

Homewood Baseball and Softball Code of Conduct for Coaches, Parents and Players

Coaches / League Representatives

- Winning is important, but not more important than teaching player sportsmanship and fundamentals. Enjoying the game and having fun are the most important goals.
- Emphasize Teamwork. Every player has a contribution to make. It is
 the coach's responsibility to form a cohesive unit that plays well
 together. If there are any personality conflicts, the coach must help
 players overcome those differences for the sake of the team.
- Impress on your players that they must abide by the rules of the game at all times. Know the rules.
- Develop your player's sense of fair play and sportsmanship.
 Encourage players to applaud good plays by members of the opposing team by doing so yourself.
- Cheer for your team, not against the other team.
- Refrain from posting any negative commentary, defamatory or harassing remarks or images on any social media regarding the league, your team, your players or their families
- Coaches should refrain from profane language or gestures when in the presence of any player.
- Coaches should refrain from smoking, drinking alcohol, using cannabis or illegal substances before and during practices and games.
- Be aware of your player's abilities. Do not place players into potentially harmful situations.
- Do not criticize the opposition's coaches or players in front of your team. If you have a problem with a player on an opposing team, address that problem with the manager not the player.
- Know the rules. If a situation arises where you wish to contest the
 umpire's decision, do so in a <u>calm and respectful manner</u> by
 requesting timeout and approaching the umpire at home plate. Umpire
 and/or commissioner decisions are final. No protests are allowed.
 Coaches should refrain from foul or abusive language towards officials.
- Coaches are prohibited from striking or using any bodily assault against officials, other coaches, players or spectators.
- Assist officials in keeping your team parents and fans under control.
 Only one member of each team should be addressing the umpire.
- Umpires, commissioners and league officials reserve the right to remove managers, coaches or spectators from the field for inappropriate actions of any kind.

Parents/Spectators

- Promote good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support to all players, coaches, and officials at every game, practice, or other youth sporting event.
- Always support coaches and officials working with your child in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience.
- Refrain from posting any negative commentary, defamatory or harassing remarks or images on any social media.
 Please remember to be respectful when posting anything on social media.
- Never interfere with the conduct of the game or practice
- Refrain from the use of alcohol, tobacco, cannabis and other illegal substances.
- Do not use foul or abusive language/gestures towards any coach, umpire, official, player, or spectator.
- Foul or abusive language/gestures or negative comments of any kind towards commissioners, league officials, coaches, umpires, officials, players or spectators will not be tolerated. Only coaches may address umpires directly.
- Remember the games are for the youth not for the adults.
- Never threaten a coach, official, player, or spectator.
- Never strike a coach, official, player, or spectator.
- Always do your best to make sure youth sports are played in a safe, healthy, and fun environment.
- Always promote that your child treat other players, coaches, fans, and officials with respect regardless of the race, sex, creed, or ability.

Players

- Abide by the rules of the game at all times.
- Treat your teammates and opponents with respect regardless of their race, sex, creed or ability.
- Respect coaches, officials, parents and spectators.
- Do not use foul or abusive language/gestures towards any player, coach, official or spectator.
- Refrain from use of alcohol, tobacco, cannabis and illegal substances.
- Always treat the facilities and equipment with respect wherever you may play.
- Cheer your teammates on and never lay blame on another teammate either publicly or in private.
- Never argue or question an official or coach.
- Never threaten a coach, official, player or spectator.
- Never strike a coach, official, player or spectator.
- Always conduct yourself in a courteous and respectful manner.
- Refrain from posting any negative commentary, defamatory or harassing remarks or images on social media. Be respectful and thoughtful when posting anything on social media.
