 - 15-hour family maximum



PARENT CONDUCT

- Most coaches are unpaid volunteers; treat them the way you expect to be treated
- Opportunity to provide feedback during mid-and-end of season surveys
- D8 cracking down on poor sportsmanship spectators
- Parents agreed to Code of Conduct during registration
- Any parent exhibiting improper conduct at any game or practice will be asked to leave the arena and will not be allowed to attend the following game. Repeat occurrences may result in a multiple game suspension or lose the privilege of attending all future RAHA events.

PARENT CONDUCT

It is the duty of parents to exemplify the highest ideals of fair play, sportsmanship and ethical conduct:

- 1. Embrace the highest ideals of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and fair play.
- 2. Support coaches and officials working with your child in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all.
- 3. Refrain from coaching your child or other players during games and respect that all practices are ran by the coaching staff.
- 4. Be a "team fan" not a "my child fan".
- 5. Demand that your child treat other players, coaches, officials, and spectators with respect.
- 6. Do not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent (ie booing or profane language).
- 7. Be modest in victory and gracious in defeat.

RULES

- Complete list of rules can be found on our website
 - All parents should read the document to understand the rules before the season starts
 - Official document
 - Rule change summary video (from last season)
- District 8 prohibits non-rostered players to be on the ice
 - Only coaches listed on the official USA Hockey roster are allowed on ice to assist
 - Non-rostered skaters/siblings are never allowed on ice
 - More detailed information to come from D8

- PaySimple returns as our platform to make and track monthly ice bills
 - Payment link will be on your team page to make access easy
 - Managers will send email to the team when ice bills are determined

ICE BILLS

How are amounts determined?

- 1. The actual ice sessions used/assigned, plus any fundraising credits are submitted to RAHA accountant
- 2. RAHA accountant determines the amount due for each family and sends information to team manager
- 3. Team manager compiles information and emails information to team
- 4. Payments are due on the 15th of each month
 - Families who have not made payment by the 15th of the next month are announced in the board minutes and their player cannot take the ice again until the family is paid in full

TRYOUTS - DETAILS



GENERAL

- Tryouts are closed to everyone except DIBs volunteers, evaluators and tryout facilitator(s)
 - Volunteers are not allowed to volunteer for the same level as their own player
- No evaluator scores or comments will be given to parents after the tryout process is complete
- Parents are responsible to monitor the RAHA website and understand which pool session(s) your player must attend
- Any session missed will result in player receiving lowest score possible for that session

GENERAL

- Players must check-in 20 minutes before every session
 - Check-in is located inside the main RCC doors
- Tryout jerseys must be turned in after the last session
 - If your jersey is not returned, you will be billed for the cost of replacement
- Any questions or concerns should be directed to a member of the Tryout Committee
- Players who exhibit intentional malice towards other players will be pulled off the ice and receive the lowest score possible for that session

EQUIPMENT

- Players must wear all proper protective equipment, including mouth guards
- Players must wear the socks given at tryout jersey pick up event to all tryout sessions
- Players cannot wear anything with identifying team markings or stickers (AAA, tier one, HP, team names, numbers, etc.)
 - General RAHA stickers are permitted
- Tryout jersey will be worn at all sessions, the color of the jersey will be included in the tryout pools posted to the website and confirmed at check-in

POOLS

- Goalies attend one separate goaltender's skill session before the rest of the tryout sessions – will be evaluated
- Pool assignments are posted to the RAHA website 1-2 days before the first session
- All skaters are placed in random pools for DAY 1
- Scores from Session 1 are used to create Session 2 pool assignments, etc.
- Updated pools will be posted to the website as soon as they become available

EVALUATION & SCORING

- Evaluators <u>sit alone</u> and are not permitted to talk to other evaluators about players and scoring
- Four outside evaluators (3 skater, 1 goalie)
- Five RAHA coach evaluators
 - Lowest score will be dropped
- Score breakdown
 - 60% outside evaluators
 - 40% RAHA coach evaluators
- Day 1 Skills
 - Only outside evaluators will score and attend

Coach evaluators are prohibited from scoring his/her own player

EVALUATION & SCORING

- Looking for skaters with <u>balanced</u> strengths:
 - Skills
 - Hockey sense
 - Positive contribution to team play
- Negative contributions and conduct result in decrease:
 - Penalty situations
 - Foul language on or off the ice
 - Play intended to injure or illegal checks
- Any session missed results in lowest score possible for that session – all sessions count!!

EVALUATION & SCORING

- Looking for goalies with strengths:
 - Technical balance, mobility, quickness, skating, compete level
 - Saves low shots, high shots, use of stick, positioning and angles
 - Focus concentration, anticipation, consistency & desire, puck tracking
- Negative contributions and conduct result in decrease:
 - Penalty situations
 - Foul language on or off the ice
 - Play intended to injure or illegal checks

TEAM FORMATION

- Closed board meeting after the last evaluated session
 - Board members never see player names or jersey numbers attached to scores
 - Determine pool sizes for final day
 - All potential head coaches for the teams within the pick pools attend the last session and are given the list of tryout jersey numbers within their pick pool at the start of the session to assist in their team selection process

TEAM FORMATION (cont'd)

- Determine team pick pool sizes
 - A natural break in scores identifies and helps to define a fair pick pool
 - Player score must fall in the pick pool to be placed on that team

EXAMPLE

- Scope of team = 14 skaters
- First natural break after the scope of the team is 18
- Pick pool is 17 (coach can only pick players between 1 – 17)

TEAM FORMATION (cont'd)

- Identify head coach based on pick pool
 - Coach rankings were approved by board at September board meeting
 - The highest ranked coach whose skater falls within the pick pool is selected as head coach
 - This continues until all teams are chosen
 - When there are 2 even teams at a level, both coaches players need to fall within the pick pool

TEAM FORMATION (cont'd)

- Head coach will attend team selection, along with tryout facilitator, registrar, and at least 2 board members from the tryout committee
 - Head coach will identify players by tryout number only
 - Tryout committee and facilitator will determine if players identified fall within the pick pool

TEAM FORMATION (cont'd)

- When 2 even teams are made, both head coaches attend team selection, along with tryout facilitator, registrar, and at least 2 board members from the tryout committee
 - Head coaches will alternate identifying players by tryout number
 - Tryout committee and facilitator will determine if players identified fall within the pick pool and ensure the sum of all player scores on each team are equal
