COVID-19 Guidelines


Player, Coach and Spectator Guidelines

- Players and Coaches will follow local and state guidelines for return to play/work.
- Players and Coaches are to arrive at the rink **NO EARLIER** than 30 minutes before the game and must be out of the locker rooms 15 minutes after the game has concluded.
- Parents will be allowed into the facility 15 minutes before the game and will be required to leave immediately once the game has concluded.
- Locker room use will be permitted. Social distancing in locker rooms will be expected by all users. Only Players and Coaches will be permitted in the locker rooms. In the event a player needs help tying skates or with equipment, one (1) parent or guardian will be allowed in the facility to tie skates or help with equipment issues 10 minutes prior to the start of the game.
- No showering will be permitted in the locker rooms.
- Players are encouraged to arrive at the rink with most of their equipment on to minimize time needed in locker rooms
- Spectators will be limited to players' immediate family members only. Face coverings are highly recommended by all spectators.
- Coaches are required to wear face coverings while in the facility and while on the bench during games.
- Players are required to wear face coverings while in the facility including locker rooms.
- Barriers will be in place as to create an enter and exit point into and out of the facility for players and fans, in order to minimize contact.
- Individuals should not congregate in the facility before or after games.
- Public restrooms will be open but shall not be used for locker room purposes.
- Players shall bring their own water bottle; no sharing of water bottles will be allowed.
- No handshakes or other close contact following a game by teams will be allowed. It is recommended both teams line up across from each other following a game and raise a hand or slap sticks as a gesture of good sportsmanship.

Tournament Worker Guidelines

- All workers should wear a face covering when working their Dibs shift.
- Box Workers – 3 total workers in the box per game
 - Clock/Shot Tracker, Scorebook/Announcer, Penalty/Music/Floater
- Front Table – 2 workers per shift (2 tables to be utilized to encourage social distancing)
- Concession Workers – Number of workers to be determined on an as needed basis. Sneeze guards are in place between customers and concession workers.
