"Collin is a two-time selection and this really speaks to the impact he has had on our secondary. He was the quarterback of that group and did a great job of directing traffic. His leadership was outstanding at the back of our defense. Collin also had a great nose for the ball, coming up with big interceptions and touchdown saving tackles."

"It was huge to have Justin back after he was forced to sit out his junior year with an injury. Justin was a big play guy for us all over the field. He possessed unbelievable closing speed when defending the pass and had some big catches and runs on the offensive side of the ball. Just a great athlete."

"Conner was our workhorse on the ground this year and he improved each week. We felt comfortable trusting him to get the tough yards and he did so consistently. A physical runner, Conner was difficult to tackle and extended a lot of plays with his toughness. He was also a threat to catch the ball out of the backfield and did an outstanding job in pass protection."

"Drew was the leader of our defense, both in playmaking ability and in the way in which he approached the game. He was a cerebral player, but certainly wasn't afraid to hit. Drew also did a great job of running between the tackles offensively, and was a key lead blocker for Grems on a lot of his big runs. An all-around great player."

"Owen was hampered by injury late in the season, but he showed what he was able to do when healthy. He led our team in interceptions and blocked kicks, was constantly tasked with covering the opponents' best receiver, and never shied away from making the open field tackle. He was also a threat from the wide receiver position and made some big plays there as well."
