




Expectations for 2022

ONTARIO SOCCER

- The majority of games will be covered by 1 or 2 match officials
 - Our goal is to reduce the number of games that would be cancelled due to not enough officials available to form a full crew of 3 officials (where typically required)
- Ontario Soccer will promote a Zero
 Tolerance policy in relation to Match Official Abuse
 - If officials are abused, not only can they abandon the game, they may not return and the next game may not have an official
- Ontario Soccer will continue to work closely with Clubs, Leagues and Districts throughout the 2022 season



Expectations for 2022

ONTARIO SOCCER

- Match Officials also have other commitments
 - 91% are also players
 - School, work, family, other life commitments
 - Injuries and burnout
 - Vacation
- More games equals more physical and mental requirements
 - Your official could be on their 4th, 5th or 6th game of the week ensuring your team/child gets to play. Please understand that they may be tired.
- If a Match Official is late to kick-off, they may be rushing from another game – to ensure your game gets played
- If you notice others not respecting the official, step-in to address the behaviour. If it excessive, you can report that individual to your Club or District

Decisions on the Field of Play



Games that have only one official assigned or a Referee and a 4th Official (with no Assistant Referee to support), could result in:

- Offside calls being called by the Referee, due to no Assistant Referees
- Balls in and out of play being called from distance
- Certain angles not being the optimum viewing angle for calls

The official you see may differ in experience and development from one game to the next.
