### TALKING POINTS

#### **USA VS. CZECH REPUBLIC**

The U.S. National Under-17 Team faces off against the Czech Republic in its third game of the 2019 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament at noon ET on Friday in Tranås, Sweden.

The U17s hold a 1-0-1-0 record (W-OTW-L-OTL) through their first two games of the tournament, which included a 7-0 win over Finland in the opener.

Despite a goal from **Jake Sanderson** (Whitefish, Mont.) and a 22-save performance from **Drew Commesso** (Norwell, Mass.), Team USA fell to Russia by a 3-1 final in its most recent game Wednesday.

Sanderson's power-play tally late in the second period, which tied the score at 1-1, represented the U17s' lone goal of the contest.

**Dylan Peterson** (Roseville, Calif.), who collected the secondary assist on Sanderson's goal, is tied with **Ty Smilanic** (Elizabeth, Colo.) for the team-lead in points with four across the first two games of the tournament.

Smilanic added one goal and three assists in Team USA's victory over Finland on Day 1 of the tournament.

The Czech Republic's National Under-17 Team fell to Russia by a 4-1 final in its opening game of the 2019 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament and was idle Wednesday before a 6-3 loss to Finland on Thursday.

The Czechs trailed by just one goal against Finland after 40 minutes, but surrendered four goals in the final frame and dropped their second consecutive game.

Michael Rouha's two points (1-1-2) pace the Czech Republic through two games.

The Czech Republic entered the tournament after it placed seventh at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge in November.

Team USA earned a 5-1 win over the Czech Republic in the group stage at the U17 Hockey Challenge before the Czechs won the rematch 2-1 in the elimination round.

**Landon Slaggert** (South Bend, Ind.), **Hunter Strand** (Anchorage, Alaska) and **Eamon Powell** (Marcellus, N.Y.) delivered multi-point efforts for the U17s in their first encounter with the Czechs.

Michael Gut and Pavel Novak scored goals for the Czech Republic in the head-to-head matchups and are both rostered on the current version of the Czechs' National Under-17 Team.

Tomáš Chlubna, who leads the Czech Republic with 18 points and nine goals across all international competitions, is also rostered for the 2019 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament.

#### **COLLEGE COMMITMENTS**

Eighteen of the 22 full-time players on the U.S. National Under-17 Team are verbally committed to NCAA Division I college hockey programs.

Boston University, the University of Notre Dame and the University of Wisconsin all hold three commitments, while Providence College, the University of Minnesota-Duluth and the University of North Dakota hold two commitments apiece.

Boston College, Penn State University and the University of Michigan each hold one verbal commitment from the Under-17 Team. **Matthew Beniers** (Hingham, Mass.), **Thomas Bordeleau** (Houston, Texas), **Hunter McKown** (San Jose, Calif.) and **Ty Smilanic** (Elizabeth, Colo.) are uncommitted.

#### **TOURNAMENT DETAILS**

Each team will compete in four matchups at the 2019 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament. Points will be awarded for regulation wins (3), overtime wins (2) and overtime losses (1).

#### **U17 FIVE NATIONS HISTORY**

The Under-17 Four or Five Nations Tournaments are held twice per season. The NTDP's Under-17 teams placed first in at least one of the international events in each of the past two seasons.

Team USA claimed its most recent title at the Under-17 Five Nations Cup in February 2018 in Järvenpää, Finland.

In total, U.S. National Under-17 teams have won the Four or Five Nations tournaments 10 times since the start of the 2007-08 season.

The U.S. has won both of the annual tournaments twice at the U17 level (2017-18 and 2013-14).

#### LAST YEAR ...

The U.S. National Under-17 Team earned first-place finishes at both the Under-17 Five Nations Tournament, held in Järvenpää, Finland, and the Under-17 Four Nations Tournament, held in Veliky Novgorod, Russia, during the 2017-18 season.

### COACHING STAFF AT U17 FIVE NATIONS TOURNAMENT

**Seth Appert** (Cottage Grove, Minn.) will lead the U.S. National Under-17 Team at the 2019 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament. Associate coach **Nick Fohr** (Grand Forks, N.D.), intern assistant coach **Jared Nightingale** (Jackson, Mich.) and goaltending coach **Jared Waimon** (Cromwell, Conn.) join Appert behind the bench.

#### **TEAM USA CAPTAIN**

Jake Sanderson (Whitefish, Mont.) is expected to serve as the team captain for the duration of the 2019 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament. **Brock Faber** (Maple Grove, Minn.) and **Luke Tuch** (Baldwinsville, N.Y.) were named assistant captains prior to Team USA's first game of the tournament.

#### **ABOUT THE NTDP**

The pinnacle of amateur player development in the U.S., the NTDP scouts and selects the top 23 players in two age groups (Under-17 and Under-18) to train and develop in a highly competitive two-year program.

The teams (Under-17 and Under-18) face a rigorous domestic schedule, including competition against older, more developed players.

The U17s play a majority of a 60-game junior schedule in the USHL, while the U18s face USHL, NCAA Division I and III opponents. Both squads also compete in several international events each season.

Additionally, the players face a daily routine of off-ice development that includes strength training, crosstraining, cognitive skill testing and academics.
