# ABOUT NEW ENGLAND PREP SCHOOL HOCKEY

New England Prep School Hockey is the best school sponsored hockey league in North America. It has a long and rich history of producing student athletes who have gone on to play at the NCAA and NHL levels.

Some of the retired NHLers include Tony Amonte (Thayer), Brian Leetch (Avon), Tom Poti (Cushing), Mike Grier (St. Sebastian’s), Jay Pandolfo (St. Sebastian’s), Scott Young (St. Mark’s) and Jeremy Roenick (Thayer) to name a few. Among current NHLers who played NEPSHIA include Colin White (Nobles & Greenough), Noah Hanafin (St. Sebastian’s), Brad Malone (Cushing), Jimmy Vesey (Belmont Hill), Keith Yandle (Cushing), Jonathan Quick (Avon Old Farms), Nick Bonino (Avon Old Farms), Connor Sheary (Cushing), Cam Atkinson (Avon Old Farms), Chris Kreider (Andover), Brian Boyle (St. Sebastian’s), Luke Glendening (Hotchkiss) and Max Pacioretty (Taft) to name a few.

The league leverages top quality academics with one of the most competitive hockey environments in the US/CAN. Teams play between 25-30 games per season and benefit by a 2:1 practice to game ratio. Most teams practice Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday with games on Wednesday and Saturday.

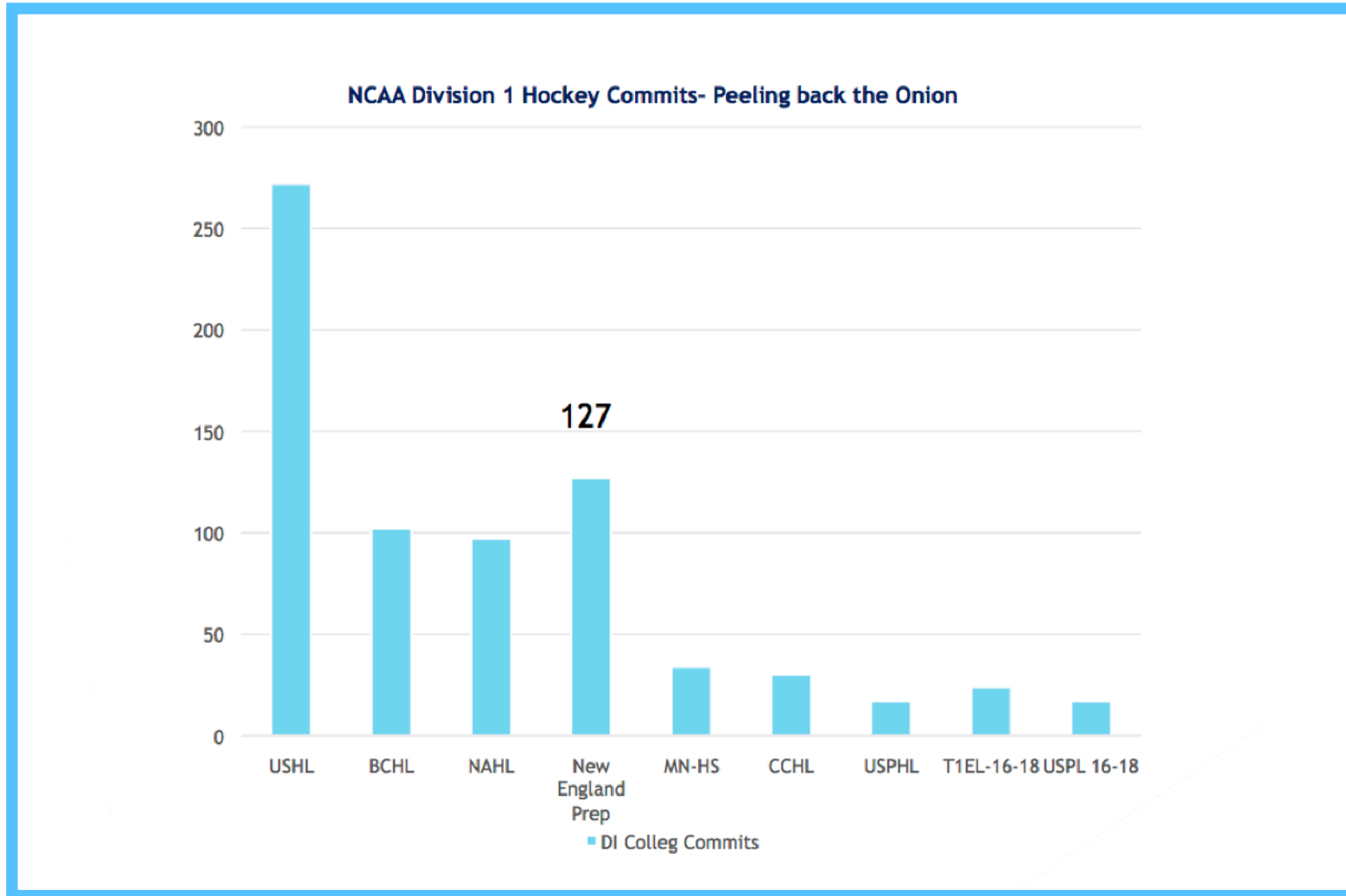
The 2016-2017 season had 2 NHL Draft Picks right out of prep school hockey in Jack Rathbone and Reilly Walsh; as well as Phil Kemp (Brunswick) and Jack Dugan (Northwood) who are prep school alumni. In that same year the US National Development Program selected 8 players for their U17 team from NEPSHIA which was the largest concentration of players from any league. Last year alone over 100 players moved on from prep school hockey to NCAA Division 1, NCAA Division 3 and Junior hockey in US/CAN.

Some Prep teams are Independent, others play in leagues; such as the Lakes Region, Founders and ISL. All teams, however, play under the umbrella of The New England Prep School Athletic Council or NEPSAC. There are tournaments during the year which determine NEPSAC rankings and the top teams are then split into three tiers for the post season championship tournaments. From year to year teams may play at different levels depending on their rankings that given season.

- Top Tournament: THE ELITE EIGHT**
- Second Tournament: THE LARGE SCHOOL**
- Third Tournament: THE SMALL SCHOOL**

**Outstanding teams and programs play at all three tournaments throughout the years.**

**Many NE Prep players go on to Juniors for a year or two before committing to Division 1 teams. These Junior teams get credit for placing kids, even though the college recruitment began at the prep level. The following graph shows the number of kids who committed to D-1 in 2016 who played NE Prep.**

## **GETTING INTO PREP SCHOOL**

**Many parents assume that getting into prep school is all about the hockey. It's far more. Most of the schools outlined in the following pages have between 300-400 students total. They can hardly wait until the first day of classes and then announce, "Okay, we need a hockey team, who skates?"**

**So yes, they have to recruit hockey players, and they are looking for high level players, but they are also looking for kids who are the right fit for the school — players who can be successful in the classroom and possess the right character. When prep school coaches talk to us about one of our players, invariably the first questions asked are, "Is he/she a good kid?" or "What are his parents like?" or "How does he do in school?" A coach once commented to us that he is under no pressure from the administration to win games, but if he goes out of his way to get a hockey player admitted and the kid turns out to be a trouble maker, that can put him in serious hot water.**

**Finding a school that is the right fit for a player is beneficial to both school AND student. Don't be too impressed with a prestigious name. All of these schools are excellent and matriculate their students to good colleges. As Malcolm Gladwell has pointed out, the happiness and confidence derived by being at the top of one school far outweighs the value of being at the bottom rung of Harvard, despite the disparity in name recognition. Take the time to find a school where it's not only the right hockey environment, but a place that is the right match for the player's personality, interests and learning style.**

**Schools are very aware of ranking and reputation. When they enroll a student they are trying to maximize their return and get the most out of him or her. A well rounded student provides more opportunities for success than a one-dimensional student. So a two sport athlete or a student who excels at hockey AND academics or the arts may have an edge.**

**Also, schools are looking for a diverse student body. Diversity takes many forms — ethnic, geographic, socio-economic, etc.**

## **Standard Admission Cycle** (this may obviously differ for hockey players)

### **July - August**

- Familiarize yourself with various prep schools, explore websites, request information and discuss your list with Bears staff. Coaches will be contacted prior to October showcase.

### **September - October**

- Check with schools to see what standardized testing is required
- Register for SSAT, ISEE, or other necessary testing
- Arrange for test preparation (e.g., test prep courses and books) as necessary
- Begin gathering teacher references

### **November**

- Take standardized tests
- Wrap-up school visits and interviews
- Begin drafting essays and application

### **December**

- Complete essays and applications
- Begin filling-out financial aid forms

### **January - February**

- Complete financial aid forms
- Submit school applications and financial aid forms
  - Depending on the school, deadlines typically range from mid-January to early February

### **March**

- Early March - wait for school decision letters

**Admission into private school is more than an application, it is a three or four month process.**

### **Things to consider:**

- **Preparation course or tutoring for SSAT.**
- **Practice interview sessions.**
- **Research sample application essays to see what is expected.**
- **Work closely with Bears to find right hockey fit.**

Mike was also the team captain his Senior year, leading the Bears to an Ivy League title, and a top 10 national ranking during the season. In 2011, Mike was inducted into the Brown University Athletic Hall of Fame, recognizing his outstanding career at Brown. <p>COACH BIO</p>	<p>Robert Ferraris is excited to return to his alma mater and take over the helm of Pride Hockey. Coach Ferraris comes to Trinity-Pawling after twelve years in NCAA DI Men’s Hockey, coaching the last ten years at Mercyhurst and the two previous seasons at American International College. While at AIC, Ferraris earned a master’s degree in educational psychology.</p> <p>As associate head coach at Mercyhurst, Ferraris worked both as coach and recruiting coordinator for the Lakers. As one of Atlantic Hockey’s longest serving coaches, Ferraris assisted the development of three free agents to National Hockey League (NHL) contracts. In 2014, his support produced the program’s first ever Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA) regular season title, as well as the league’s Student-Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Goaltender of the Year, Best Defenseman, Sportsman of the Year, and Top Defensive Forward. In 2015, and for the fourth consecutive season, Mercyhurst earned a spot in the league tournament in Rochester, bolstered by four players who reached the 100-career-point plateau, an Atlantic Hockey record.</p> <p>Prior to coaching college hockey, Ferraris served one season as head coach of the Connecticut Wolves (U16 AAA) and spent six years playing and coaching more than 360 games in professional hockey.</p> <p>A 1997 graduate of Saint Anselm College, Ferraris earned a bachelor’s degree in sociology and was a four-year ice hockey and golf letter winner for the Hawks, serving both as team captain in 1996-97. After graduating from Falmouth (MA) High School, he attended Trinity-Pawling for a post-graduate year.</p> <p>Bob and his wife Sara reside in Starr with their two children, daughter Callia, and son Avery.</p>

COACH BIO	<p>Dennehy played prep hockey at Exeter and college hockey at St. Lawrence. As Head Coach of Holderness he guided the Plymouth, NH boarding school to its best record (17-11) since moving up to Div. I five years ago.</p> <p>Dennehy, who spent one year as an assistant at Holderness in '97-98, took over as head coach in the fall of '98, the school's last season in Div. II. Dennehy was also the associate director of admissions at the school.</p> <p>Citing Choate's rich hockey history, Dennehy said his goal for the program was to get Choate back into the upper echelon of prep hockey. "I want to win," he said, "but I want to do it with the right kids – classy kids who will represent the school well."</p> <p>Dennehy, 30, has coaching in his blood – his father is <b>Bill Dennehy</b>, who has been at Exeter for 33 years, and is the school's head soccer coach, assistant hockey coach, and head baseball coach.</p>

<p><b>COACH BIO</b></p> <p>J.R. Zavisza joined the Loomis Chaffee community as U.S. history and global human rights teacher and head coach of the Loomis Chaffee Boys' hockey team in 2010. In his time at the helm, Loomis has emerged as a major contender on the prep circuit, making the prep playoffs for three consecutive seasons and winning the Founders League title in 2015 and the Large School New England Championship in 2014.</p> <p>Before arriving at Loomis, J.R. amassed 10 years of high school coaching experience in addition to an extensive playing background. In high school, he played hockey and lacrosse at Avon Old Farms before heading west for his senior year to become a part of the U.S. Under-18 Hockey Team in Ann Arbor, Mich.. From Ann Arbor, J.R. headed back East to the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. At UMass, he majored in history and was twice named to the Hockey East All-Academic Team. During his junior year at UMass, he began his coaching career as an assistant coach for Belchertown High School, in Belchertown, Mass., where he would spend five seasons, the final two as head coach. In his first season with Belchertown, the team earned the Fay-Wright Division title. <p>The U16/Prep team is comprised of student athletes born in 2000 and younger. Whereas the Varsity program has as its focus the end result, the Prep platform emphasizes development. Special attention is placed on progression, and honing individualized skills such as power-skating, stick-handling, shooting, and passing. Off the ice, the value and discipline of time management and life balance are taught. These athletes develop tools to manage expectations and stress – both in daily life and in a high performance sport environment. The end goal is a well-rounded student athlete; self-sufficient and equipped with the mental and physical tools to succeed at the next level.</p> <p>The team competes in the Prep School Hockey Federation (PSHF) and are the 2015-16 Playoff Champions. The 2016-17 season will see them embark on a 40+ game schedule across North America, including PSHF showcases and tournaments, as well as exhibition games against top prep and junior boarding schools from New England and Ontario.</p> <p>Those student athletes involved in the Elite Hockey program are only required to play two creases at BCS, as elite hockey is a two-term sport that encompasses both fall and winter crease. Players participate in mandatory fitness testing three times a year (September, December, and April/May). The team practices on ice daily and players can also take full advantage of Memorial Arena in the morning for individual skill work or to work on certain aspects of their game. Off-ice, roster members participate in two supervised weight room sessions per week and are required to complete a third workout on their own. Examples of off-ice workouts include: weight room; swimming and pool work; field work with sprints, foot speed drills, and conditioning; as well as playing other sports to complete the well rounded athlete. Players are also expected to attend group video sessions and watch individual clips sent via email either while on the road or on campus.</p> <p>When traveling for games and tournaments, the team travels on a coach bus equipped with Wi-Fi in order for the players to complete daily homework assignments and study requirements. A tutor travels with the team on any overnight trips, and two to four mandatory study sessions are worked into every such trip.</p> <p>In addition to three full-time hockey coaches, the program employs a goalie coach, a part-time strength and conditioning coach, and a full-time physiotherapist who also travels with the team.</p> <p>All members of the hockey program are expected to maintain satisfactory academic standing and act as ambassadors of the school. The coaching staff works closely with the Director of Student Life, Director of Academics, and all teachers to ensure the success of these student athletes.</p>
