OFF-SEASON TRAINING

Our teams will train indoors twice a week beginning in January. The 14 and under age groups will go through the 1st week of April. The high school age groups will go until high school tryouts begin. Training covers all aspects of the game & has included weekly guest speakers to talk about various topics. Locations may include Kent State, Massillon Washington HS, University School & various D-Bat locations.

COLLEGE COMMITTMENTS

Over 545 players have gone onto play college baseball, across all levels (JUCO, NAIA, D1,2,3), earning millions of dollars in scholarship money since 2008. Our coaches all work extremely hard to establish and maintain relationships with college coaches.

ARM CARE PROGRAM

We offer an arm care program for all players, free of charge, starting in August. The program is led by two Malone University coaches Josh Hurford and Tyler Hays and is 6 weeks long.

PLAYER FEES

Player fees vary from team to team & are based on a variety of factors. This year the fees ranged from \$1250 to \$2250 dollars & cover training, coaching, uniforms, tournaments, insurance, website, equipment, etc.

IN-SEASON TRAINING

High school OEB teams have the opportunity to call Walsh Jesuit High School their home field for in-season training and games. Youth-aged OEB teams have used a variety of fields for their weekly work, located throughout NE Ohio. Training is extremely important – regardless of the age group.

IN-SEASON PLAY

Most OEB teams do not play in a league. Instead, they supplement tournament play with independent games. We take great pride in attending the most competitive tournaments the state of Ohio and this region have to offer. During the week we will use training sessions & independent games to prepare our players for the weekend ahead. Younger age groups can expect to play 40-60 games. Older age groups will play 35-45 games. Hotel stays will be required. Generally our teams will be out of town 3-6 times per summer. OEB is 1 of 5 founding members of the Midwest Prospect League (held at Grand Park). We are the only team in Ohio part of the Wilson Premier - Prestige Club. Our teams play in events like the Flames Tournament of Champions, the Buckeye Elite, the Music City Classic in Nashville and PG/PBR events throughout the region.
