE ROAD

The Wildcats earned another Monday practice after surviving a late comeback from the Mentor Cardinals in the opening round of the OHSAA Playoffs. "Mentor was a better team than their record showed because of the injuries this season," says Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69. "Offensively in that game, we moved the ball efficiently on the ground; having two backs go over 100 yards in a game was truly amazing,"

Marty Lenehan and Joey Georges made program history, becoming the first pair of runners in a single game to rush over 100 yards. Lenehan toted the rock 17 times for 116 yards, while Georges had 22 carries for 132 yards. Both backs would find paydirt on the ground vs. Mentor.

Saint Ignatius survived a late comeback in the fourth quarter, which saw the Cardinals score 22 points to pull themselves within a field goal from tying the game. However, Mentor could not recover the onside kick late in the fourth and the Wildcats moved on to the Regional Quarterfinal.

"Mentor can come back on you with that offense as we saw in the fourth quarter," explains Kyle. "We did a nice job limiting them on the field in the first three quarters and dominating the time of possession."

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. STOW DEFENSE

"All season, we have run the ball very well, early part of the season through the air, we had deep opportunities that we just did not hit," says Kyle. "We are beginning to be consistent with the deep ball, which has enhanced our production."

The ground game a week ago vs. Mentor opened the passing lanes for senior quarterback Joey Pfaff. Pfaff was 8-of-15 passing for 131 yards and two touchdowns. Pfaff was slinging the ball downfield to receivers such as Max Muresan, Colin Vollmer and Jonathan Merimee, which set the offense in the Cardinal red zone multiple times.

"We are hitting the longer passes," Kyle says. "It was frustrating missing those opportunities in the first weeks of the season, but now we are hitting our stride."

For the Stow defense, they are led by middle backer Teddy Gregory. Gregory leads the Bulldogs in tackles with 133 total and has accounted for three sacks. Gregory has four interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

"This is an aggressive defense; expect a lot of blitzing," Kyle explains. "They are more than willing to go to man-to-man in the secondary and rush defenders. The blitz pick-up has to be effective to give us time."

Kaden Spiegel leads the team in sacks for the Bulldogs. The 6'1" 230 lbs defensive lineman is a force on the Stow defensive front and along with picking up blitz packages, the Wildcats offensive line must find a way to slow down Spiegel. The Wildcats will look to continue to build off last week vs. Mentor with a heavy dose of the run to open up the passing game for Pfaff. Pfaff has played well since returning from injury and will look to continue that growth heading to Stow.

SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. STOW OFFENSE

The Saint Ignatius defense through three quarters allowed just ten points to the Mentor Cardinals. The defense was a significant part in the Cats 21 point third quarter to put the game just out of reach from Mentor. In that third quarter, sacks from Ryan Boomer, Eugene Gibbons and Christopher Aerni gave the momentum the Cats needed heading into the second half. That same aggressiveness will have to be present in the Regional Quarterfinal vs. Stow.

"We are dealing with some injuries and that showed up a little bit vs. Mentor," explains Kyle. "We have a whole week to adjust and we are heading into another good challenge against Stow."

The secondary has been hit with the injury bug all season long but is missing a couple of key pieces heading into week two of the OHSAA Playoffs. The Cats will be without two seniors in Jack Mangan and Griffin Taliak. Expect sophomore Sean Martin to get his first varsity start on Friday vs. Stow. Braeden Lair will move back into the secondary after working with the linebackers the last few weeks.

"Their offense is dealing with injuries as well; they have a quarterback that got hurt which is a Division I athlete," says Kyle. "We have prepared this week for their starter and the back-up; that has been the challenge this week, but we will make the adjustments where need be on Friday."

Owen Bainbridge, a Bowling Green State University commit, has dealt with injuries this season. Junior Nate Boozer has stepped up in his place and the Bulldogs are 9-2 on the season. The catalyst on the Bulldog defense is their running back, Xavier Preston. Preston this season has put the team on his back, rushing for 1,665 yards on 214 carries. He averages 7.8 yards a carry and has found the endzone 23 times, 20 on the ground and three through the air. Preston is an explosive athlete that the Wildcats will have to find a way to contain.

"We have to execute playoff-caliber football," emphasizes Kyle. "Our kids know that and it'll be a challenge."

The Cats are prepared to adjust the defense against Stow as they are dealing with the injury bug heading into Stow week. "We have to be ready to adjust personnel," Kyle explains. "We've had some injuries; everyone does at this point of the season; we have to adjust to what we are facing, so how quickly we adapt to that will be key."

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Wildcats won the field position game last week vs. Mentor as the Cardinals in the first three quarters were put into some bad spots thanks to the Wildcats special teams unit. Zeb Eldridge punted the ball three times for an average of 35.7 yards in a windy game, pinning the Cardinals in their territory.

This will be the second time in program history that Saint Ignatius matches up with Stow. The first time was back in 1988 in the Regional Final, which saw the Wildcats come away victorious. The Cats are looking for a Regional Semifinal berth. The winner will take on either Medina or Cleveland Heights next Friday night in the Regional Semifinal round.

Wildcats Hang On Against the Cardinals

PARMA - The game opened with the Cardinals receiving the opening kick after the Wildcats won the coin toss and differed. Mentor wasted no time getting on board as they drove down the field in just over four minutes. The offense was forced to settle for a field goal attempt after the defense dug inside the red zone. The field goal try was good by Matt Moegling and Mentor took a 3-0 lead with 7:44 left in the first.

The Wildcats had a chance to answer on their next drive, going 57 yards down the field to get to the Mentor five-yard line. However, the offense stalled out and faced a fourth and goal. Coach Chuck Kyle sent out his field goal unit to try and answer Mentor's score, but Zeb Eldridge's 22-yard attempt was wide left and the score remained 3-0 in favor of the Cardinals.

On the first play of the drive for the Wildcat offense, Joey Pfaff found Colin Vollmer downfield for a gain of 25-yards into Mentor territory. Later in the drive, Lenehan caught a pass out of the backfield, dashed up the sideline, and dove for the pylon for a 16-yard touchdown. Lenehan's 17th touchdown of the season gave the Cats a 7-3 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Later in Mentor's next drive, Evan Harper made his presence felt at Byers Field as he ran for a 66-yard touchdown. Harper's first of three touchdowns in the game put the Cardinals ahead 10-7.

On the following kickoff, Charlie Dunstan nearly broke loose, returning it 35-yards to the Mentor 38-yard line. Then on the first of the drive, Lenehan got the hand-off and cut back upfield for a 38-yard touchdown. The ensuing extra point by Eldridge put the Cats ahead 14-10.

Coming out of halftime, the Wildcats were due to receive the kick as they had differed to start the game. Just a couple of plays into the Cats' drive, Lenehan officially reached the 1,000-yard milestone in rushing in a season. The Wildcats then marched down the field and set up a high-arching touchdown pass from Pfaff to Max Muresan. The score gave the Cats a 21-10 lead just minutes into the third quarter.

The primary running back in the second half was Joey Georges, who, on that drive for the Wildcats, broke out two 20+ yard runs. Georges' second of the two runs went for 22-yards and a touchdown. After the rushing score by Georges, the Wildcats jumped out to a 28-10 lead over the Cardinals.

Georges continued to fuel the offense on the next offensive drive. On a fourth & inches, Georges picked up the first down to keep the drive moving downfield. The Cats continued to move the ball and eventually found the end zone off Dunstan's one-yard jet sweep run. The junior wide receiver increased the Wildcats lead to 35-10 with 14 seconds left in the third quarter.

As the game headed into the fourth quarter, it seemed like the Wildcats were able to win handily, but the Cardinals had other plans. Mentor opened their fourth-quarter offense with a huge passing play down into the red zone from Snow to Nick Farley. Then, Harper rushed into the endzone untouched to cut the lead to 35-17 with 11:36 left in the game.

Mentor used trickery on their next possession, going with the flea-flicker back to Snow, who found a Michael Norwood downfield for a huge pickup. After the chunk play, Snow found Norwood once again, this time for an 11-yard touchdown. Mentor was on the comeback trail as they now only trailed 35-24 with 7:34 remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Cardinal offense in the fourth quarter was far better than in the earlier parts of the contest. Snow controlled the game and led his team 76-yards down the field for a touchdown. The score came off of a three-yard pitch to Harper for his third rushing touchdown of the game. Mentor attempted an onside kick after the Harper touchdown and the ball was buried beneath a large pile of bodies from both sides. After a couple of anxious moments, the signal was made that the Wildcats had the football with Damon Frabotta on the recovery. The Cats' goal was evident as the offense made its way onto the field; get a first down. The Cardinals had previously called all three of their timeouts and had no way to stop the clock. Lenehan would not be denied on the first down carry as he lowered his shoulder and powered past the sticks. The Football Cats then entered Victory Formation and took a knee to officially claim the win over Mentor by a final score of 35-32.
