## "24-hour rule" for discussions of an emotional nature with coaching staff

Your child will not suffer because you share your concerns with coaches!

These discussions are not for email, text, social media, or group chat – set up a meeting to discuss

Grievances will go through the team manager/coach then escalate to the Board of Directors by the team manager if necessary.

Auburn Ice Hawks places a high value on sportsmanship. Parents are expected to lead by example and follow the Core Values of USA Hockey. They shall teach our youth respect for themselves and others, fair play, and teamwork. Parents will agree to teach their players that fighting, swearing, or arguing with coaches, officials and other teammates is unacceptable.

Do not force your children to participate in sports but support their desires to play their chosen sports. Children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment. Make it fun. Encourage your child to play by the rules. Remember, children learn best by example, so applaud the good plays of both teams. Do not embarrass your child by yelling at players, coaches, or officials. By showing a positive attitude toward the game and all its participants, your child will benefit.

Emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit your young athlete. Know and study the rules of the game and support the officials on and off the ice. This approach will help in the development and support of the game. Any criticism of the officials only hurts the game. Applaud a good effort in both victory and defeat.

Recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport. Communicate with them and support them. If you enjoy the game, learn all you can about hockey – and volunteer.

## **Parent Disciplinary Matters**

Parents will be held to the same expectations as their skater as outlined above.

Parents participating in unwanted or unacceptable behavior will be asked to stop and may be asked to leave a hockey game or function. The coaches/team manager should bring any parent behavior issues promptly to the Disciplinary Committee before they are allowed to escalate into larger problems. Depending upon the circumstances or severity of the issue, the committee will investigate the facts and a recommendation for a remediation.

Depending upon the nature of the violation and if disputes exist, the alleged violator may be asked or can request to appear before the Committee as part of the investigation. A member's level of cooperation during an investigation may be used in the Committee's ultimate decision. If the association member fails to cooperate during the investigation process, this would be considered immediate cause to issue a penalty of the Committee's choosing. If the Committee decides that an infraction has occurred, penalties may range from written warnings to expulsion from the Association with all disciplinary decisions being final.
